WHAT DO THE **MEAT CUTTERS** WANT?

For approximately five weeks, the Meat Cutters Union of the American Federation of Labor has been picketing our places of business in an appar-ent attempt to force some sort of a showdown.

The public naturally will wonder just what it is the Meat Cutters want, and it would be just as natural for the people to assume that the union's wants have something to do with wages and hours of used. wants ha

But that, strangely enough, is not the issue be-cause we would sign any reasonable contract cov-ering these two important points without a mio-ment's hesitation.

It's the "closed shop" provision upon which the union insists that's the stickler. If we agreed to any such provision it would mean that all of the em-ployes in our meat departments would be forced to become members of the union or quit. Some of our most loyal employes who have been with us for years have toid us they do not care to become members of the union and in fairness to them, if for no other reason, we have declined to accept this "strong arm" provision which the union in-sists upon having in its contract.

So, it would seem, the union is not primarily in-terested in wages and hours. It's more concerned with gaining POWER which would force union membership down the throats of even those who still have some regard for their personal freedom and refuses to accept membership in a union as a means of being allowed to work.

We are like those employes who believe Ameri-can citizenship gives them certain rights. We be-lieve it is everyone's privilege to decide for him-self whether or not he wants to join a union.

And we submit our beliefs in this connection to the people for their consideration, in the further belief that they will bear us out in this contention.
