Byrnes Declares U.S. to Fight For Principles of UN Charter

NEW YORK, March 1 (AP)—The United States will fight if necessary to defend the principles of the United Nations charter, "the only road to peace," Secretary of State James F. Byrnes said last night.

Byrnes said the United States interpretation of certain of the principles which have been involved in recent international developments.

1. "We have no right to hold our

troops in the territories of other sovereign states without their approval and consent freely given."

2. "We must not unduly prolong the economic or racing competition before a reparations settlement has been agreed upon by the allies. We have not and will not use our power to decide for the world what will take from the victors."

3. "We must not conduct a war of nerves to achieve strategic ends."

Byrnes said that name of political action in connection with these principles, although they have been repeated by the Russians, the British, the French and the United States, has been criticized for

keeping their troops in other countries.

Byrnes declared what he termed "the economic war" of the status quo. The charter forbids aggression and we cannot allow aggression to be accomplished by coercion of the victors or by subterfuges such as political intrigues.

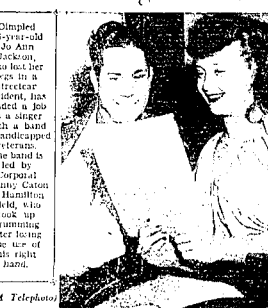
Byrnes said he would "be looking in" if the United States could not get along with the victors.

However, he said he "contend that there is no reason for war between any of the great powers. Their present poor relationships and interests are such that they will not feel free to increase in relation to the others as long as each faithfully carries out its obligations and principles of the charter."

The great powers have the strength to maintain peace," he added, "if they have the will to maintain peace."

Gooding Hospital, Pay Increases Opposed

BOISE, March 1 (AP)—A Republican-sponsored bill providing retirement benefits for 4,600 Idaho teachers moved through second reading in the house of the state legislature today at the same time a Democratic-backed measure proposing \$500,000 in teacher salary raises was withdrawn for revisions.

There was opposition developing in the Republican majority against the salary raise bill. One influential senate Republican asserted it was enough to give the teachers retirement benefits without adding salary raises. The senator, who added that his name would not be used to support the bill, the Republican-controlled senate would kill the salary proposal if it passed the house.

Dr. Wallace Bond, Twin Falls, chairman of an Idaho Medical association committee that studied the tuberculosis problem, appeared before the senate public health committee today. He urged that the legislature oppose a bill providing a \$72,000 appropriation to activate the Gooding hospital.

"Gooding is absolutely inadequate," he declared.

The senate public health committee would require an initial state appropriation of \$247,000 to come up for final consideration and vote on the measure. Quick passage was urged by leaders of both parties.

Dr. Howard H. Bond, Boise, president of the Idaho Medical Association, said the salary bill asserted there was some question whether the bill would be passed. He said it would be ready for introduction again tomorrow.

Short Session
The action on the teacher measure came in a 10-minute session of the senate public health committee for committee members only after the senate session had adjourned. The measure was scheduled for introduction tomorrow.
