A statewide strike of New Jersey utility workers which threatened to cut off gas service to millions of the 4,000,000 residents was averted today as state officials took over operation of nine gas works of the Public Service Electric and Gas company.

In another minor development on the labor front, one of the country's longest and most bitter postwar labor disputes was settled as AFL, Machinists union and company negotiators reached an agreement ending the five-month-old strike at the Yale and Towne Manufacturing company's lock factory in Stamford, Conn. Ratification of the settlement of the wage dispute which kept idle more than 3,000 employees was to be voted on later today.

Peace Lies in Path of God, Mormon Says

SALT LAKE CITY, April 8 (AP)—White-bearded President George Albert Smith of the Latter Day Saints church called on Mormons the world over today to keep the commandments of God "which are revealed in their scriptures and clearly and in our day."

Russian-Iranian Treaty Signed to End Dispute Troop Withdrawal Set

TEHRAN, April 8 (AP)—Russia and Iran early today signed a treaty establishing a joint Russo-Iranian oil company and providing for withdrawal of Russian troops from Iran by May 5. The signing ceremony took place 12 hours after the Iranian security council had closed its books on the Iranian complaint against the Soviet.

The treaty was announced by Premier Ahmed Qavam at a 12-hour session of the Iranian security council.

The composition of the joint Russo-Iranian oil company was not immediately announced but Russia had proposed that she hold a 51 per cent stake interest and Iran 49 per cent. The corporation would exploit the oil resources of northern Iran.

It was not immediately indicated whether the security council action on Iran had affected the course of negotiations.

Quads' Mother President to Ask Powerful Armed Force

WASHINGTON, April 8 (AP)—President Truman today drafted a firm army duty warning to his country to maintain powerful armed forces during the critical experience of war, a statement by the chief executive said at 2:25 p. m. (MST) for Chicago where, in famous Soldier field, he will deliver a 20-minute address re-emphasizing United States foreign policy and his recipe for lasting peace.

The address, following talks by Secretary of War Robert P. Patterson and Gen. Dwight D. Eisenhower, will be broadcast on radio and television at 2 p. m. (MST) tomorrow.

A large group of notables, including members of the cabinet, will accompany Mr. and Mrs. Truman and their daughter, Margaret, aboard the special Pennsylvania Railroad train.

In an unusual departure from presidential custom, Mr. Truman will hold a special news conference in Chicago's national hotel tomorrow morning for about 100 writers for high school and college papers in the Chicago area.

Mr. Truman's address, described by his aides as a major policy announcement, is expected to endorse new peace for.

Atom Ignored As Source of Heat, Power

WASHINGTON, April 5 (AP)—The beginning of the atomic age is being heralded by the fact that the world's first atomic pile, built by Enrico Fermi and his colleagues, is now producing heat and power for the first time.

USES Reports 200 Openings

Two hundred job vacancies are on file and 300 active applicants are seeking employment, the monthly report of the U. S. employment service office showed as of April 3.
