But that docent make those stories proud chapters of history, or mean that his-tory must go on repeating itself. The only apparent beson for the senator's cautious approach to the European ad ques-tion is his fear of what that ald will do to American lives, including his own. He doesn't just wait to 'go on living anyway.'H exants to live in an economic atmosphere that is free from high prices, high taxes, shortages and government restrictions. Bo do we all-mil-lions of Europeans and Aslatics as well as Americans. The question is how best to cre-ate that atmosphere. People don't completely collapse, but econ-omies and governments do aburely that several European governments and economies are facing collapse, and that they will collapse withoutsufficient help. The neal party of Germany was the cause of that threatened collapse. The commu-st party of Russian attands to gain by that collapse—or thinks it does—and is trying to ause it.
