Nearly 2,000,000 bushels of Magic Valley-grown potatoes will be dumped to comply with the agriculture department directive authorized to rid the U.S. of a national 45,000,000 bushel surpluss.

Ben Jansen, Kimberly, county agricultural conservation officer, said approximately 1,500,000 bushels of potatoes will be dumped in Twin Falls county alone. W. L. Schultz, secretary of the ACA in Minidoka county, said never before has 400,000 sacks of potatoes gone to the price-support loan provisions would have to be dumped in Minidoka county.

Robins Tells Senators to Be Careful in Spending Funds on New Programs

BOISE, Jan. 24 (AP)—The Idaho legislature received today from Gov. C. A. Robins a "be careful sign" in expenditure of state funds—particularly for new education and other programs.

The governor in an appeal fiscal and education message delivered to the house and senate in joint session recognized the need for new programs and suggested some cuts be made. He said building activity—particularly at the mental institutions—should be restricted until construction and material costs are reduced.

The governor warned, too, the legislature to be careful in raising needed revenue. He said, "suggestions for various means of raising revenue need to be appraised in the cold light of the question, whether or not they represent something which actually will increase our economic stature, develop our resources, or preserve the character of our citizenship, especially our young people."

From that warning it would appear he wanted the legislature to go slow in enactment of "vice" taxes. And he added, "we must be careful not to exhaust our possibilities for revenue in any hurried attempt to solve all our problems at once."

He gave a green light to increased appropriations for public assistance, which he said only met rising living costs of pension recipients. He said special programs such as extension service, potato research and special research "have justified themselves." He noted approval for the state's agricultural experiment station and the deaf and blind school at Gooding.

Subtle Criticism
But the yet-to-be-presented expanded program for education received criticism—subtle though it was. The governor shook his head slightly but meaningfully at the increased budget for higher education.

Residents of East Washington are not too keen on the new bird law. They know little or nothing about the unfortunate habits.
