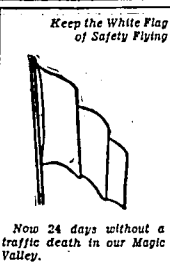

### Inflation Bites Into Morocco Harem Status

FEZ, Morocco, Jan. 6 (AP)—The high cost of living is slowly wiping out the harem in Morocco. More and more Arabs are restricting themselves to one wife at a time. The Moroccan entitles a man to four official spouses, in addition to an unlimited number of concubines. That is just too expensive these days.

Before the war an Arab could "buy" a wife for 500 francs. Now a wife costs from 100,000 to 200,000 francs (from \$1,000 to \$2,000).

**Inflation Rampant**  
Inflation is rampant in all phases of Moroccan life. Seven years ago a man could buy a camel for 400 francs. Just try to find one now for less than 12,000.

While there are few palaces or castles able to afford the jewels and "babouches" (gilded slippers) for four wives, there are ways of arriving at the same end.

**Easy Divorce**  
An Arab can divorce a wife merely by telling her before witnesses that he betrays her. And that's all there is to it. The wife then should it happen that the wife is guilty of a serious offense, such as adultery, the husband can even get his money back.

When an Arab marries he gives a sum of money to his bride, parents with which they outfit her with clothes and the cushions that constitute the furniture of an Arab room. In divorce cases in which the wives are at fault the parents are obliged to return the money.

**Easy to Have Divorce**  
Consequently, if a Moroccan can't afford to put on the dog by having four wives at the same time, he can simply manage to have four different wives within a year.

Divorce is far easier than in Reno and, what's more, there is no sentimentality involved. The woman puts marriage on a strictly business basis.

Arab sources agree that there is no real feminine movement in Morocco, but that—

### Mining Accidents Prove Fatal to 16

BOISE, Jan. 6 (AP)—Mining accidents were fatal to 16 Idaho miners in 1947—double the number of deaths reported in 1946, George McDowell, state inspector of mines, said today. Two of the 1947 deaths resulted from accidents of the preceding year, he said.

McDowell attributed the increase in deaths to the large number of inexperienced miners working during the past year. He said the industry was short 1,500 men in 1946 and was short 700 employees during the past year and that they had made up the difference primarily with inexperienced men.

# Red Block of U.N. Meeting Is Mystifying

As the United Nations "little assembly" begins its work, the Russian bloc is making it plain that it is up for, or, at least, a great propaganda opportunity.

And, so far as western thinking goes, for no good reason. What seems to be the best explanation is the unbridled Russian refusal to play any game except under its own rules, and perhaps a tiredness of being outwitted or even of when they do play (that's rather superficial, of course, Russia's refusal to consider the meaning of the fact that she is the one out on a limb is not mere built-inness. It is just further evidence that she has quite other aims which are opposed to those of the rest of the world.)

Likes Security Council

The top part of the United Nations which Russia likes is the security council, where her veto power is a great "advantage." She is already boycotting the Balkan and Korean commissions and is participating in all of the numerous other U.N. subsidiary organs.

She can hardly boycott the general assembly, but the prospect of being continually on the pan before a year-round "little assembly" seems to be too much for her.

That is why the delegates here, some of them, to keep the door open to the Russian bloc by opposing as the interim committee does under way. The United States particularly, still believes that the U.N. is the greatest hope of ultimate cooperation between nations.

No desire to split

There is no desire to see it become merely a vehicle for one of the two worlds into which the international community has been divided.

U.S. If it must fight a "cold war," prefers to preserve the U.N. as a first aid attendant when the conflict is over.

The lack of tension as the "little assembly" convenes probably has presented its greatest promise, although it must sooner or later tackle the question of the security council veto which will mean that Russia will again be the defendant.

But the general assembly, when it meets, is always a hectic thing, one reaching from one meeting to the next until final adjournment. The little assembly, with a whole year to discuss the same issues and being under no compulsion to meet or take action, can proceed more calmly. It's real function, of course, is to provide a forum for the world opinion can be mobilized.

The effect of the Russian boycott, there is to make it a more open forum. The bolshievs can mill around, shouting outside the windows, but now they are obliged to reach the audience as they could from inside in a mystery.

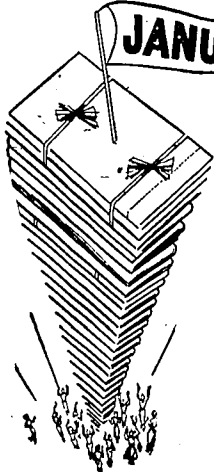

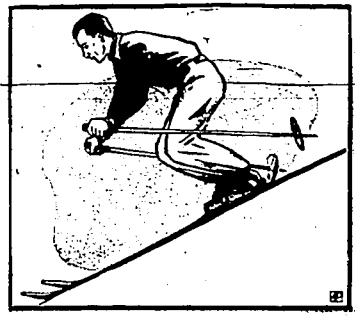

HOW TO SKI, No. 5--Sun Valley Authority Discusses Fundamental Running Stance

By OTTO LANG International Skiing Authority SUN VALLEY, Jan. 5 (AP) -- To proceed with your skiing season, let us presume that you have acquainted yourself with your skis by walking circles on the level ground, tried a few climbing steps and kickturns, as suggested in one of my previous discussions.

once you reach the bottom of the slope your speed will diminish gradually by itself. In the fundamental running position, colloquially known in skiing circles as the "athletic" position, the skis are held parallel, a few inches apart, with the weight of the body equally distributed on both legs.

Your knees should be supple and responsive at all times, like the suspension of a good automobile. It will help your balance to advance on skis ever so slightly, while your knees move two feet more forward from your hips down, so to speak, and then the knees will correspondingly pull up behind you, with your feet ahead of the approximate angle of your body, about hip high.

Trained by Lehman "In transferring Metro to the Cowboys we are giving you one of the best promising pilots in the entire Yankee organization and only then because the Magic Valley club is one of the most respected in the west."

Metro is married and the father of two children, Elma, 5, and Bud, 2. And according to reports, the Magic Valley club has a fine baseball manager and a star player, but also a crack pitcher who could be among the best in the game had he more time to give to the sport; an outstanding bowler and a man who likes to fish and hunt.

He was transferred from the Philadelphia Athletics to the Detroit club as manager in 1945.

After two seasons at Detroit, he obtained his unconditional release and sold himself to Connie Mack of the Philadelphia Athletics in 1946 for \$74,000.

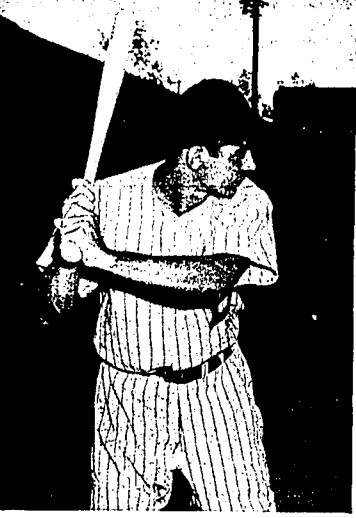
Sold to Oakland In the last month of the 1945 season, the veteran pilot sold Metro to the Oakland club of the Pacific coast league, where he also played most of the 1946 season under Casey Stengel, manager of the Athletics.

While he was with the Athletics last month and he finished up 1946 with the Rainiers.

Last spring Lehman and Scout Joe Levine selected Metro as the manager of the Bubebe club after looking over hundreds of applicants.

He has handled the club by not only leading the club into second place but by hitting 371 and driving in 120.

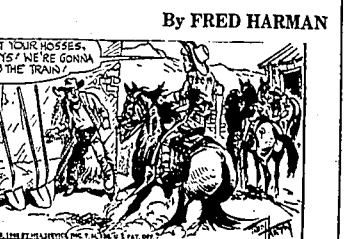

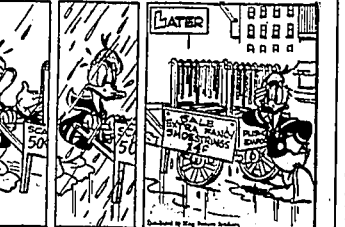

1. Establish and maintain a research laboratory in an isolated island or other accessible safe area for the intensive study of foot-and-mouth disease.
2. Continue research to determine methods for the immediate and efficient disposal of carcasses by chemicals or means other than burial.
3. Build an adequate fence along the United States-Mexico international boundary line.

The report noted that a joint commission was working to eradicate the disease. It includes Mexico, its 1,500 military personnel some 522 from the United States. Some 15,000 Mexican army troops are assisting in the campaign.

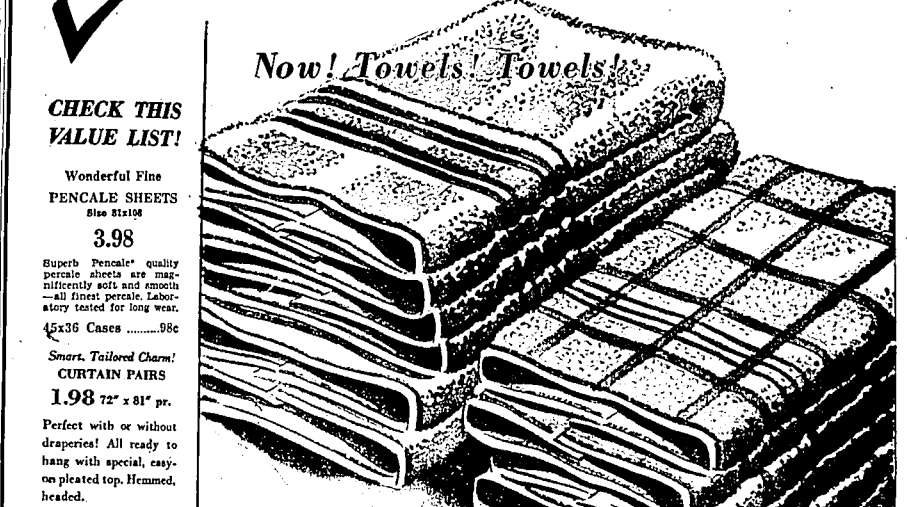
