## Byrnes Urges Peace Party For Germany

PARIS, May 15 (AP)—U. S. Secretary of State Byrnes proposed to the foreign ministers council today that a peace conference be called Nov. 12 to draft a peace treaty for Germany, an American informant said.

In a session completely taken up with discussion of critical German problems, Byrnes proposed that representatives of Britain, Russia, France and the United States start meeting immediately to draw up a treaty for Germany. He said the foreign ministers could present to the peace conference, the informed said.

On Anniversary  
If the date of Nov. 12 is adopted, the peace conference would open on the 25th anniversary of the opening of the 1918 Washington disarmament conference and 23 years after a day after the 1918 armistice.

Byrnes was reported to have proposed that the foreign ministers representatives first report on the economic state of Germany to the conference.

Byrnes' three-hour meeting today began with Georges Bidault, French foreign minister, presenting France's demand for the liquidation of the Ruhr and Rheinland and for French control of the Saar.

Referring to the number of times Byrnes had been to Paris, Bidault said economic measures to control these territories were not enough there must be political separation.

## Clerk Caught In Center of Row Over Spy

WASHINGTON, May 15 (AP)—The United States has demanded that Russia drop a charge of "hoioliolism" against an American embassy clerk in Moscow and allow him to leave the country immediately. Russia has refused to do so.

## Is Demand Rejected 'New Social Theory' by Operators of Mines

WASHINGTON, May 15 (AP)—Soft coal operators today flatly rejected as a "new social theory" John L. Lewis' demand for a seven per cent payroll levy on operators in fighting a fund for mine workers.

While they did not turn down the idea of a fund, their action seemingly erased any possibility of a permanent settlement of the coal dispute by nightfall as President Truman asked.

Lewis has served notice that he will not negotiate a new contract "now or later" unless he gets the fund which he proposes to put under the exclusive control of the United Mine Workers.

As a counter-proposal to Lewis' position, the operators suggested the possibility of setting up a joint financed fund for hardship cases under the administration of an independent agency such as the Red Cross.

The contract negotiations lasted for three hours immediately after the operators presented their statement. Lewis and other UMW representatives remained behind for a short time in the UMW government conciliators. Asked for comments by the conference, Lewis replied:

"As follows: It seems that for a coal mine there is no harm in U. S. aid."

Government Representative Edward P. McCord said that he had proposed to Lewis that he "have no objection" to an independent agency for the negotiations or of Lewis' walking out of the conference.

Lewis and Charles O'Neill, official spokesman for the operators, are due to report to President Truman this afternoon.

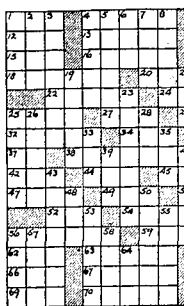

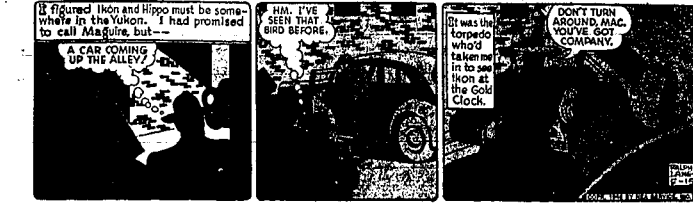
