To Start Review of Mine Case

WASHINGTON, Jan. 13 (AP)—With the nation facing another coal shortage, the federal government today filed a lawsuit in federal court to force the United Mine Workers (UMW) and the government to reach a settlement before the Supreme Court tomorrow.

UMW Chairman John L. Lewis has asked the court to cancel certain provisions against the union in the new coal law, which would limit the union and fines of \$250,000. The law was imposed when Lewis refused to accept the government's offer to arbitrate the government-operated mines.

Hike in Phone Rates Granted

Increased rates granted will affect 70,000 telephones of the Mountain Telephone and Telegraph company south of the Salmon river at a cost of \$500,000 while telephone rates in the Pacific Northwest and Telegraph company in Lewis and Nez Perce counties will be assessed more than 10 percent.

Labor Counts On President To Veto Bills

WASHINGTON, Jan. 13 (AP)—Organized labor, facing one of the coldest winters in its epoch, counted heavily on President Truman to veto highly restrictive legislation that would be passed by this congress.

Most labor organizations, some of the largest labor officials and those remaining new dealers in the area are working to try to moderate the effects of bills which the Republican congress has voted to pass.

Most unions had been urged against proposals by Sen. Joseph H. Ball, R. Minn., and others to ban clear-cutting. There had been a bill introduced by Sen. William Green, the Congress of Industrial Organizations and the National Education Contractors Association.

The labor forces counted on Mr. Truman to veto such bills as would repeal the national labor relations act, change minimum new dealer in the labor-injunction act, weaken the closed shop standards law, ban the fair labor practices act, and make unions subservient.

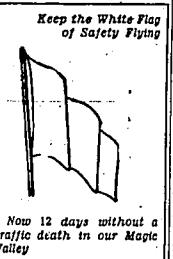

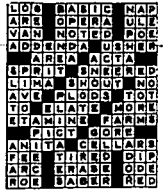

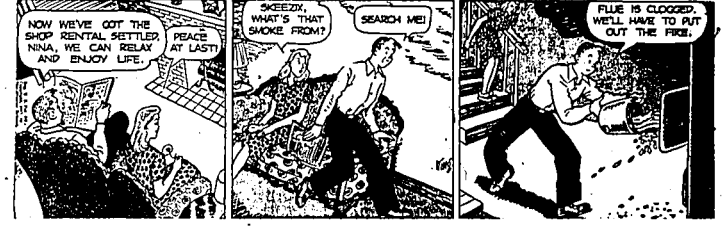
