Ye Old Sport Scribe went on a telephone visit to the office of Jack Halliwell, the Pioneer League's president and about as big a grin as you, and you, and you, would care to meet. Jack hasn't been feeling any too well during most of the season but he's kept going in fair shape, for which the boys' manager will be exceedingly grateful.

The purpose of YOGS' "visit" with the league president was to get a right from the old feed box—on the 1945 season attendance here in order to make a comparison with that of the present and Halliwell confirmed that when the attendance reached 74,438 with the crowd of 2,872 Saturday night a new record was set by the Magic Valley's entry in the Pioneer league.

Playing deep down into his records, Halliwell revealed that the Cow-boys drew 73,250 fans—that is, paid-in—1939, which was, as you may know, the league's inaugural season.

While the season's record was smashed, the Cowboys have a long way to go to crack the single game attendance mark. The 2,872 Saturday night was this year's best but that total was far under the top figure for the 1942 season.

On July 8 of that season 3,540 fans went through the turnstiles at Joyce park. But the league had to have help in the form of the "clown prince of baseball," Al Scheidt, who appeared there on that night.

Then when Jack and Cowards were fighting for the championship ship on Aug. 16 of that season the Magic Valley supported the club to the tune of 3,171 fans.

There were four other crowds better than 2,000. On the opening day a total of 2,629 fans came out. A July 9 game brought out 2,035. While there were 2,292 on Aug. 11 and 2,601 on Aug. 12.

However, the crowds were considerably better this season. The attendance in the first month of the season, although there were a number of games rained out and cold weather dampened the baseball spirit in the first month of the season, was better than in 1939.

Halliwell is exceedingly proud of the Pioneer league, which he has done so much to build up.

"You'll tell me that we have the best class C league in the country," said the veteran president. "Not only do we draw better here than we play faster here."

He said that Tony Robello, former Cowboy manager, had informed him that the Pioneer league is stronger than the class B Three-H league in which he is managing the Springfield, Ill. club for the St. Louis Browns.

Especially gratifying to Halliwell is the conduct of the manager and players in the circuit.

"We have a finer bunch of boys in the league this year than ever before," said the top president. "Not only are they fine players but they are good fellows."

"T" May Figure Prominently in Powers' Plans for Grid Season

The "T" formation may figure more prominently in Coach Hank Powers' scheme of things at Twin Falls high school this season. That is, it may be the Brain master finds a fullback with sufficient speed and power to make use of the formation practicable.

The Brain master was willing to discuss "it" at length, revealing that he and his assistant, J. S. Halliday, had attended the coaching school conducted by Frank Leahy, Notre Dame's famous mentor, at Utah State during the summer. Leahy is one of the nation's leading proponents of the formation.

Powers visited Bobby Long, the tall kid who has come up from the freshman in the key advance role. The youth, best known as a baseball pitcher, is ideally built for the ball-handling job and is an able passer.

"I would use Long only on offense," Powers admitted. The youth is somewhat fragile and thin, too, but the mentor would have had a baseball future in mind.

The "T" is nothing new to Powers. He has used it with good effect during his brilliant career, but has generally varied it with a single-wing.

"You've got to have the players to play the 'T' in the first place. If you can't find a quarterback able to handle the ball and a fullback able to take and hand off the system's quick opening plays you're better off to leave it alone."

King Block, who has taken on considerable weight during the off-season, is the fullback. Powers is making the "T" work, but time will be necessary for Powers to pass judgment on it.

Block was one of the top regular backs of 1946 who showed up for initial practice on the morning of the season yesterday afternoon. "The boys are better," said Powers, "than back who showed well in the early 1945 games but faded somewhat near the close."

Forty-four players, all that he had paraphrased for, showed up for the first session. Included were three regular linemen of last season—Boyd, center, and Qualls and Mason, guards.

A like number of candidates showed up for the Cub squad, coached by Kermit Perrier.

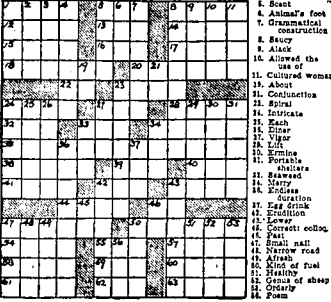
