Repeal of the 1945 act legalizing cont operated armosement devices in nonprofit clubs was asked in a house bill sponsored by the Republican controlled state affairs committee. Rep. Howard O. Hechtner, D., Nez Perce, said the Democratic minority agreed in a caucus to support the bill too. Sens. John Bahr, R., Camas, Baldwin F. Brown, R., Owyhee, and Lawrence F. Heagle, R., Blaine, introduced the game bill which would return control of the state fish and game department to a state game warden appointed every two years by the governor. Other employees in the department would be subject to appointment or dismissal by the game





Continuous and adequate chlorination must be incorporated in the operation of the pool, the state department warned, and filters should be provided or sufficient make-up water added to provide an eight-hour turn-

Other recommendations call for added toliet facilities, repair of leaks so water may be overflowed into the actum guiters and resurfacing of the floor with smooth concrete to facilitate cleaning. It is common knowledge that the municipal facilities in the eity, has not been properly maintained. In effect, the state department of public freath has served notice that this neglect cannot continue any longer. Twin Falls must not overlook the impor-tance of its swimming pool. Healthful recre-tion for the city's youngsters will do more than anything else to keep these children out of trouble.
