

Bureau Gives Minidoka Plan Of Expansion

WASHINGTON, Dec. 20 (AP)—The U. S. reclamation bureau disclosed today its plan which provides for use of unused space in the American Falls reservoir for development of 37,000 acres of new land in the proposed north side pumping division of the Minidoka project.

The plan, embodying a report by regional engineers who had consulted affected water users, was sent to Gov. Arnold Williams, who is in charge of the Idaho congressional delegation.

Main point of the plan is to provide a diversion canal to provide a sustained water supply on the Palisades reservoir project along the upper Snake river in Idaho, said Michael W. Strauss, reclamation commissioner.

Insured of Water Saving
"The Palisades project was authorized through an assurance that it would conserve water in water use for non-irrigation and off-season use," Strauss said.

The plan for diversion to canals during winter would save 28,000 acre-feet a year, initially. Bureau is now flowing for coordination of the proposed reservoir with existing irrigation facilities. It provides also for use of unused space in the downstream American Falls reservoir.

Model Allow Development
This would allow the development of 37,000 acres of new land in the proposed north side project. In addition to 30,000 acres in the Minidoka unit of the Port Hall Indian irrigation project.

Strauss said construction of a dam can not begin until water saving agreements are negotiated with water users and repayment contracts reached with prospective users of unused space in Palisades reservoir.

Refused for state commissioner of law enforcement was County Attorney E. M. Sweeney, who told the county central committee that he did not believe he should accept the appointment at this time because of local duties.

Both Carl Trwin, OOP state senator and farmer near Twin Falls, and Albert Jaggia, Glover, who is one of Idaho's leading dairymen, declined recommendation by the county central committee for the position of commissioner of agriculture.

The steering committee chairman, Clyde Musgrave, Filer, said that both men indicated they don't care for the job.

With these "nos" in mind, the central committee met last night to consider further recommendations for these posts which Dr. Rohrer has asked them to submit.

"We don't believe we'll be able to find anyone in the county for these jobs," declared Musgrave. "But I think we'll have our next meeting next Monday night to see if we can. Right now it looks like these appointments may have to come from another county."

He said that the steering committee will continue to search for men to endorse for the posts until the new governor makes definite appointments for the two jobs, which will probably be announced after Dr. Rohrer returns from St. Paul, Minn., where he is spending Christmas with his family.

The price of gayety this new year's eve will be slightly higher, night clubs will be crowded but not jammed, and the nation probably will consume less aspirin when it awakens new year's day.

Night club and cabaret operators across the country are expecting a less boisterous celebration than was occasioned by the birth of 1946. A survey showed that cover charges and food and liquor prices will be higher in some places, but will remain the same in many cities.

Night life lighter

New York enjoyed one of its biggest blinges last new year's eve, but the city's fabulous night life has fallen off sharply in recent weeks and this new year's celebration is expected to be less exuberant. But despite the recent night club slump, the after dark trade is anticipating a brisk volume of business to welcome the new year.

Manhattan's big glamor maris charge a flat price per person for new year's celebrations, including dinner, breakfast, drinks and paper hats and horns. These prices in general will be the same as last year, with a top of \$20 per person. Smaller spots will charge higher prices for food and liquor.

Only one New York spot, the Embassy, charged the \$20 top last year. The highest priced spot in the nation probably will be Chicago's New Cameo restaurant, where the tariff will be a mere \$100 per person. That includes the evening's entertainment with all the pleasant you can eat and all the champagne you can drink.

GED Testing Station Set Up for Vets

A general education development testing station has been established at Twin Falls high school to facilitate Magic Valley veterans in getting high school diplomas, John D. Platt, principal of the high school announced Friday.

Twin Falls high school is believed to be the only high school in the Pacific northwest and one of the few in the nation to be accredited for the training, Platt said. He estimated that there are about 100 veterans in Magic Valley who have one to three years of high school who would be benefited by the GED testing here. Previously, they had to go to Pocatello to take the exams.

"We hope to give the first test early in January and will try to give a test a month during the spring," Platt said.

He explained that persons who have completed three years of high school and have met the qualifications of three years of English and a year of American history will be given a diploma from his high school if they pass the exam.

Persons with one or two years of high school who pass the exam will be given an equivalency diploma from the state department of education. The equivalency diploma will enable the veteran to enroll at most colleges on a trial basis, Platt explained.

The examination takes two days to complete and it will save Magic Valley veterans a two- or three-day trip. Platt said that examinations here would be conducted on Saturdays and Sundays so that the veteran would miss only one working day at the most.

Authorization for establishment of the testing agency has been received from the veterans' testing service under the office of education and has been confirmed by the state superintendent of public instruction, J. L. Anderson of the College of Idaho, the Idaho agent for the testing bureau.

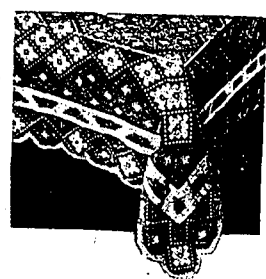

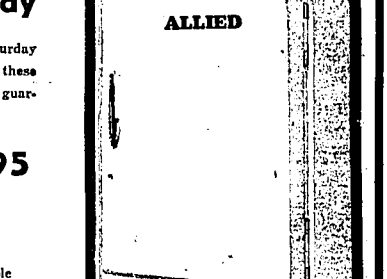
