Taylor Views Possibility of Vote Victory

NEW YORK, Feb. 26 (AP)—Sen. Glen H. Taylor of Idaho, a candidate for vice president, today was convinced that all a third party could do would be to elect a Republican. "I would never have joined the movement," Taylor made the statement at a news conference yesterday.

Taylor said the statement at a news conference yesterday was to a question whether he believes the campaign of White House aspirant Henry A. Wallace and himself might result in the election of a GOP president.

Predicts Fall Ballot
He predicted the vote will be on the ballot in all but two or three states in November, and will carry enough to win.

Chances that the third party group would join the Democratic party are "too remote to be discussed," Taylor said.

"I would like to see the Democratic party disintegrate so that we could have a real alignment of liberals and conservatives in this country," said Taylor, who was elected to the senate as a Democrat.

Peace Top Issue
Taylor said "the necessity of having peace in the world" is the most important issue in the 1948 campaign.

The news conference was held at headquarters of the Wallace-for-President committee and was opened formally in a Park avenue building.

Several hundred followers greeted Wallace and Taylor at the headquarters last night. The two candidates and their wives shook hands with the visitors.

Czechoslovakia's absorption is one of Moscow's greatest successes. At the London News Chronical, published out a few hours before the coup was achieved, if the communists gained complete control in Czechoslovakia, it would be their most important victory in Europe.

President Beneš, right hand to the late Dr. Thomas Masaryk, who was father of the republic, finally was compelled to capitulate to communist demands and turn the government over to red control.

What could be going on behind that iron curtain? We have a right to speculate on that because of the liquidation and other horrors experienced in Poland, Bulgaria, Hungary and elsewhere. It's fair to ask whether a "house cleaning" is proposed.

Italy Watches Czech 'Coup,' Fears Future

There are parallels and differences between Italy and Czechoslovakia affecting the communist chances of dominating Italy, but the moderate leaders know it could happen here.

Observers assessing the difference were confronted by the observation that perhaps the socialist-communist pact here is stronger than was believed.

Widened with the socialist, the communists polled 39 per cent of the popular vote in 1946. They have increased their strength since and openly proclaim they will get from 45 to 51 per cent in the next election.

Idaho Loaded With Streams Named 'Bear'

BOISE, Feb. 26 (AP)—Where is Bear creek? Answers of 53 answers would be correct, without going outside the boundaries of Idaho.

A survey by the state fish and game department, which has catalogued Idaho streams, shows Bear creek the most common title.

There is more than one Bear creek for each of Idaho's 44 counties. Some waterheds have two or three. The count does not include an assortment of Urinus, Cubs and Orinals.

There are 47 Deer creeks—exclusive of Bucks, Does and Fawns used to name creeks scattered throughout the mountains.

There are 34 Elk and Pine creeks, 25 Sheep creeks and Cottonwood appears on the map 31 times.

Compiled by Biologists The roster was compiled by Forrest Hauck and Tim Vaughan, fisheries biologists, as the groundwork for a comprehensive fish planting program.

They estimate, conservatively they said, that some 6,500 Idaho streams provide 12,000 miles of fishing water, allowing only the Snake and Salmon. The total does not include such major rivers as the Snake with 700 miles and the Salmon with 300 miles.

Stream catalogue will be used in determining how many and what kind of fish to stock in the stream network. The department will plant about 15 million trout from 17 hatcheries this year.

Last year 54 tons of fish were planted and the total is expected to increase when the Hagerman hatchery goes into production.

Wildlife Not Only Sponsor Wildlife was not the only sponsor of Idaho creek names.

For example, there is Our My and Disappointment creek within a comparatively small area of the Salmon drainage. Others are Tom and Cherry on the Salmon.

Whiskey creek is followed by Soda creek on the Bear river watershed. Foker and Chip creek bubble down to the Salmon.

There is Olveston spring, Horsethief creek, Blue creek, Carcass creeks, Diagrass, Sixteen-to-One, No Business, Calamity and Robert E. Lee.

Opportunity remains. In several watersheds there are neglected streams, indicated on maps only by the prosaic "no name cr."

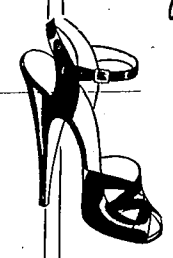

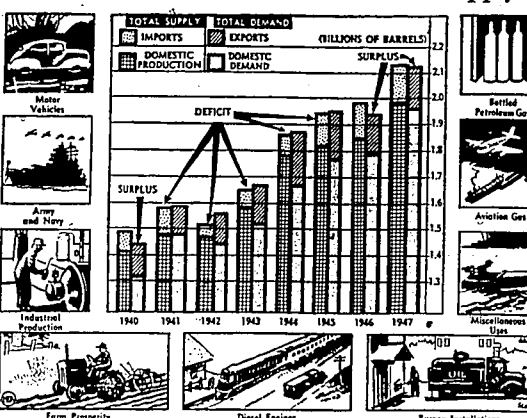

Analyst Avers U. S. Backing Down on Split

Despite official statements to the contrary, the United States appears to be doing a definite backdown on the partition of Palestine.

Too late to get odds at Lake Mead, because that there will be no partitioning now. So far as I can learn, the line drawn by the U. S. between keeping order and enforcing partition just didn't go over. It was accepted as one observer put it, as an effort to "get off the hook" with the Arabs, justification among the Arabs and dismay among the Jews makes it clear that that's the way they took it too.

The Assis speech, of course, is subject to many interpretations. So many interpretations, as a matter of fact, that it may have accomplished a definite purpose. Under it, the United States seems fairly free from the definite commitments which went along with her original pressure for partition.

World Envoys Partitions

If the U. N. should decide to send a peace-making force to Palestine the effect would be the same as enforcing partition and the Arabs know it. If their refusal is acquiesced the establishment of a Jewish state can proceed, regardless of what you call the force.

The chance that any force will be sent seems small.

Russia is in a position to support it with plain words about the necessity of maintaining the prestige of the United Nations and to profit by having her own troops participate.

But Britain has been opposed to the partitioning idea all along, has been seriously embarrassed in her strategic arrangements with the Arabs because of her connection with the United States, and has had a perfectly good reason for washing her hands completely.

Chaim Weizel Comes Around

Chaim Weizel, president of the Jewish Agency, has been talking on the partition decision at the time. If the U. S. put on a real drive to implement it, the Chaim Weizel might have to come around. But they are eager to believe that the U. S. pressure is ended.

France is having Arab troubles, is threatened with revolt on North Africa, and is remembering her own experiences in Syria and Lebanon. Top level French authorities have said privately that France would never send any troops to Palestine.

It is noticeable that the question of the President's authority to send troops without congressional approval was raised in administrative, not congressional, circles. Whether or not he was so intended, this would serve the purpose of opening even more loopholes than were contained in the Assis speech.

Negotiations Suggested

Just what will happen next is a poor. Colombia has made a formal move to recall the general assembly for a new start. The United States suggests negotiations between the big five and Jews and Arabs, despite Arab insistence that there will be no compromise.

It was at this hush-hush session among the east Idaho Democrats that the senator was soundly criticized for his stand on foreign affairs.

The party leaders asserted the senator's persistent attacks on Truman's foreign policy were detrimental to the interests of the state Democratic party.

The Idaho Falls meeting brought immediate repercussions. It is known that Taylor through friends made a thorough inquiry into the session. Ida P. Masters, Boise, former Democratic secretary of state, also verbally rapped the knuckles of the leaders, singling out Arnold Williams, St. Anthony former governor, and P. M. Blaine, Pocatello, Democratic national committeeman, both are prominently mentioned as senatorial candidates to oppose Sen. Henry Dworshak this year.

Taylor's bolt of the Democratic party was viewed by a majority of east Idaho Democratic leaders as "proof of defiance," but some at least were inclined to the realization that his loss may hurt party chances.

Solon Urging GI Insurance Free for Vets

WASHINGTON, Feb. 24 (AP)—Free life insurance for the armed services and all war veterans is proposed by Representative Shafter, R. Mich.

"I think the government could save money that way," he told a reporter yesterday. "It would be cheaper to give them the insurance than to pay out what it costs us to collect the premiums."

Shafter said the joint army-navy personnel board already has approved the principle of free insurance for men and women on active military duty.

Prompt Action Seen

He said the secretaries of the army and navy are expected to submit recommendations on the matter soon to the house armed services committee. Shafter said his subcommittee will take prompt action on the proposal.

Under Shafter's plan, the government would give a \$10,000 life insurance policy to every man or woman going on active duty in the armed services.

Pays Difference

On leaving active duty, the veteran would be given a loan of \$10,000. He could keep the full \$10,000 in force by paying premiums on the difference between that figure and whatever lower figure eventually is set for the free veterans' insurance. Veterans now holding national service life insurance would be given their full policies and would quit paying premiums.

Crippled Children Fund Push Slated

BOISE, Feb. 26 (AP)—The eighth annual drive for funds to help the 3,144 crippled children in Idaho will begin Feb. 28. T. H. Wegener of Boise, president of the Idaho Society for Crippled Children, said today.

The drive will close on March 28, Easter Sunday.

Wegener said 75,000 letters and Easter seals will be mailed to Idaho people to provide money for better care and greater opportunities for these children.

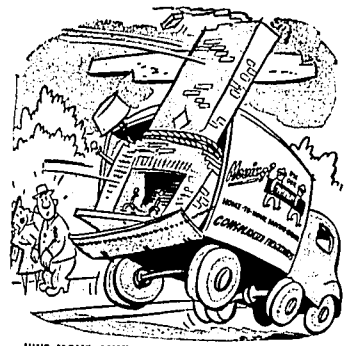

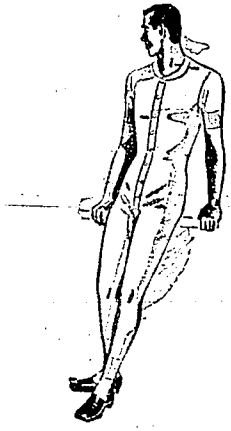

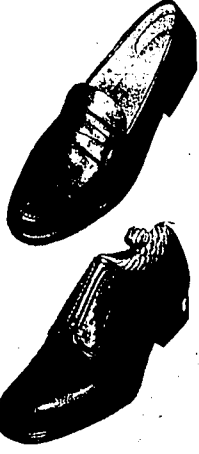
