Cargill said Boise was the only other city in the state considering the establishment of two-way radio service. He said the radio will considerably cut mileage and will eventually lower the rate of the Yellow Cab company.

The system to be installed would be similar to police radio with two types of radio, one for each cab driver, and one for each car. The radio will be installed in each cab and will be connected to a central office.

# Idahoan Raps Round-About British Deals

WASHINGTON, Feb. 28 (AP)—While Congress is being asked to approve a \$3,750,000,000 loan to Britain, Representative Dvorzhak, R., Idaho, asserted today that the national legislature is being bypassed on many other financial deals with that same nation.

Dvorzhak said about \$4,000,000,000 worth of lend-lease supplies are being turned over to Britain at approximately 10 cents on the dollar. Last Dec. 6 he introduced a resolution calling for a special committee to investigate lend-lease. That resolution, he said, a reporter has been captured up by the Democratic leadership.
