

Idahoans Win Reversal for Draft Charge

SAN FRANCISCO, April 6 (AP)—Conviction on draft act violation charges of three members of the Idahoans' Women's sect today was reversed by the ninth federal circuit court of appeals.

Two of the cases were returned to district court at Pocatello, Ida., and the other to Portland, Ore., by the circuit court which quashed supreme court decisions that barred in such cases be permitted to consider a draftee's claim for conscientious objector status.

Federal District Judge Chas. A. Clark, at Pocatello in October, 1944, had sentenced two members of the religious sect to prison terms of three years and three months each of the men, Wesley William Cox, 40, and Theodore R. Thompson, 36, and also had sentenced 2000. They had reported for duty and checked in at the Pocatello, Ida., civilian public service camp for objectors, but then had left without leave.

A two-year sentence had been given by Judge McCullough at Portland to Wilbur Reism of Vancouver, Wash., who had followed in similar manner from a camp at Lapwai, Ore.

A similar decision by the ninth circuit court obtained on 18-month sentence by the Los Angeles court of the member of the Disciples of Christ, but the court found that the defendant, belonging to a pacifist, but not a church organization, had failed to prove that his draft board had been unreasonably or capriciously classified him.

Indian Campaign Veteran, 87, Dies
