Benes' Illness Is Increasing U. S. Worries

Word from Prague that Eduard Benes is all but helpless the foreboding with which his country and the world have been watching the gradual closing of Moscow's fingers on Czechoslovakia.

The 64-year-old president, who shared with Thomas Masaryk the title of father of his country and who has been conducting a defense in depth ever since it became evident that Russia would be on the winning side in the war, is suffering from hardening of the arteries. Dispatches indicate the limits of medical aid to hold on until constitutional elections can be held.

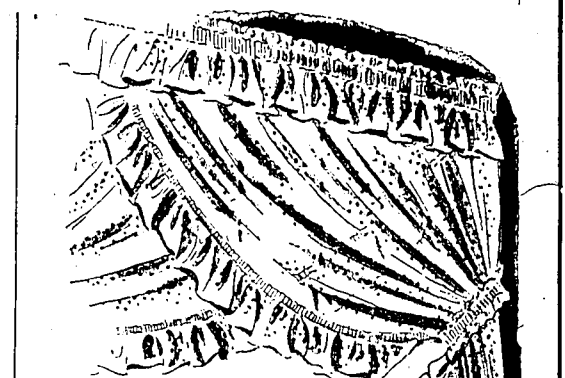

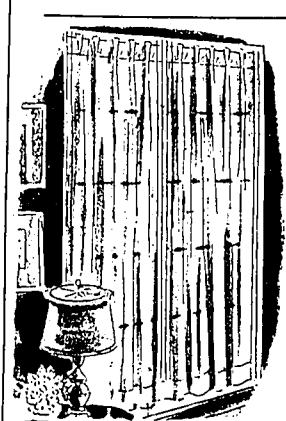

Marshall a Victim of His Own Success as Secretary of State

By JOHN M. HIGHTOWER WASHINGTON, Jan. 20 (AP)—George Marshall winds up his first year as secretary of state today with even less hope than he had just January of ever settling down at Leesburg, Va., for a long, well-earned rest.

Student Vets Learn Costs Exceed Help

MINNEAPOLIS, Jan. 20 (UP)—The average married student veteran spends almost twice as much to stay in school as is allotted him under the GI bill of rights and the single student receives his allowance by almost 65 per cent, a survey showed today.

The study was conducted by a committee of the American council on Education and financed by the Disabled American Veterans. It involved interviews with scientifically selected cross-section of student veterans at school across the nation.

Salons to Get Details

The DAV is expected to place results of the survey before a congressional committee investigating the status of student veterans. The DAV has joined other veterans' groups in urging legislation providing higher college subsistence allowances for ex-servicemen.

The first results of the nationwide survey were released today by Dr. E. C. Williamson of the University of Minnesota, chairman of the committee.

Expenses Total \$175.38

They showed that the average married veteran in college has expended \$175.38—\$83.28 more than the \$92 allotted him by the veterans administration, and that the single veteran spends an average of \$162.12 compared with his allowance of \$55.

Married students reported they spent an average of \$126 for rent monthly and \$67.71 for food. Single vets spend, on the average, \$55.19 for room and board combined or \$51.08 for meals alone and \$21.44 for rent alone.

25 Per Cent Work

Thirty-six per cent of student veterans said they had to work outside of school to make ends meet. They per cent worked up to 10 hours a week, 14 per cent from 11 to 20 hours and 10 per cent more than 20 hours.

Thirty-six per cent of veterans said their wives were working—4 per cent of them full-time—to supplement the family income. Six out of 10 married students worked last summer, but of those who did so, only 3 per cent said they were able to accumulate savings to offset expenses while they were in school.

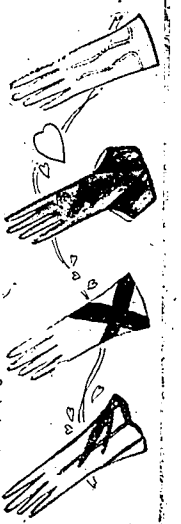
