## Former GI's Seek Copies Of Discharge

Former GI's eager to draw their home-waited through pay, have been turning the office of the Twin Falls county recorder, Charles Bullock, for copies of their discharge papers. "We made 75 certified copies of discharges Thursday, which is just one below the record set Aug. 23 when the veterans started to come in on this new rush," he said. "Certified copies of discharges are necessary for veterans who wish to claim the full amount of their pay. The county records discharges of service men and women and allows two certified copies free. However, if extra copies are desired, the county charges \$1 for the first extra and 50 cents for each additional extra copy. Bullock said no doubt 'thousands' of discharges had been recorded and copies distributed here since demobilization commenced a year ago. An exact figure, however, would be hard to arrive at. "To aid the recorder's office in this latest rush, Exile Thompson has been asked to record and Marion Wilson, and Ed Grimmond asked as extra workers in the recorder's office."

**\$110,000 Listed As Cassia Road Cost**  
BOISE, Aug. 29 (AP)—Highway Department T. Matt Hally today called for bids on reconstruction of five Idaho highways. The projects were estimated to cost \$177,000. Bids will be received until 2 p.m. Sept. 11, he said. Contemplated projects include: Cassia county—construction of a select borrow subbase and a round-mix bituminous surface on 5.55 miles of the Bellevue road one mile of the Church road, 2.30 miles of the Vernal road and 2.8 miles of the Peila road. Engineer's estimate is \$111,000.

## Buhl Man Urges Continuance for Battle on OPA

"The only thing that can save the swine industry in Idaho is the continuance of the fight in opposition to restrictive controls placed over it by the OPA," declared G. P. McNeely, Buhl, president of the Idaho Swine Producers' association, last night. He returned from Boise where association directors backed the action described above, and said that "it is an obligation of swine producers to produce pork for the consumer, and therefore the association desires to file with the growers to continue to raise swine, as we feel that the federal government certainly can not allow these conditions to continue. "It was with great difficulty that we obtained an OPA representative to talk to us about price ceilings, commended the Buhl producer. "At the meeting broke up, a wire came from Paul Porter, OPA administrator, informing us Washington will send a man later if no decision is made. "McNeely said 'the average cost of production, according to federal authorities in the field, is 18 cents per pound,' which means the present ceiling is 'inadequate for the continuation of swine production in Idaho.' Directors reported, said McNeely, that southern Idaho farmers have been 'killing hogs while farrowing' due to the lack of profit, and that in northern Idaho, 'fully 50 per cent of the breeding stock there will be disposed of if ceiling prices are not adjusted properly.'"
