





All of this represents eminently logical thinking. We must remain strong, keep armed, guard our adomic secrets, prepare for emergency even as we talk of disarmation. Other governments are also sleeping with their weapons at their sides, it would be folly for our government to ignore it.

But what it all this doing to the prospects

But what is all this doing to the prespects for peace? How can statemen resolve the cynical contradiction in their own minds? We don't know the answers. "There have not been, nor are there now, any boogymen under the journalistic bed who have been pronouncing the death sentence over small publications. It has been a matter of plain economics."

So says Editor & Publisher magazine-in commenting on the senate small business committee's investigation of problems affecting small newspaper publishers.

The committee, it acems, is alarmed over the fact that so many clies in the United States, many as large as 100,000 population, have only one daily newspaper.

In pointing out the economic reasons why the smaller cities cannot support two daily newspapers. Editor & Publisher called attention to the fact that so Jan. 1, 1965, there were 1,412 towns and cities with dailies in the United States, but 1,697 of these had onlyone daily newspaper. Not so long ago the American Mercury magazine commented along these same lines by pointing out that "competition is extinct in 85 per cent of the cities of the United States in which dailies are published."

But it went even further in its analysis of this interesting but generally unknown fact:

"In 40 out of the 93 American cities with populations of 100,000 or more, all the English language dailes are published by a single company, without competition. The same situation prevails in 71 out of the 108 American cities with populations ranging from 50,000 to 100,000. And in cities under 50,000, there is virtually no competition at all."






