"Fascist" Plots Discovered by French Chiefs

Reports of the discovery of an out and out fascist movement in France refer to three collaborating groups as "nationalist" but give little clue as to their size.

The mere existence of such groups, however, throws light on an important factor in French politics which may play into the hands of the communists when and if the latter launch their expected spring offensive of strikes and sabotage in an effort to cripple the Marshall plan.

Control Is Aim
The French press agency reports the objective of the "Black Maquis" was to seize the government under cover of an anti-communist campaign. The groups were said to comprise former members of the fascist "French People's party," the Legion of French Volunteers Against Bolshevism, the roundly-hatted wartime Vichy militia, and the German SS Foreign Corps.

Nothing would suit these people better than to start a civil war in which the middle-of-the-road government might have to take sides either with the rightist de Gaulle or the communists.

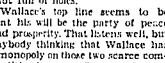

Silence Called Best Treatment For Wallace's Try for Power

WASHINGTON, (NEA). — The best treatment of Henry Wallace's third party candidacy for the presidency is to ignore it. Give it the old brush-off of silence now given to Gerald L. K. Smith and Father Coughlin, and first thing you know everybody will be unanimously paying no attention to Henry, and for all practical purposes he will be as dead as a door nail.

Wallace's top line seems to be that he will be the party of peace and prosperity. That means well, but anybody thinking that Wallace has a monopoly on those two scarce commodities is wrong. Peace and prosperity are the two things everybody wants most. The point at issue, however, is how to get them.

Wallace calls for peace with Russia. Everybody is after that, too. At the end of the year, it was thought peace could be had. There seemed to be some indication that the Russians were willing to live and let live, to co-operate in building a new and better world.

constant rebuffs of this nature, the U. S. has no other choice than to look to its defenses.

Wallace calls for the U. N. to plan and administer reconstruction of Europe, as a substitute for Truman doctrine and Marshall plan. This idea was tried before in U. N. R. It didn't work. It was for this reason that the U. S. was led to decide it must act alone.

Furthermore, the Marshall plan is already open to any European nation, not just the 16 nations plus for identifying their intentions to co-operate. Soviet Russia and her seven satellites are welcome. Again, however, it is the USSR that has blocked this union of eastern Europe with the west.

How in the world can Henry Wallace, or anyone else, co-operate under such circumstances? Wallace may be on sounder ground — politically — in his black at high prices. But he is woefully weak on saying what he would do to bring them down. He names no names and he has no real answers.

He is only kidding himself when he says that the U. S. now lives under a one-party rule, and that he aims to create a second party, not a third. His trouble here seems to be that he imagines himself a reincarnation of Thomas Jefferson and Abraham Lincoln.

How else could you explain his references to his new movement as being parallel to creation of the anti-Federalist, Republican-Democratic party of 1800 in Jefferson's time, and the then-new Republican party of 1850 in Lincoln's time?

As a philosopher, Wallace has his value. He represents a point of view that probably needs to be expressed. But as a political leader he

Truck Men in Area Warned On Violations

Pair warning was given to truck drivers and operators Friday by State Police Lieut. A. E. Perkins that state police will practice more rigid enforcement of regulations as they apply to trucks.

Enforcement will come under a five-point program which all state police officers have been advised to follow, he said.

The points to which emphasis will be given are: (1) Signal arms on trucks, (2) lights and reflectors, (3) fuses and fuses, (4) carrying of registration, and (5) gross weight regulations.

All trucks are required by law to have the gross weight which the truck may carry indicated on the cab of the vehicle, Perkins said.

Lack of this notice is indication of poor faith, he added.

For the convenience of all truckers, there are eight weighing stations in Twin Falls, Perkins added.

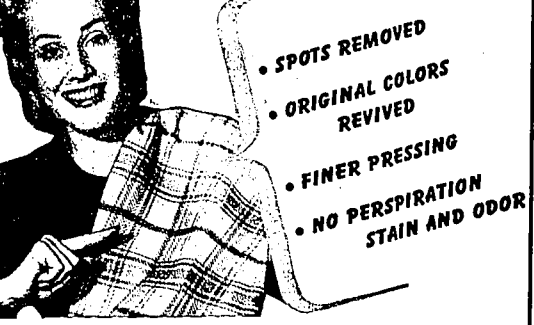

Wallace's Bid Divides Ranks Of CIO Units

WASHINGTON, Jan. 23 (AP)—The CIO split wide open, but only partially today over Henry A. Wallace's bid for a third party bid for the presidency.

The executive board of the labor organization which gave solid support to help elect the late President Roosevelt to a fourth term in 1944 voted 20 to 11 to reject Wallace's entry into the 1948 campaign as a "politically unwise" move.

And the dissident group—representing about 1,500,000 of the organization's claimed 6,000,000 membership—gave every indication of planning for Wallace anyway.

Bridges Leads Dissidents

Harry Bridges, president of the International Longshoremen's union and leader of the so-called left-wing element which opposed the anti-Wallace resolution, told reporters the Democrats would stand the chance of a snub in 1948 if electing President Truman in November.

The CIO chiefs did agree on one thing after their bitter word battle wound up yesterday: The CIO will vote for a resolution condemning the Wallace presidential movement.

But they all will ally together as a labor organization regardless of their political differences.

Some "Wons" Be Hounded

However, Bridges, along with Hugh Bryson, president of the National union of Marine Cooks and Stewards, and Albert Fitzgerald, president of the Bell Electrical Workers union, promptly announced that unions won't be bound by the executive board's opposition to Wallace.

CIO Pres. Philip Murray conceded that the board's action is not binding on CIO unions.

The anti-Wallace resolution did not mention the former cabinet member by name but declared that the party would not stand the split and divide the forces of progress at the very moment when unity is our greatest need.

Boost Sought In Reich Food As Emergency

FRANKFURT, Jan. 23 (AP)—The economic council of the American zone adopted emergency measures to step up German food production tonight during the first phase of a one-day hunger strike by 1,000,000 Bavarians.

The council approved measures calling for a farm-to-farm census of foodstuffs in the Anglo-American zone and offering premiums to farmers exceeding their production quota.

The American and British military governments must approve the proposals of the council before they can be put into effect.

The council met to consider the food situation at the end of a day which had seen union workers picketing groceries in 4,000 stores.

The picket was highlighted by a massed meeting of 30,000 to 100,000 picketing and anti-Nazi workers in Munich, the largest city in the zone.

With the day well along, there were no reports of violence or untoward incidents anywhere in the strike zone.

The strike was completely successful, however.

Munch appeared to be the only city which had a sizeable gathering of strikers. Special communists in Munich, however, were notably Munich where 25 out of a normal 40 were running. Rail officials denied reports of rioting by commuters striving to board cars.

Saturday's Dance Is Polio Benefit

Halsey Blasts Plans to Help Europe, Japs

PHILADELPHIA, Jan. 23 (AP)—Admiral William F. Halsey, wartime commander of the Third fleet, said last night the United States should have to "pay through the nose" for years to come if it plans to revive Europe and Japan economically and to help police the world in future years.

However, that is "better than fighting a third world war," Admiral Halsey told the 47th annual banquet of the alumni association of the Philadelphia textile institute.

He asserted that not only Europe, but Japan also, must be rehabilitated, because "at some future date Japan may be a bulwark between us and future aggression."

Halsey expressed "my best give them a chance to get on their feet. For every dollar we give them we must get a dollar's worth of work in return. It can be done, but we must have a businesslike plan and keep it going on a businesslike basis.

"We can't do the work and we can't provide property and rehabilitation for all the world, but we can do our part."

3 Billions Budget Cut Seen as Top

WASHINGTON, Jan. 23 (AP)—Republican senators indicated today that \$3,000,000,000 may be the top amount they are willing to promise to cut out of President Truman's \$49,000,000,000 budget.

Chairman Taft of Ohio called the senate's GOP policy committee into session to consider the budget. Taft has said he will try to get the bill passed by the end of the month.

A new drug made from fern does the trick, Dr. Morris H. Green of the university of Pennsylvania told the Philadelphia section of the American Chemical society.

The drug is called furcun. Recent research, he said, showed it prevents a great many microorganisms from digesting sugar and releasing substances essential to their nutrition. This interferes with ability to utilize some of the B vitamins.

Furcun is a new derivative of the important industrial chemical formalin. It has been found particularly effective in controlling bacteria infections of skin, explained Dr. Green, by killing or stopping the multiplication of a large variety of bacteria.

Swore to Record

The incident on which the army's statement was based grew out of a story published by the New York Daily News. The story said that "Alvin Karpis," a native of Scotland and former British prisoner, was picked up by MPs in Southampton in 1946 and eventually shipped "home" to the United States as an American soldier.

Your Lease on Life Is Growing Longer; Average Expectancy Has Grown to 65.8

NEW YORK, (NEA)—It may seem like a harder job every day to make ends meet. But at least there is one side dish of comfort in the present gloom. Today's average American has a longer lease on life than ever before in our history in which he may try to perform that economic miracle.

The long-suspected fact that Americans are living longer these days is now official. Life insurance companies have just adopted a newly revised mortality table, and the keepers of the country have set down the average life expectancy at 65.8 years.

That's a gain of 16.8 years in less than a half a century. Statistics say that record has never been approached in man's history and, like Babe Ruth's 60 home runs in one year, may never be broken.

The new mortality table is the first official one in this country since 1928. Its appearance is at least partly due to public relations people, insurance policy holders had been complaining that it was ridiculous to base their premiums on an 80-year-old forecast of life expectancy, and that they were getting ripped.

Actually, the insurance companies have been keeping up with the advance length of life pretty well, even though the 1928 table was only the basic one. They did this by what they call "weighting," that is, they studied various medical and mortality reports, evaluated their own and other companies' experience, and made continuous adjustments which they felt were pretty accurate.

But now the 65.8 figure is on the record book for all to see. One company at least thinks that, with the advance of medical and sanitary science, fulfillment of the Biblical promise of three score and ten isn't too far off. Actuaries, mathematicians and other scientific people, using the new table, have estimated that the average expectancy in Biblical times was only about 23 years.

A lot of people are wondering now what tangible benefits, over and above more life, they are going to get from this prolonged longer life. Among other things, they are wondering about the cost of life insurance.

The insurance people aaved up this nice little heavenly surprise by spring along with another one which is unavoidable but not so pleasant. The rate of earning on life insurance investments—did most other safe investments—has been declining while our life expectancy has been rising. It has gone down from 5.25 per cent in 1928 to 2.92 per cent at present.

A general principle of life insurance companies has been to guarantee the holders of participating policies a dividend of 2 or 3 per cent. But with their present earnings they feel this is unsafe. So, on or before Jan. 1, the great majority of them will scale down the guaranteed rate to 2, 2 1/2, or even 2 per cent.

An insurance statistician offered to try to explain what all this means. He spoke slowly and cautiously and showed a chart which contained the hope that a layman might understand. A lower guaranteed interest rate, he said, would increase premium costs on new policies. At the same time, the new mortality rate, he pointed out, would mean a Net result, not much change. But also emphasized premiums wouldn't be affected on existing policies, although dividends might be a little less on the participating kind.

There is one other change, which has to do with a different way of computing the cash surrender value of life policies. An insurance policy which the statistician pointed

Idaho Feeding Lots Set New High in Cattle

BOISE, Jan. 23 (AP)—There were approximately 80,000 cattle on feed for market in Idaho Jan. 1 compared to 70,000 in feed lots Jan. 1, 1947, and was the largest on record.

Over half of these cattle were in the six stock central counties where feed lots have been expanded. In the southwest the numbers remained about the same as last year and were smaller in the eastern counties. The report was compiled by the bureau of agricultural economics.

Meanwhile the fattening of sheep and lambs for market on Jan. 1 declined seven per cent over the number being fed last year at this time. The report estimated that approximately 123,000 were in feed lots on Jan. 1 of this year the smallest number for any year dating back to 1926.

The number is somewhat larger than had been expected, the bureau said, since the December export to market was smaller than expected.

The number fed in the six stock central counties was about the same as last year, with reductions reported in both southwestern and eastern counties.

EXPECT HIGH MEAT PRICES
DENVER, Jan. 23 (AP)—Cattle feeders plotted their bets on continued high meat prices. They expected some \$1,500,000 worth of feeder cattle at the National Western stock show to fall for sale next fall.

Two hundred carloads—some 10,000 animals—were sold, and the first 93 loads, those offered for show judging, brought an average of \$33.3 a hundredweight. The price compares with current Denver market prices of from \$27 to \$32 a hundredweight.

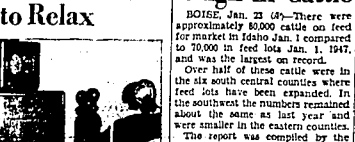
