

Gossett Backs Weed Control Bill in Senate

WASHINGTON, April 26—A bill to better about restricted state and federal efforts to control the spread of noxious weeds on agricultural lands has been introduced by Sen. Charles C. Gossett, D. Idaho.

Senator Gossett, one of the few farmers in the senate, said the huge infestations of noxious weeds on farm lands in this country in the last few years has been a material factor in reducing food production and farm income.

He added that all efforts to fight weeds, particularly in the north and middle west, have not been a partial success because the problem has been made worse by the fact that weeds have been introduced from other countries.

The bill provides for cooperative action by the federal government and the state. The secretary of agriculture would be empowered to conduct surveys and state the fact that a noxious weed has been found. The state would then be required to take action to remove the weed. If the state fails to do so, the federal government would be authorized to take action.
