Delegates Pondering On Spain

NEW YORK, April 18 (AP)—The United States and Britain today failed today to find any compelling reasons in the Polish case against Spain to support a United Nations diplomatic "quarantine" of the Franco regime.

But both would like to avoid a full rejection of Polish demands for action against Spain. The British delegate Sir Alexander Cogan will start representing those opposed to action. Soviet delegate Andrei A. Gromiko probably will speak before the resolution comes and present additional charges against Spain.

Present plans are to turn back to the United Nations problem with the aim of the American delegation for a vote tonight which would then refer to a long debate on the resolution. The resolution would be referred to the committee.

The French case was referred Tuesday to a committee of experts under Secretary General Tryp. It is expected that the committee will report directly, at least in part, to the council.

Chiang Holds Political Ace In China Row

By JAMES D. WHITE
SAN FRANCISCO, April 17.—Up-
ping the long roomy door of Gen-
eralissimo Chiang Kai-shek is a
political ace which might come
handy to quiet things in Man-
churia.

This ace is the person of "young"
Marshal Chiang Hsueh-shang, former
leader of Manchuria, who has
been in "retirement" in China's
remote interior since early 1937.
The "young" marshal, 47,
and presumably still fond of golf
and poker, has a fair record of going
along with the secret police
for that business of kidnapping him
late in 1935.

Reason in Background
Yet the background to that kid-
naping suggests one of the reasons
which may enable him to reappear
on China's national stage after more
than nine years on political limbo.
Before 1937, when the Japanese
invaded Manchuria, young Chiang
had been of assistance to
Chiang Kai-shek at critical times
and had been and still is the only
one containing the Chinese com-
munist. His troops fought with
the communists and discovered that
they too wanted to fight Japan.
Chiang Kai-shek, at the time of the
discovery, flew to Shanghai to see
about it, and was kidnapped. After
12 days of argument he was released,
and a united front against Japan
resulted.

Ten Years Expanding
The young marshal was tried
and sentenced to ten years, but
later pardoned. However he went
into a "retirement" from which he
never has emerged. The ten years
will be up next winter.

Last week Chiang Kai-shek, whose
troubles with the communists are
largely the north in Manchuria,
flew south on an "inspecting tour"
where it was rumored he was to see
the young marshal.

Back in Chungking this week
Chiang and communist delegate
Chou En-lai spoke with cordial
confidence of political compromise
even as their troops started a shoot-
ing war in Manchuria. But if the
name of Chiang Hsueh-shang was
mentioned, it was not made public.

The Not Clear
What use, if any might be made
of the young marshal as presently
shown is not clear. But in similar
situation, special reasons have
been cited to deal with regional
problems.

Using the young marshal probably
would solve any of the deep fears
and antagonisms which underlie the
present Chungking-communist dis-
pute over Manchuria. But it might
as a dramatic gesture provide a
formal victory both Chiang Kai-
shek and the communists could re-
turn to the peaceful negotiation to the
accomplishment of public peace
and initial cooperation, which
is an ancient and repeated method
in China.

Burley GI Serves In Tokyo Region

TOKYO, April 18. (P. M.)—Donald
Sider, Burley, is among the men
serving with the 1st Cavalry division
in the occupation of the nippon
capital.

Overseas, nine months, Sider is
assigned to the 1st Cavalry regi-
ment, now guarding important
buildings in the Tokyo area. He
wears the Asiatic-Pacific theater
ribbon, the good conduct medal,
and the victory medal.

As a civilian, Sider attended Bur-
ley high school and worked on a
farm. He entered the army Jan. 21,
1946, and took his basic training at
Camp Roberts, Calif. After dis-
charge, he plans to return to farm-
ing.

His wife, La Vera Sider, resides in
Burley.

Newspaper by Radio Showed In Experiment

NEW YORK, April 17 (AP)—Radio
enthusiasts, Inc., a research group
engaged in an experimental project
sponsored by 20 newspapers and
stations throughout the nation, to-
day demonstrated newly-designed
facsimile broadcasting equipment
intended eventually to bring news-
paper and other printed matter into
the American home via radio.

The demonstration, during which
news, photographs, maps, charts and
cartoons were reproduced by means
of signals from an FM type of radio
broadcasting station, was held at
the company's laboratory.

Orders Placed
John V. L. Hogan, president of
the company, said that the radio
stations—most of them newspaper-
owned—which sponsored develop-
ment of the equipment had placed
orders with the General Electric
company for production of the
facsimile sending and receiving set-
tings.

The home receiver developed by
Hogan and his associates can be
used as an attachment of in com-
bination with any FM home re-
ceiver. The receiver is a little larger
than a portable typewriter.

It turns out printed matter
measuring 9 by 12 inches at the
rate of four every 15 minutes.
Copy Broadcast
Fifteen station WHAM was used
in today's demonstration. Copy at
the station, mounted on a cylind-
rical drum, was scanned by an
electric eye and broadcast.

At the receiver in the laboratory,
many city blocks away, the copy
was reproduced by passing an elec-
tric signal through chemically-
treated electro-sensitive white paper.

Hogan, a radio engineer who has
planned in facsimile research since
1924, said he believed the home re-
ceiver could be mass-produced at a
cost of no greater than that of a
portable typewriter.
