Prefabricated Homes Facing Tough Battle

WASHINGTON, April 3 (AP)—House expediter Wilson W. Wyatt made a two-day plea for his emergency program before the senate banking and currency committee after the house got through knocking the foundations out from under it. But how much reconstruction the senate can do is a bit uncertain. One Wyatt key points is provision for guarantees to the manufacturers of prefabricated homes. It's a new industry, lacking all sorts of outlets, and house people in Wyatt's executive end of the government feel that the builders need all the encouragement they can get.

There are now 33 manufacturers of prefabs in business, and this is their big opportunity to nurse or perish. Wyatt estimates the present capacity of the industry at 100,000 units a year, but his new program calls for 250,000 this year and 600,000 next.

The industry could easily be expanded under wartime production methods to the point where the prefabricated houses would roll off the assembly line like peanuts out of a slot machine. The catch is that nobody knows whether the public will buy them.

Too Revolutionary?

Popular taste is a fussy thing. All the logical arguments in the world can be presented on the advantages of living in a streamlined, distressing, modernized, 20th century efficiency domicile with built-in bath and kitchen disposal. But if it looks like a cooked pile of something Junior created, blindfolded, with his blocks, it just isn't the conventional white clapboard, red brick, or chicken wire and plaster California bungalow with green shutters that people are used to living in.

Round houses still don't have corners for grandpa to sit in or for standing the beam in and place for corner cupboard. And it's still impossible to buy carpets shaped like a slab of pie, or conserve pictures in hand on the loose of the outside wall. Maybe that's why they say the industry needs protection.

Can End Shortage

But, seriously, the need for all the emphasis on prefabs is that there simply aren't going to be enough standard building materials to make possible the construction of 2,000,000 conventional type houses in the next two years. That's why Wyatt is leaning on 400,000 prefabs to keep that many families in out of the red mud and out of the hair of relatives they might otherwise have to handle up with. Senate interest in Wyatt's program didn't seem to be too well. Sen. Robert Taft, 1900, said that he would support the program, but he's not so sure about the wisdom of having the government guarantee them a market. If the government does that, Capshaw said in summing up the opposition, "I'm in the wrong business."

Shortages of Labor in Area Now Forecast

Although the U. S. employment service estimates there are 6.8 applicants for every job opening, it handles in Idaho, a somewhat higher picture is being painted for Magic Valley in the next 60 days.

"USERS offices in this area predict a labor shortage within 60 days in agriculture and construction activities," according to the monthly labor market summary covering Cassia, Blaine, and Twin Falls, Idaho.

The labor demand in this region was 35.5 as of March 22, mostly in agriculture and in near Jerome, Blaine and Twin Falls, and in mining in the Idaho area. However, other industries hiring were mainly sale and retail trade, processing and government service.

The labor supply was estimated at 60.8 for the same period. Unemployment compensation claims in south central Idaho totaled 22,200 and West was 11 veterans claiming. SIA allowances totaled 330, the report showed.

Mexican Workers To Leave April 15

MEXICO CITY, April 3—The first contingent of Mexican workers, thousands under a new contract, will leave April 15 or 21 for California to pick oranges. From then on about 54,000 men in all will go to various states for agricultural work.

Marshall Edson States Salmon Voyage Success

LEWISTON, April 3 (AP)—Ending their down river run with the long day's journey known, a fleet and whittened crew tied the river barge, "City of Salmon," up at 4:30 p. m. Tuesday at the end of 16-mile journey down the "River of No Return." The seven-man expedition was made up of Idaho fish and game department officials and two boatmen from Blaine.

The 72-mile voyage by the expedition today is the longest run of a salmon river barge. Embarking at the mouth of the Salmon river, the expedition battled rough water down the Snake river and then used a 10-horsepower motor to drive the barge downriver towards Lewiston.

Paul Hooper, Los Angeles, a member of the North Geographic society and explorers club, reports he had plenty of good photography weather for the filming of a sound and color motion picture to be titled "Wilderness and Waterway," a pictorial story of the trip by barge through the Salmon river gorge.

T. B. Hudson, Boise, state game examiner, and Marshall Edson, Jerome, district conservation officer, reported the trip was successful from every point of view and had supplied needed information about range and game conditions in the most inaccessible parts of the state.
