WASHINGTON, Oct. 21 (P)—President Truman today summoned congressional leaders to the White House for a conference Thursday on Europe's financial pilght.

The White House said invitations are going out today for the meeting at 2:30 p. m. (EST) Thursday for what presidential Secy. Charles G. Ross described as a "further discussion of emergency foreign aid."

The group is the same as the one which met with Mr. Truman Sept. 29. In addition to the Republican and Democratic leaders in both houses, it includes the chairmen and ranking minority members of the foreign affairs and appropriations committees and Senator Taft, R., O., chairman of the GOP policy group in the senate.

After twice adjusting their sights to accommodate American suggestion, 16 "western" European nations sak the New World
or \$22,400,000,000 in the coming four years.
The United States is asked to provide \$15,-

810.000,000.

This is the answer of Europe, excluding the Soviet bloc which, as usual, refused to co-operate, to the question propounded by Secretary of State Marshall:
If you could get it, how much would you need to repair the worst ravages of war, avoid economic collapse, and get back to where you could support yourselves by your own production?

The 16 countries, plus western Germany, have answered, in effect:
"I'I you will let us have \$22,400,000,000 from 1948 through 1951 we will work like heavers. We will try to get our farms, our mines, our factories producing faster than they were in 1938. We will rehabilitate our railroads, replace our sunk shipping.
"We will take for our own use only what is absolutely necessary. But the end of 1951 we still will be so short that we shall have to ration. But we believe that, by then, with rationing, we shall be able to live on our own production plus what we can pay for with the income from exports."

There is a specific answer to a fair question. No layman knows whether the answer is accurate, Will \$22,400,00,000 be enough? Would less do the job. Can Europe become even relatively self-sufficing by the end of 1951 on that or any amount we possibly could provide? Our best experts will have to advise congress on these points.

AGREEMENT AT LAST

After more than two years of the United Nations' existence, its two most powerful members have found a point on which they can agree. This is a sad commentary on the state of international relations, to be sure. Nevertheless, there is real cause for rejoining in the general unanimity of American and Russian official opinion on the future of Palestine.

And the Soviet-Ameri-can agreement is particularly encouraging, since there seemed to be many reasons why it might not come off.

There are, of course, many difficult details to be worked out before the creation of a Jewish national state even approaches real-ity. Perhaps the familiar clash of democratic and communistic interests will reappear in future discussions. But as of now, the So-viet government has come into line with ma-jority opinion in a commendable, if untypical, manner.

The Russian decision seems just and hu mane. Future events may cause a reversal of that opinion. But only those inclined to hate automatically every decision of the kremlin can find reason to complain in this

kremin can find reason to complaint in dinstance.

There was danger of serious trouble if the Russians had espoused the Arab cause. Backed by the might of the Soviet union, the Arab states might have opposed any UN attempt to enforce partition with military action. A possible outcome might have been that the United States and Britain would have been driven out of the near east.

As 'things stand now, any such danger is remote. With the great powers ranged against them, the Arab states can scarcely make a military issue of the eventual decision. Such an odtcome would only seem possible if the great powers within the UN fail utterly to entorice that decision.
