Resumption of mail service to Germany immediately was announced Monday by Postmaster M. A. Stronk. Ordinary letters weighing not in excess of one ounce and non illustrated post cards are acceptable but such communications are restricted to a personal or family character for urgent use.


Communications of a financial, commercial or business character and any enclosures of checks, drafts, securities or currency are prohibited, Strong said. He pointed out that the postal district number and the zone of occupation should be included as part of the address. If this information is furnished, the

information is known. However, mail will be accepted without this information.

Correspondence addressed "General Delivery" will not be accepted. Airmail, registration, special delivery, money order and parcel post services are not yet available. Postage rates to Germany are five cents

POLITICS AND EDUCATION

It is a truism that the business of discussing the relationship between the state university at Moscow and its southern branch at Pocatello.

That was demonstrated quite early in connection with the address which Dudley Swain, state commander of the American Legion, was to have delivered at Pocatello.

Although it developed later that some misunderstanding arose from the advance publicity for Commander Swain's speech, the first impression seemed to be that he would come out in opposition to any expansion of the University of Idaho campus.

With the explanation that Idaho cannot afford to support more than one full-fledged university.

In any event, before the misunderstanding was brought out, the Pocatello American Legion became so incensed that it cancelled his scheduled address. Not until after it was agreed that the controversial issue would not be discussed with Mr. Swain permitted to go ahead with a talk.

It is indeed unfortunate for Idaho that this old feud must go on, and it is quite possible that some political compromise will eventually result in the state being saddled with two "full-fledged" universities.

That has become apparent already. Several of our prominent political figures who are seeking election have already expressed themselves in favor of going the limit with the southern branch at Pocatello. We question whether any such pronouncements are issued in the honest belief that Idaho needs two universities. It would seem more logical to believe that some politicians fear the Pocatello opposition and favor a compromise that will work out to their benefit politically.

With all this in mind, it is not surprising that the state is now being supported by two separate universities for Idaho are absurd. States with many times the population of Idaho have only one university. And still others have only one university and one state agricultural school.

If Idaho has any hopes of establishing educational institutions with high standards, it will do well to maintain a good university. Any pretense of supporting two would only result in inferior schools of higher learning.

If there is any need for another full-fledged state school at Pocatello, it is surely not for a university. Agriculture, pharmacy, animal husbandry and the like, perhaps, but for a complete and separate university duplicating the state school at Moscow, there can be little, if any, sound argument.

STUCK EITHER WAY

The American Car and Foundry company of St. Louis found itself with a strike on its hands when an employee refused to join the Brotherhood of Railway Carmen (AFL) which represents the workers in this open shop. The company, in an effort to end the strike, asked the man to join, and fired him when he wouldn't. Then the National Labor Relations board took over.

The board ordered the company to cease encouraging its men to join the BRC or any other union. It ordered the company to reinstate this employee with full seniority and to reimburse him for any financial loss incurred.

Technically, the NLRB seems to have been right. It is probably as much a case of interference for a company to urge a man to join a union, even one not company-dominated, as it is to threaten him with dismissal unless he stays out. But what was the NLRB's motive—to protect the individual's choice of action, to protect the union from "domination," or to protect the company for strike-retelling tactics which must have been agreeable to both management and union?

Obviously the individual's right to choose wasn't the prime consideration, since that choice is denied in the NLRB action of the closed shop. And for as domination, it would rather seem to an outsider that the NLRB might itself be trying to coerce the company into interfering in labor-management relations by its action. For, if the company is to avoid similar and further penalties, the only solution is a closed shop in which the worker has no choice but to join the union.

In other words, it is left for the union to force union membership on a man under threat of company dismissal. But the company can't do the same thing. And the American Car and Foundry company is meanwhile in the unenviable position of being damned by the government if it does, and damned if it doesn't.

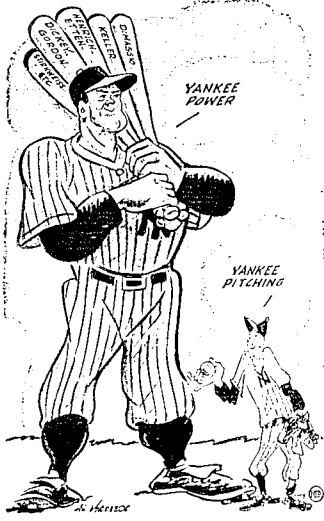

He charged that the "trappers' association" reported behind the bill is not composed of trappers but of manufacturers, fur dealers and commission houses "driving a free hand to deal with the trappers."
