

While inaugural addresses don't necessarily mean much, any more than campaign platforms, Gov. C. A. Robins was quite right in reminding the 29th legislature that problems of "great scope" are confronting the state.

He was outspoken in his condemnation of sloppy law enforcement in Idaho and in demanding repeal of the 1845 act by which slot machines were "legalized" in the state. The slot machine racket in our so-called "non-profil" clubs is a farce anyway you look at it. It demonstrates the extent to which we have gone in trying to stretch our laws, rather than in attempting to enforce them.

Although we do not know Governor Robins too well, we are inclined to believe he has been sincered in his awowd purpose of bringing about greater efficiency in state government and greater respect for law enforcement.

Democrats and Republicans alike have


