County Retail Sales Soar to 25 Million; Average Tops U. S.

NEW YORK, April 19 (Special)—Despite the paradox of a warehouse piled high with goods on the one hand and a shortage of cash, radio, washing machines and other luxury items on the other, more money was spent in Twin Falls county retail stores during 1945 than in the year before. The data, provided in "Retail" sale, covers the 40 states and is based on a report from the department of commerce.

Retail sales in Twin Falls county reached a high of \$25,400,000 in 1945. The figure was \$17,400,000 in 1944.

The county's retail spending amounted to \$775 on the average per resident, well above the national retail of \$55 per capita.

In 1945, the most recent year for which data is available, the average of retail trade, the county did \$400 per capita, an increase from \$350 in 1944. The national improvement in the same period was only 15 per cent.

The total retail business done by the nation in the past year is placed at \$24,443,000,000. The report shows a civilian population, including partially demobilized armed forces, of 131,562,200, accounting for the \$56 per capita.

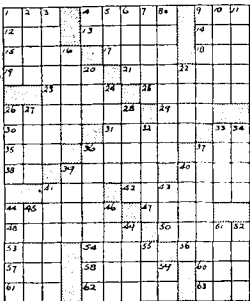

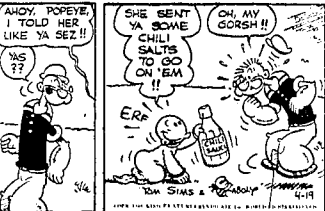

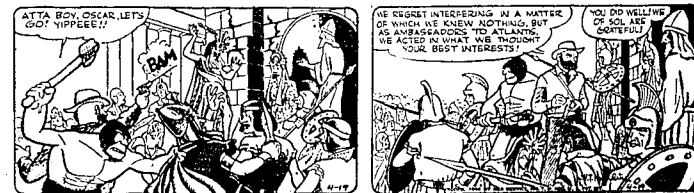

It appears that the program will be necessary during the year from July 1, 1946 to June 30, 1947, but plans for the expansion of facilities during the late summer and end of 1946, after operations are not yet perfected, he said.

He explained the board is now engaged in a project to confirm and designate new, still farm contracts among union members in each agricultural area.

The specific wage increases established in 1945 are in effect and can provide indication to the terms of those may be obtained from Herrington's board.

Noting that the previous established maximum limit does not include overtime, Herrington said, employers and employees should have been able to agree on wage rates, but that ceiling, but not at rates above the ceiling unless authorized by the board.
