

Harvester Strike Ends As Parleys In Coal Collapse

Negotiations collapsed today in the 10-day-old coal walk-out which has made 400,000 bituminous miners idle, but a settlement plan was agreed upon between the union and company officials for ending the International Harvester company strike.

United Mine Workers' Chief John L. Lewis and members of his negotiating committee stalked out of the soft coal wage conference in Washington shortly before noon with an agreement that further discussion was futile.

The miners' walkout, the result of the company's refusal to report a disagreement in the wage conference of miners and company officials, followed that of the United Mine Workers' strike in the coal fields of the western United States. The strike was reported within the next few days.

Duranty Sees No War Between United States, Soviet Russia

By HAL KNOLL.
There is no danger of war between America and Russia and the latter does not wish to convert a communist revolution here or elsewhere in the world, Walter Duranty, Pulitzer prize-winning foreign correspondent, told a Twin Falls audience last night in the high school auditorium.

As for the war possibility between the Russians and us, Duranty told a reporter afterward, "Where would they fight? What would they have to gain?"

His topic was "Russia and the World Today." Duranty, he covered that nation for the New York Times, first-hand, he spoke with an English accent.

Away From Marxism
He cited many examples to support his belief that the Soviet Union had swung far from the Marxism that its devotees tried to practice after the revolution. Because of "red" activities under Marxism, the Soviet Union has adopted a more efficient system "a sort of state capitalism."

With this change have come the abandonment of the old far-south revolution, abandonment of the communists and substitution of a nationalistic policy toward the international.

During a question period which followed the talk, a number of the audience questioned this assertion, asking:

"If Russia doesn't want world revolution, why doesn't she tell that to the American communists and their secret agents?"

Sees Road Broken
It is possible American communists are being kept "in cold storage," he replied. But he believed Russia had broken with her foreign sympathizers and wished to save face by not openly acknowledging them.

The Russians know that you can't have revolution in a country where certain conditions are not present," he said, referring to America. "Communism is no danger here. To have revolution a great mass of the population must be in very bad condition. The rulers must have lost confidence and have lost the confidence of the masses. The atom must have been defeated in foreign war."

Since he said none of these conditions exist in the United States, he added:

Couldn't Succeed
"It is utterly absurd to think a revolution could succeed here, fomented by a small band of communists."

"A great many men and women here look under their beds each night expecting to find a red boot sticking with a red beard."

He said he did not believe the "red" is turning to imperial purple. In discussing the charge of Russia's imperialism.

"If Russia were really imperialistic, why didn't she support the Chinese revolution?" he said. "Instead she aided the central government. She did not leave Iran on three because she (Russia) intended to come oriental bargaining."

That Method
He explained this method as the asking of more than what was expected and the offering of less than was requested. Eventually, the Russians come to satisfactory terms.

In reply to a question he said further that the Soviet Union is not uncompromising.

Procedure is new to them and they're sticklers for it," he said. "They stick strictly to the letter of an agreement even if they at times do not fully observe the spirit of it."

Russia has no reason to seek the ravaged, troublesome nations of Europe, he said. It has enough work to do at home, what with the devastation and the need for further exploitation of resources.

Wants to be Power
The speaker said, however, that Russia wished to assert herself as a world power. If the other large
