

UNCOMPROMISING PROSPECT

UNCOMPROMISING PROSPECT
Under normal circumstances, the withdrawal from the international scene of Rusala's Maxim Litvinow might be of little significance. He is old enough to retire from public life, and his past accomplishments in the Soviet service certainly have earned him the right to spend his declining years in secluded leisure.

But the current world situation by no conceivable stretch of the imagination could be termed "normal." The unanimity which won a war for the allies seems to have dissolved with the surrender of the axis. Nation battles nation and bloc battles bloc at the U.N. meetings in New York and at the peace conference in Paris. The peace for which the world waited through six long, bloody years has disintegrated into a "war of nerves." in which risis follows crists with devastating rapidity. Nor can the conditions surrounding Litvinov's withdrawal from world affairs be considered "normal." Here, obviously, was no voluntary retirement of an aging statesman; here was a repudiation of an individual by the government he served. The kremiln made no effort to disguise that fact—it simply an nounced tersely, over the Moscow radio, that the council of ministers had "released Maxim Litvinov from his duties as deputy minister of foreign affairs."

The Litvinov announcement assumes, therefore, a significance which in happier days and under happier circumstances it would not have possessed. No reason of any kind was given for Moscow's curious action. But the western world may have little doubt as to what prompted it.

Maxim Litvinov has long been known as perhaps the leading advocate in high Soviet circles of friendship between Russia and the western allies. He was the author of the phrase "Peace is indivisible," a phrase in which he so sincerely believed that he devoted his entire diplomatic career to effectuating it.

Litvinov's dismissal was due primarily—if not solely—to the reasonable and friendly attitude he champloned toward the western allies. Only thus does it make sense, considered in the context of Russia's present domestic and international policy.

The kremin apparently is determined to pursue its own course in world affairs, scornful of compromise and impatient of criticism. That fact has all too often been demonstrated at the international gatherings of the past several months.

The results of one of the latest of those seemingly endless opinion polls reached, it seems to us, a new high in interest while revealing what is perhaps a new low in intelligence. The poll was that conducted by Donald V. McGranshan, Harvard university paychologist, among German youth.

Asking the questlon, "Who is the greatest man in world history?" Kr. McGranshan received some curious answers.

Of the 301 German boys and girls interviewed in Friedberr and Offenback, 63 cast votes for Franklin D. Rooserelt and eight for Harry S. Truman—results which may reasonably be supposed to have some bearing on Germany's present position as a conquered foe of the United States. But look for a moment at the other choices: Hismarck (50), Frederick the Great (49), Hittle (19), Eisenhower (14), Chalemagne (8), Caesar (6), Alexander the Great (3), and Napoleon (3). "Milliary men and conquerors all! And the heroes" of Prussian aggression rank, it should be noted, second, third, and fourth. Thus does German youth accept and revere the military heritage which has brought Germany to its present broken and bleeding state.

The results of one of the latest of those seemingly endless opinion polls reached, it seems to us, a new high in interest while revealing what is perhaps a new low in intelligence. The poll was that conducted by Donald V. McGranahan, Harvard university psychologist, among German youth.






