## Black Market In Philippines Robbing U.S.

MANILA, April 4.—Thrift and black-marketing of hundreds of millions of dollars worth of United States supplies in the Philippines is a widespread operation that ranges from the lowest depths of the Manila underworld to influential politicians, big-time buy-and-sell magnates, and their American contacts. There apparently is not and never has been any single mastermind of this criminal market. The practice is too widespread for that.

The army, in cooperation with the Philippine government, has recently started an all-out drive against the thieves. But wage and inefficient handling of the vast stock piles add to the problem.

Responsible officers say that a certain amount of loss is inevitable because of the postwar demobilization, lack of sufficient trustworthy guards and hiring of thousands of civilians who were not subjected to the usual investigations because of shortages of personnel.

No sooner has one gang been broken up than a dozen others are found to be flourishing, and the American officers say that unfortunately some military personnel have the attitude that "the war workers got their profits at home, why shouldn't I make mine here? It's going to be stolen or wasted anyway."

BURLEY, April 4.—A group of regular army officers are expected in Burley soon to view the local national guard unit and approve it for national recognition as soon as the group is completely organized, Norman D. Smith, company commander, said.

The unit, to consist of 180 men, will help form the 183rd Infantry regiment, headquarters of which are in Twin Falls. All men interested in joining the unit are urged to see Smith at the veterans administration office.

## Portuguese Bride Of Shoshone Man Born in Shanghai

SHOSHONE, April 4.—Mrs. Pamela Anderson, wife of Grant Anderson, former Shoshone athlete, has a cosmopolitan background and was an early resident of the European settlement of Shanghai, China. Mrs. Anderson arrived in the United States about a month ago. She is of Portuguese descent and was educated in the French Municipal college in Shanghai. Her parents were among the earliest foreign residents of Shanghai.

Anderson is now on terminal leave from the navy and will get his release May 6. He was a lieutenant and was awarded the navy cross and French croix de guerre for scouting amphibious landings in Normandy and Anzio. He won the silver star and other citations for work behind the Japanese lines in China.

## Operators of Motor 'Bikes' Need Permits

Noting the increase of accidents and traffic law violations involving motorcycles and motor bikes, County Attorney Everett M. Sweezy said Thursday that drivers of every type of motor vehicle must have operator's licenses, and must know and obey all traffic laws.

He also pointed out that owners of every type of motor vehicle must have their vehicles licensed and must have certificates of title to the vehicles.

Classified as motor vehicles are motorcycles, motor bikes, motor scooters—"any vehicle powered by a motor," Sweezy emphasized—as well as the more commonly considered automobiles and trucks.

Minimum age for obtaining an operator's license, he explained, is 14—and then only with the parents

assuming responsibility. Operating a motor vehicle without a driver's license is a criminal offense, he warned.

Sweezy also emphasized that motorcycles, motor bikes and motor scooters are subject to the same traffic laws as cars, trucks and other vehicles. He listed driving through stop-signs, exceeding the speed limit and driving on the wrong side of the road as the most common and dangerous violations, and added that if a motor vehicle is to be driven at night, it must be equipped with lights—not reflectors.

Sweezy declared that the widespread usage of the small motor vehicles is becoming an increasingly dangerous traffic hazard.

# Byron Nelson, Jimmy Demaret Take Lead in Masters With 3 Under Par 69s

AUGUSTA, Ga., April 4 (AP)—A couple of veteran players, Byron Nelson and Jimmy Demaret, led the field of 28 in Thursday's opening round of the 11th annual Masters golf tournament with three under par 69s.

The two native Texans, with Nelson now retired at Houston, Texas, and Demaret now playing out of San Diego, Calif., have each won over seven others who tied at 70.

Nelson, winner of the event in 1937 and 1942, posted rounds of 35 over the last 72 (35-35) national layout, while Demaret shot the 6,000-yard course in 35-34.

Tied at 70 were George Schemmer, Salt Lake City; Jimmy Palmer, Bait Lake, N. C.; Jimmy Ferrier, Chicago; Johnny Bulla, Phoenix, Ariz.; Fred Hall, New Orleans; Ed Oliver, Wilmington, Del.; and Les Worham, Washington, D. C.

Bobby Locke, the South African champion, rated as a darkhorse contender, had trouble with the greens and turned in a 36-36 card for a 72 total.

George Schemmer, Mamaroneck, N. Y., one of the younger pros who is now fifth among the money winners, had a 71 after a bad start which saw him miss three consecutive putts of less than three feet.

Frank Stranahan, Toledo, a proponent of Nelson, had a 24 on the way but blew up starting the hole for the 19th and he sank the resulting nine and finished with 39 for a 73 total.

Schemmer, who had trouble with his putting on the outgoing nine to take a 34, came back strong to post a 32, the day's lowest score for nine holes. He had four birdies and five pars without any spectacular shooting. His approach shots were dead to the pin and he sank the resulting short putts when they counted most.
