John Winant Suicide Ends Long Career

(From Page One)

John Winant had fired the bullet through his right temple while kneeling.

Loyal PDB Supporter
Though a Republican, Winant became a loyal supporter of the late President Franklin D. Roosevelt and campaigned openly for him and the party.

Born of a wealthy family in New York City, Feb. 23, 1889, Winant was educated at St. Paul's and Princeton universities, where he majored in American history.

Starting out as a teacher at St. Paul's, he entered politics in 1919 to gain what he told a friend was "practical experience every teacher should have."

Served in War I
He was a seat in the New Hampshire legislature, but his political career was interrupted almost immediately by World War I.

Winant enlisted in the army air corps, rose from private to captain while serving overseas and was cited for gallantry under fire.

Upon his return, Winant went back into politics after serving two more terms in the state legislature, he defeated the late Frank Knox, newspaper publisher and national campaigner, for the Republican nomination for governor. He was elected.

Served on Board
His first post after relinquishing the governorship in 1934 was as head of the federal textile labor board and he acted as mediator in the large northeastern textile strike that year.

Never a political candidate again, Winant held a series of public positions. He was appointed ambassador to the court of St. James in 1941 during the blitz.

Talked to Londoners
Friends said he spent nights during the bombing raids on the streets of London, talking to people pleading in to help—but never identifying himself.

Winant was ambassador when the United Nations economic and social council was organized in London in January, 1946, and two months later was named by President Truman as this country's permanent representative to UNESCO.

Last December, he asked to be relieved of this post "to pick up life again as a private citizen in our own country."

Defense Chief Studies Plans Of Unification

WASHINGTON, Nov. 4.—Defense Sec. James Forrestal is studying proposals for major changes in the unified army, navy and air force organization to eliminate duplication and waste.

Any changes in the nation's new defense organization are going to be gradual, an official said, and unification will be arrived at by "evolution rather than revolution."

Forrestal's policy is to let the services run as nearly like they did before the unification as possible, meanwhile slowly putting the changes into effect. A group of joint boards has three changes under study.

Partially Established — Already unification has been established in certain military commands. The latest move in that direction was the establishment of a unified Caribbean command, announced over the week-end.

The proposed changes would: 1. Eliminate the separate and overlapping systems of purchasing, storage and supply. An estimated 85 per cent of material used by the army also is used by the navy.

2. Eliminate the duplication of service hospitals. In some locations there are both army and navy hospitals where one could do the job.

3. End overlapping research systems. Eliminate duplicate procurement systems that leave the army and navy bidding against each other.

4. Consolidate duplicate mail systems where the army and navy have separate post-offices at home and overseas, and duplicate systems.

5. Integrate the air transport systems—naval air transport service and air transport command. Each sometimes require separate maintenance, dispatching and airfields.

6. Consolidate weather stations, sometimes located only a half mile apart, which perform duplicate functions.

7. Combine the work of duplicate intelligence systems.

Judge at Hailey Will Observe 90th Anniversary on Nov. 11

HAILEY, Nov. 4.—Probate Judge George A. McLeod, who has been a resident of Hailey almost continuously for the past year, will observe his 90th birthday anniversary on Armistice day.

Considered an authority on the history of the county and the portion of that county which later became Blaine county, Judge McLeod has written two editions of the history of the area. A third edition of the history is in the process of being published now. Alturas county included Blaine, Camas, Elmore, Gooding, Lincoln, Jerome and Minidoka counties, most of Butte county, and parts of Custer, Bingham and Power counties.

Since selection in 1938 to his first public office, Judge McLeod has served nearly 40 years in county offices. His first public office was that of deputy county assessor. He was the first elected probate judge in 1928 and the establishing of a unified judicial system, announced over the week-end.

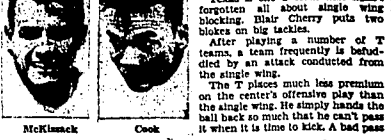

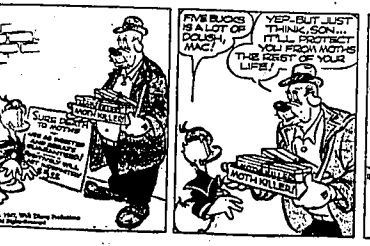

Patton Book 'Justifies' GI Slap Incident

NASHVILLE, Tenn., Nov. 4 (AP)—For slapping a battle-shocked soldier in Sicily Gen. George S. Patton, Jr., apologized under orders—to a whole army, but in his own mind there never was any doubt about the justification of this act which kicked up a storm back home. The impetuous Patton lived down that incident of 1943, as he did others in his stormy career, and he led his Third Army to undeniably brilliant victory in Europe two years later.

This feeling, and his account of the soldier slapping, are put into writing in his book, "War as I Knew It," which he wrote in 1945 after the war's end and which was published posthumously this week by Houghton Mifflin company.

The book makes good and interesting reading but doesn't add much to what a lot of people already knew; it does bring into sharper focus some of the Patton temperament and characteristics:

- (a) That while doing a spectacularly successful job of fighting Germany he was at the same time almost continually feuding and fussing with SHAEF, the headquarters of Gen. Dwight D. Eisenhower's allied high command which Patton accuses of having kept him "under wraps" all the way; and
- (b) That Patton, a man of great military talent, chafed under the notion that his superiors failed to appreciate his talent to the fullest and that he in turn held a low opinion of the way SHAEF ran the war in general and his Third Army in particular.


