Reduction Of Bread Hits U. S.

WASHINGTON, April 22 (AP)—The United States went on short bread ration today.

The move was ordered by the government as a result of a world-wide effort to beat off the worst famine in nearly 60 years. It was said to save another 25,000,000 bushels of wheat a year.

It means that during the next several days, Americans will have to eat less than 25 cents' worth of bread and other wheat products than they had during the corresponding period of last year.

Felt Immediately

The bread cut will be felt immediately around the world in a two-day basis. The reduction in such packed and stored grains as cereals and spaghetti will be felt more gradually.

As a result of the cutback, representatives of the United States government are expected to meet with OPA officials immediately to discuss price reductions for wheat and wheat products that would be needed to offset a cut in the wheat supply.

The U. S. government has been in the process of negotiating a "voluntary" wheat export agreement with the United States. This is the process whereby the government agrees to limit the amount of wheat it exports to other countries.

Bread Wasted

In a report released by President Truman, the government said that 100,000,000 bushels of wheat had been wasted in the United States in the last year. The government said that this was due to the fact that the wheat was not properly stored and that it was often lost to rats and other pests.

Byrnes Expected to Depart For Crucial Talks On European Peace

WASHINGTON, April 22 (AP)—Secretary of State Byrnes is expected to depart for Paris tomorrow and another try at world peace-making, gravely aware by his own account of the possibility of failure.

The secretary is slated to reach Paris in ample time to begin on Thursday a series of critical conferences with Foreign Ministers Molotov of Russia, Bevin of Britain and Bidault of France.

Some of Byrnes' closest associates and advisers are talking of this meeting as a possible turning point in the history of world war II.

It could mark the end of efforts by Britain, Russia and the United States to work harmoniously to set up European peace settlements and to build the United Nations into a powerful agency for maintaining the peace once it is created.

Behind this happen, and Byrnes himself is reported to have indicated the possibility of a meeting of the Big Four in relation to the peace talks. It is possible that Byrnes will go to Paris in the middle of May, and that the Big Four will meet in the middle of June.
