College Choir Is Lauded for City Program

Under the direction of Professor Clyde Keuter, the Adolphus concert choir from the College of Puget Sound, Tacoma, Wash., presented a well-organized and interesting program Monday evening.

Singing to a Twin Falls area audience in the Methodist church, the choir delighted the group with short, rhythmic selections that expressed types of folk music: American folk music and songs of worship were the highlights of the concert.

Professor Keuter skillfully directed the concert that ranged from religious numbers like "Surely He Hates Worms Our Grief," "The Souls of the Righteous," "Glorious and Loud" and "The Italian Street Song" by Victor Herbert.

Instead of the customary choir robes, the girls of the group wore white blouses and dark trousers. There were many comments about the incognito background that the white clothing furnished for the recital.

Particularly effective were the American songs of worship: "When Jesus Wept," "The Humble Heart," "Poor Wayfaring Stranger" and "The Good Tree Song."

The group of American folk tunes included "The Lonesome Dove," "The Dixie Servant," "In the Early Spring" and "Cindy." The last selection with its rousing tune and spirited clapping of hands was well received.

Spirituels Well Received

Unusual treatment was given a group of Negro spirituals by the campus trio, a group of three girls. They sang "Little David Play on Your Harp," "Were You There?" and "So's I Can Write My Name."

Featured in the last group of numbers was "The Song of the Resister" by Tchaikovsky and the familiar "The Holy City." The Tchaikovsky selection was marked by harmonious blending of the intricate vocal passages of the song.

Two short selections that brought smiles to the audience were "We and Chant II" and "Fretless," a Russian folk song.

Variety at Conclusion

"Staccato Suite," a Latvian folk song, brought variety to the concluding numbers.

The concert ended on a colorful note with "The Italian Street Song" from the Victor Herbert opera "Nobility." "Oklahoma" was presented as an encore.

Monday night's performance was the ninth appearance for the choir which has a scheduled tour of 15 cities.

During intermission, the Rev. Albert B. Barrett, pastor of the Methodist church, praised the group's singing and presented a short talk about their concert tour.

China to Seek U. S. Action in Reynolds Hop

NANKING, April 6 (AP)—The Chinese government will ask the U. S. civil aeronautics board to take action against Millionaire Milton Reynolds for alleged violation of Chinese law in his break through from Shanghai. It was disclosed today.

A formal request that Reynolds be punished will be forwarded to the United States government, a spokesman for the Chinese civil aviation bureau said.

The spokesman added that a Chinese government message requesting that Reynolds be detained in Tokyo apparently had reached military headquarters at the manufacturer and already taken off for Honolulu.

Reynolds, Pilot William C. Odom and the crew of the converted bomber "Explosive" landed at Honolulu last night. Reynolds' presence in Shanghai administered stingy editorial reprimand, inactivity, to Reynolds, whose expedition to chart the Amoy Machin mountains was called off in a flurry of controversy.

"If we were defending him in court, we would plead temporary insanity," the American consul in Shanghai Fearing Post and Mercury said. The British-owned North China Daily News also called Reynolds' kind in its analysis of what it called Reynolds' "unpredictable antics."

Reynolds was allowed to enter Honolulu today after U. S. immigration officers decided he could land on American soil without a passport. He had secured a passport to Chinese airport officials in Shanghai Sunday.

The spokesman said he would remain in Hawaii for a week with his wife and daughter.

Terms Commuted On Draft Charge

HOUSTON, April 6 (AP)—Federal Judge C. A. Clark has commuted sentences of two men charged with violation of the selective service act. Sentences of Wesley William Cox and Theodore R. Thompson were reduced to 40 days, all of which has been served already at the federal prison on McNeil Island.

In their motions for reduction in sentences, Cox and Thompson said they were members of a religious organization and had conscientious objection to the draft. The conviction in the federal district court, eastern district, was upheld by the circuit court of appeals and U. S. supreme court.

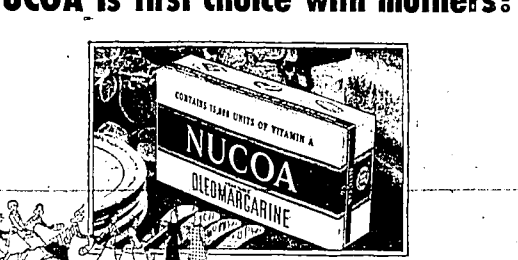

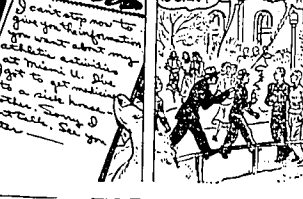

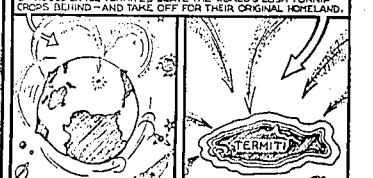

"It was very much impressed by the attention given the program of Christian education in the Twin Falls area, and the educational facilities for the congregations are outstanding," Dr. Arthur L. Miller, St. Louis, Mo., executive secretary of the board for parish education of the Lutheran church, said Monday evening.

"In this particular area plans for expansion are such that the congregation will soon have one of the finest educational plans in the country," he continued.

Adults Also Interested

"The adult education program is receiving attention here too. With a membership of 122 one may see that Christian education is not merely something for children, but something the adults are actively interested in," he explained.

Dr. Miller addressed a large crowd in the Emmanuel Lutheran church and outlined a three-point program for educational participation of the lay group. First inventory, a check of weak spots in the present program and participation of lay members in education; second, planning work with pastors and teachers in correcting weak spots; and third, action, putting it to the plans arranged to build the complete program.

Statistics Presented

Concluding his address he presented statistics concerning Lutheran schools and said the Lutheran church has 1,000 elementary schools with an enrollment of 70,000 and 4,000 Sunday schools with an enrollment of 310,000.

Introducing the speaker was Irvin Ehlers, Twin Falls, president of the Lutheran Laymen's league, and discussion leader for the evening was Melvin Opplinger, Buhl, secretary of the Lutheran Laymen's league.

On a tour of the church, Dr. Miller plans to speak in Pocatello, Salt Lake City, Utah, and Denver, Colo.

Mining Group Asks Passage For Subsidies

HALLEY, April 6 — Herbert M. Fay, Salt Lake City, Utah, speaking before a special meeting of the Halley Chamber of Commerce Monday, outlined the advantage of the Russell bill, national mineral development and conservation act of 1947.

Fay is in southern Idaho working with mine owners in an attempt to get the proposed bill passed by the 80th congress. If passed, the bill would return federal premium payments paid mine owners before June 30, 1947.

Joe Eijerman, Bellevue, mine executive, pointed out 90 percent of natural resources in the Wood River valley are minerals, mostly lead, silver and zinc.

He pointed out that under the Russell bill, stockpiles of mineral would be made for government use. Eijerman said the nation's stockpile is low in copper, lead, zinc and manganese. Under the proposed bill small operators would be encouraged to open mines and build up stockpiles for industrial use and in case of a national emergency.

It was announced that the Central Idaho Mining association convention will be held in Halley April 24. Guests at the meeting besides Fay and Eijerman included H. L. Wallington and George Rice, Ketchum, and Harry P. Jayne, Twin Falls.

The speakers were introduced by William New, former chamber executive secretary. Harry Purlier, past chamber president, presided at the meeting.
