

Woman Is Second Car Crash Victim In Week's Period

Mrs. Ghan was injured when the car in which she was riding, her husband was involved in a crash with a machine in which Mr. and Mrs. W. G. Guynn of Salem, Ore., were traveling toward their home. All were hospitalized, but Ghan has since been dismissed after receiving treatment for shock and minor injuries.

Baker, 76, Wednesday from injuries received in an accident last Sunday. Finding of the inquest was that Mr. Baker received injuries that led to his death in an accident between two automobiles, one of which was driven by a "negligent and reckless manner" by Yragui. Yragui pleaded not guilty to charges filed against him for reckless driving in connection with the accident and he was released on \$100 bond. A charge of speeding on Blue Lake boulevard north was also filed against him Friday.

80 Elk, 2 Horses Bagged on First Day of Big Game Hunts

BOISE, Sept. 27 (AP)—Big game hunters today were downing their red hals and getting their guns ready for elk, deer and antelope hunts throughout the state. Some are back home already with their kills.
More than 80 elk and two horses already have been killed by southwestern Idaho hunters as the antelope season opened in portions of Boise, Elmore and Valley counties late this week.
Special antelope hunts in seven areas of eastern Idaho opened this morning, but state fish and game department officials this evening had no reports from checking stations on the kill in the area.
Meanwhile, hunters were preparing for the open elk and deer season in the Selway-Lochsa area, which is expected to attract the largest number of hunters in history.
More than 80 elk had been checked out by the regional check station by this noon and numerous Boise hunters were returning home this afternoon with elk. Charles W. Newell, a packer on the middle-fork of the Boise river at Twin Springs, reported that two of his horses had been killed by elk hunters.
A total of 558 permits was issued for antelope in the seven three-day hunts scheduled in the Lost River and Pahsimero drainage areas. Twelve checking stations have been set up in the area.
In the Selway-Lochsa area, the season will be open from Oct. 1 to 31 for both deer and elk. The goat season in portions of Clearwater and Idaho counties will be open from Oct. 22 to 31, so hunters going for elk the latter part of the season also may hunt goat.
Last year about 5,000 elk were killed in the area that embraces nearly all of Idaho county and portions of Shoshone and Clearwater counties. The season is opening earlier this year and is shorter, yet game officials are anticipating a heavy kill this year.
The Selway-Lochsa preserve will be open to elk hunting by permit only. One thousand permits have been issued for the special elk hunt from Oct. 15 to 31.
Hundreds of nimrod had flocked to get an early start for antelope. A total of 120 permits were issued for the Birch Creek area, 100 for Big Lost river, 90 for Pahsimero, 80 for Little Lost river, 75 for an area west of Salmon river, 50 for Antelope valley and 40 for the Crooked creek and Snake and Clark county north of Reno point.

Pakistan Governor Fears Soviet Grab If Hindu-Moslem Strife Weakens India

By BERT BRANDT

KARACHI, India, Sept. 27 (NBA)—If either the Hindu or the Moslem government in India breaks down under the strain of bloody fighting, Soviet Russia might step in and take over, Mohammed Ali Jinnah, governor general of Pakistan, told NBA service in an exclusive interview.

"And that," he added, "would be a very serious thing indeed."

Russia, the only important nation that did not telegraph expressions of good will toward either Pakistan or India when they attained freedom, is known to be watching the situation closely.

Jinnah flatly accused the Hindu government of permitting the Sikhs to collect arms and ammunition with which to butcher Moslems in the Punjab, and of taking no effective steps to stop the migration of Moslems even in the capital at New Delhi, "under the very noses of the Hindu government."

Each side in the Hindu-Moslem controversy insists that the other started the savage fighting in which thousands have been slain, and could stop it by firm action. Here is Jinnah's bitter complaint:

"It is quite clear that the Hindu government has failed to control a systematically organized move on the part of the Sikhs in Punjab."

"We have ample information from very reliable sources of enormous preparations made by the Sikhs in the way of gathering arms and ammunition of all kinds. The Hindu government did nothing about it. The first deadly blow came from the Sikhs, especially in eastern Punjab."

"The ball started rolling in Punjab, but the situation in New Delhi is the biggest disgrace because it is in the Hindu capital, under the very noses of the Hindu government."

Life in MAGIC VALLEY

"Why do husbands leave home?" According to a well-known authority on family relations, two of the most important reasons are (1) the other woman (2) mothers-in-law. This investigator, who has helped flush more than 2,000 husbands out of hiding, declares that if wives nagged less, men would be less inclined to bolt. By some miracle about two tries in five come out delicious.

Once we asked a Magic Valley cafe owner why men's ward menus weren't served. His reply was terse: "No demand. The bulk of our trade want what they grew up with—meat and potatoes, coffee and pie!" But the folks of Magic Valley are from many different parts of the world. Some of us are German, and were nourished on sour gravies and coffee kuchen; some are Russian, and don't feel filled up without a bowl of borsch and blinchi. Plenty of us have a Norwegian background and are right at home with meat balls and all salad. Must be we are battal about our food tastes and leave them at home when we go out to dine.

The Jews are having a tough time again—not that they haven't gone through some and triumphed. Don't forget that in the days of the proud Romans it took the best general they had to subdue these peace-loving folks. Magic Valley has few Jewish families and that is her good luck. Shipments of Ore Approach Record

ST. PAUL, Minn., Sept. 27 (AP)—The United States is apparently headed towards a record peacetime use of steel this year. Ray D. Nolan, state director of the division of lands and minerals reported that at the present rate of shipment, Minnesota may exceed the 6,000,000 tons of iron ore shipped to eastern plants from the famous Mesabi range in 1941. That was the peacetime high. So far this year, Nolan said, ore shipments from Lake Superior docks have totalled 31,024,431 tons—com-

pared with 19,725,233 tons shipped in a corresponding period last year. If the present rate is maintained, he estimated that tonnage might hit 65,000,000 tons—barring unforeseen weather changes this fall which could close off the shipping season earlier than usual.

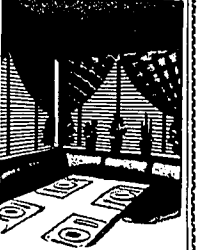

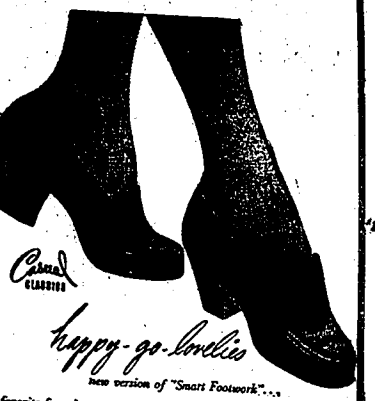
