B-29 Starts Hop From Hawaii to Egypt via Arctic

HONOLULU, Oct. 4 (AP) — The army's B-29 Superfortress took off this morning on a 10,000 mile flight from Honolulu to Cairo over the top of the world. The plane got into the air at 5:51 a. m. (9:21) MST. To carry the greatest possible amount of gasoline, the ship was overloaded 27,000 pounds at the takeoff. Of its total weight of 147,000 pounds, approximately 117,352 pounds, was gasoline.

The heavy plane sped down the army air force's 7,000 foot Hickam field runway and onto the navy's adjoining John Rodgers field's equally long strip before it was airborne. The Associated Press listening post in San Francisco heard the B-29 roar by radio at 8:33 a. m. — 9:23 a. m. MST — that it was "proceeding normally at 1400 feet altitude."

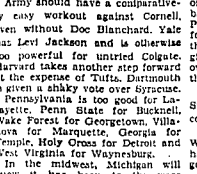
