



### Attlee's Party Plans Curb of Lords' Power

LONDON, Oct. 21.—Prime Minister Clement Attlee today announced in a speech written by his socialist ministers that he would curtail the power of the British House of Lords and, for a curb on the powers of the ancient House of Commons. He said he would, however, to economic recovery.

Both houses sat together in the House Chamber for the ceremony marking the third biennial year under the labor government.

Queen, Princess Elizabeth, and Prince Philip were present. The king read his 15-minute speech slowly and deliberately with stately assurance. On his right sat the queen on his right, Princess Elizabeth, attending her first state opening.

In a speech the prime minister announced the government's momentous decision to trim the authority of the House of Lords.

"Legislation will be introduced to amend the parliament act, 1911," Attlee's authority is set out in the bill.

A high government source confessed that the bill is a cabinet decision, reached yesterday, to limit the power of the House of Lords.

### Beet Harvest By Machines Has Arrived

**BOISE, Oct. 21 (AP)—**"Mechanized harvesting of sugar beets is here," that statement of H. P. Eames, Washington, D. C., information specialist for the extension service, is the first of a series of the U. S. department of agriculture, after an extensive survey of beet harvesting in the western states.

Eames said that 20 per cent of Idaho beet farms will be utilizing beet digging and topping machinery this fall and predicted that next year 50 per cent of Idaho farmers will harvest by machinery if the equipment is available.

**Still Few "Beats"**

There are a few bugs to be worked out of most beet harvesting machinery but there are at least three machines on the market that are doing a satisfactory job," Eames declared.

The survey disclosed that the best solutions for the small sugar beet producer would be to hire the mechanized harvest done by custom operators or to purchase the machines through a cooperative of farmers. Eames said the equipment varies in cost from \$1,000 to \$3,000.

One beet-harvesting machine is a machine developed in Boise beats the tops off the crop rather than cutting them off.

One sugar company is now experimenting with beets topped by this means, noting any changes in the processing, stockpiling and handling.

**Eases Labor Lack**

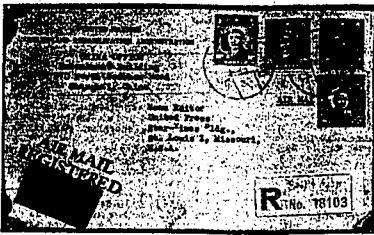
Eames said that for every eight acres of beets the machine tops it replaces one hand worker for the season's harvest period. He said some machines in Montana already have topped as many as 350 acres of beets this year and were still busy.

Eames explained that further mechanization will take the heat off the critical labor shortage.

The farm labor importation program will stop this fall and the U. S. employment service will handle the labor recruitment through its regular channels, Eames declared.

He predicted it would be three to five years before the harvest can be as completely mechanized as possible, because of a bottleneck in the production of the machines.

### Orders Backlog Swamping Idaho Dealer Agencies

**BOISE, Oct. 21 (AP)—**Practically all Idaho automobile dealers have a backlog of orders that will take them a year or two years to fill on the basis of present delivery schedules, Leon Wecks, Boise, secretary of the Idaho Automobile Dealers association, said on his return from a series of district sales meetings that carried him to all portions of the state.

"In some instances," he said, "dealers aren't even taking orders because they don't know when they can fill them."

Accompanying Wecks on the tour were W. H. Barnard, Twin Falls state president of the association, and W. R. Showalter of Nampa, a director of the national association. The meetings, Wecks said, were principally to nominate new directors of the Idaho association.

**SEASPORT, Maine, Oct. 21 (AP)—**Officials at Dow field, Bangor, sought today to learn the cause of an airplane crash which took the life of Maj. Kenneth G. Smith, 35, Boise, Ida.

Witnesses said they saw Smith standing on a wing of the plane which crashed into a stream bed, exploded and burned. They said he apparently intended to parachute from his Thunderbolt fighter, but waited too long after maneuvering it away from houses in this coastal village.

Smith was commander of the 7th fighter squadron at Dow field. He flew 136 combat missions with the army air forces in World War II and was credited with downing six German planes.

In the early days of the war he served with the royal air force. He held the distinguished flying cross with three clusters and the purple heart.

SPOKANE—The great desert of the northwest was to have been transformed into a growing garden of hope for the world's hungry when blessed by the Grand Coulee irrigation system, is still a desert. Not an acre has been irrigated.

There is grim tragedy in these days of foreign starvation and drought—around the world, in the generally unknown deserts of the world, outside the "inland empire" and neighboring states on the west coast.

CLAMORING—Today, with the world's hungry clamoring for American food, and with domestic shortages being felt, it is a tragedy that the great northwest is handicapped in its postwar growth by an acute shortage of electricity.

BLAME—It is the 80th congress which now gets the blame for another threatening delay. The federal reclamation bureau asked \$47,500,000 for construction of the Coulee Dam.

AGREEMENT AT LAST
After more than two years of the United Nations' existence, its two most powerful members have found a point on which they can agree.

There was danger of serious trouble if the Russians had espoused the Arab cause. Backed by the might of the Soviet Union, the Arab states might have opposed any UN attempt to enforce partition with military action.

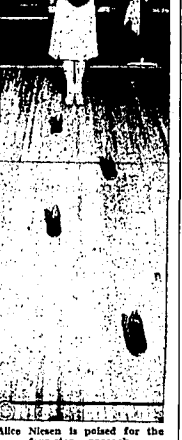

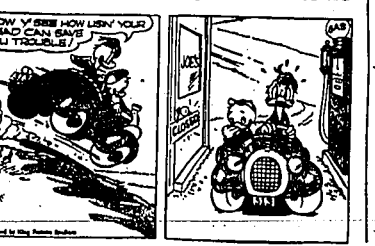
