Solons Favor A-Bomb Tests This Summer

WASHINGTON, March 30 (AP)—The weight of congressional opinion tipped heavily today in favor of holding the Bikini A-bomb tests this summer, although three senators protested this is a bad time for such an awesome experiment.

Several senators interested in atomic energy developments said they are fairly opposed to calling off the tests, as suggested in yesterday's senate resolution by Senator Hoffman, D. Ohio, and Lucas D. Ill. Senator O'Hanrahy, D. Wyo., backed the resolution, however.

The Bikini tests originally were scheduled to begin approximately April 15, but President Truman ordered them postponed six weeks to make possible the attendance of congressmen who would be kept away on the earlier date because of the press of jobs without pay.

The Hoffman-Lucas attack on plans to test atomic bombs on ships at the Marshall Islands has been based on their assertion that any such demonstration might be misinterpreted by other nations as evidence the United States is preparing for war.

Lucas told reporters that he wouldn't feel very good about the whole thing in this country if any other nation were preparing to test out such a bomb while under the its desire to cooperate for world peace.

But Sen. Edwin C. Johnson, D. Ohio, said he thinks the United States cannot continue to spend billions of dollars building and maintaining a navy without knowing what the atomic bomb will do to ships.

Senator Hickenlooper, R. Iowa, pointed out that scientists couldn't get to the destroyed cities of Hiroshima and Nagasaki in Japan for several weeks after the bombs fell there and as a result there is much data they expect to have after the Bikini tests.

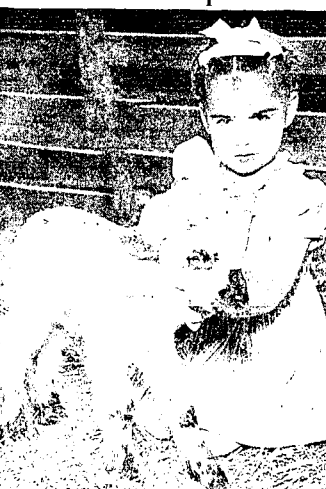

Idaho's total potato shipments this season now stand at 35,001 cars. The last comparative figures were Thursday when total shipments were 35,766 cars compared with 31,591 cars last season.

Editor, Times-News:
In view of the fact that I was responsible for several petitions being distributed in Gooding county to elect a much needed probation officer I feel I should answer the statements made by the commission and the board.

I can not help but feel that the cost of the salaries of the probation officers is a heavy burden on the county. I agree it would be a waste of the taxpayers' money for the county to buy a car. The usual procedure is to pay mileage and the officer furnish his own car, and its upkeep.

We find in Twin Falls county the probation officer receives the salary of \$2,200 a year after seven years' experience; he began at \$1,500. He furnishes his own car and is paid six cents a mile mileage, and he keeps it in repair. His office is in the county jail. He is not a salaried officer, but a volunteer.

As for county not having any one qualified for such a position I should think the citizens of Gooding county would be able to find one. Without too much effort I thought of four and undoubtedly could think of that many more. As for a war hero, I do not think that is a desirable thing to be played up to children. Why have them taught or misled with the idea of being a war hero? I've had enough war!

Yes, whoever is the probation officer should have a personality but I think his or her personality should be primarily the law. If a child is like, he knows it and will respond.

The question of delinquent parents is, of course, true. And many of these delinquent juvenile probation begin at home. But our community, our city, our nation are no stronger than the mental, spiritual and physical education we give our children. We as a county are responsible.

We can not value our youth in dollars and cents. If it cost the taxpayers \$2,000... which in compar-

ing Twin Falls county with ours, we find it wouldn't... and figure the population of our county it wouldn't be so very much in excess. And if half the juvenile cases were started on the right road it would be worth much more to the individual, the city and the county.

It was stated that this was a problem for the schools, cities and communities to take care of, and not the county. If it isn't their task, make up the county? They do every two years!

If the money was spent for swimming pool and recreation center, it would undoubtedly be built in Gooding... leaving Wendell, Idaho, and the Twin Falls community without any program for the taxpayers certainly couldn't afford it for every year.

Because many of these problems should be solved in the home, but to leave it to that outside helps to make this question "Am I my brother's keeper?"
