Cold Hits Vast Area Of Nation

Winter lashed out with its hardest climatic punches in the central, eastern and southern sections of the nation Saturday, striking with cold, zero cold, blizzards and sleet. The triple assault of cold, snow and ice battered the south. The mercury dropped to five below at the Vicksburg, Miss., airport. Snow fell in New Orleans, La., and at Columbus, Ga., 25 miles from the Gulf of Mexico. Ice films slicked most highways. A blanket of snow covered the northern part of the region, extending into Mississippi, Alabama and Georgia. Temperatures fell to zero or near zero at Kentucky southward to central Alabama, Mississippi and Georgia.

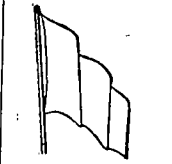

Pair of Plaintiffs Win Payments in Cases for Debts

In two civil actions filed against Bev Marshall, the plaintiffs in both cases were awarded judgments Friday totaling \$121.14 plus six per cent interest.
 Glen Buckendorf received a judgment for \$121.14 by District Judge James W. Porter. The money was for alleged debts owed Buckendorf's former sister-in-law, Marshall. The debts were alleged to have accrued between March 20 and Oct. 10, 1944. Buckendorf, at the time, was in the United States Army.
 The Bull Impstone company, also represented by Dobbie, was awarded a judgment for \$90 and attorney fees of \$30. According to the complaint, the company's complaint, Marshall owed the company the money on a promissory note, the statement of which was made in a month beginning last April but that Marshall had failed to make any of the payments.
 Marshall did not appear in court and was ruled in default by Judge Porter.

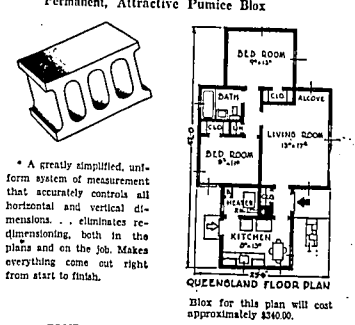

Home in Iraq will be somewhat like Magic Valley, for the climate is about the same. Baghdad is located in a valley on the banks of the Tigris river almost like Idaho Snake river. Mrs. Schill said they are sending household furnishings, including pictures and books, to make winter dwelling they find more homelike.

Since 90 per cent of the hospital's patients will be native Arabs, Dr. Schill will be expected to learn Arabic. At first interviews he will be employed to aid in diagnosis and treatment, Dr. Schill said.

There is no reason to believe that conditions will be primitive, because Baghdad is the capital of the country with a population of 300,000 and has a modern airport and railway network. He added Mrs. Schill said she was looking forward to seeing the trolley cars that constitute the Iraq's transportation.

The form of government in Iraq is comparable to the British system employed in the dominions and commonwealths of that nation, according to Dr. Schill. He called it a semi-democracy.

Both Dr. Schill and his wife expect to meet some Americans in Iraq, for many United States oil companies have interests there.

Dr. Schill said he doesn't know how long he will stay in Iraq, but he is interested to return to Twin Falls eventually. He came here six years ago and was one of the founders of the Medical Arts Building. While he is away his practice will be continued by Dr. Harold L. Stowe and Dr. Malcolm Sawyer.

WASHINGTON, Jan. 24 (AP)—Petroleum industry leaders warned today that a massive fuel oil shortage next summer may be the price the nation will have to pay for getting enough heating oil this winter.

The National Petroleum Council has recommended that the industry sacrifice gasoline production to increased fuel oil output for 40 days, and dig into crude oil inventories that might have gone for gasoline stockpiles.

Creating Gas Shortage
The 45-member industry advisory committee said today it recognized the recommendations as creating future shortages of gasoline.

But the council believes "it is in the public interest to meet a greater effort toward meeting home heating requirements rather than meeting gasoline requirements."

In interests of equitable distribution, the council also asked that household and industrial consumers limit their fuel on hand to a two-week supply and that even shortage areas take no more than a 30-day supply.

Longer Loading Urged
To help emergency areas and relieve transportation bottlenecks, the council proposed a seven-day work week for tank car loading crews for the next two months.

Meanwhile, Secretary of Interior Krug said he believes price and rationing controls will have to be slapped on oil next winter. It's too late to do it this year, he told a congressional committee.

The petroleum council joined Krug in urging a 10 per cent reduction in fuel oil and gasoline consumption, and a temporary end to conversions from coal to oil heat. When other types of heat are available, the council said, homeowners should use them.

GOP's Eyeing Idaho on List Of Key States

By LYLE C. WILSON
UP Political Analyst
WASHINGTON, Jan. 24.—Regard for the Republican ticket the Republicans today are looking to 13 big and little states for the additional electoral votes they need to elect President Truman next November.

These states are: Connecticut, Idaho, Illinois, Maryland, Massachusetts, Michigan, Minnesota, Missouri, New Hampshire, New Jersey, New York, Oregon, and Pennsylvania.

All not needed. The GOP doesn't need all of them to win if it can also hold all the 12 states carried four years ago by Gov. Thomas E. Dewey of New York. Maybe the Republicans won't win any of the additional 12, but that some of them will go Republican this year seems at least very likely.

All but 13 states were carried by the late Franklin D. Roosevelt in 1944 and each went Democratic by a margin of three per cent or less of the major party vote. Practical politicians play percentages.

California Target

Where your opponent secured a narrow margin of victory last time is where you have the better chance to lick him next time if things go well. That is why those 13 states are especially important. Republicans look hungrily at other states, too, notably California.

Dewey carried the following states in 1944: Wyoming, Colorado, North Dakota, South Dakota, Nebraska, Kansas, Iowa, Wisconsin, Indiana, Ohio, Vermont and Maine. They got 119 electoral votes to 422 for FDR. The 13 states which went Democratic four years ago by three per cent or less took 217 electoral votes which, with Dewey's, would add up to 316. A bare majority of the electoral college sufficient for election is 266 electoral votes.

FDR Tallies Given

Roosevelt's first three trips at the White House came out this way: 472 electoral votes to 59 for Hoover; 623 to 8 for Landon; 449 to 62 for Willkie. Much more significant were popular vote figures:

1932 Roosevelt	22,900,000
Hoover	16,700,000
1936 Roosevelt	27,400,000
Landon	16,900,000
1940 Roosevelt	27,200,000
Willkie	22,300,000
1944 Roosevelt	25,500,000
Dewey	22,000,000

The electoral vote division does not reflect it, but Willkie ran a good race and so did Dewey. Roosevelt had a plurality of a little better than 500,000 of the 47,500,000 votes cast for the two major party candidates in 1944.
