### Electric Brain Of Army Falls Behind on Job

ABERDEEN, Md., April 21 (AP)—The army's electronic "brain" running on mathematical problems connected with push-button warfare, are getting farther and farther behind on their job, officials disclosed today.

One difficulty is that ENIAC, a computer device which affords men electronic headaches. These occur each time one of its 19,000 tubes blows out.

(ENIAC stands for electronic numerical integrator and computer.)

Short of Personnel

Other difficulties are caused by lack of sufficient personnel to keep the mathematical computers and the super-sonic wind tunnels at the army proving ground here busy 24 hours a day.

ENIAC and the other electronic and mechanical computing devices are working on problems of atomic, guided missiles, and pilotless craft that may be used in warfare of the future.

The computers solve mathematical problems thousands of times faster than the human mind.

Part-Time Idle

Col. L. E. Simon, director of the ballistic research laboratories, told reporters ENIAC is operating only two shifts a day instead of three and the wind tunnel is operating only one shift.

He estimated ENIAC is about two years behind in its military work and the wind tunnel has enough work scheduled to keep it busy for six months.

Despite handicaps, the army is well along in some of its research.

L. A. Delozzo, guided missiles expert, said 30 German V-2 rockets were fired at White Sands, N. M., and virtually all the basic research information needed for constructing greatly improved missiles has been obtained. He said another 20 rockets will be fired with instruments attached for gathering scientific information at high altitudes.

Delozzo reiterated that "theoretically it is possible to fire missiles around the world, on the basis of information we now have." But he added that the cost of constructing such a network would prohibit their use in warfare.

### Expert Sights 5-Hour Flight Spanning U.S.

NEW YORK, April 21 (AP)—A prediction that air liners will fly coast-to-coast in five hours within three years and possibly in one or two hours by 1950 was made today by an aircraft engineering expert.

The transports of the future will be propelled by rockets or jet engines, Dr. Robert E. Hege said, and will fly at altitudes of about 60,000 miles.

Hege, formerly military director of the aerodynamics branch of the aircraft laboratory at Wright Field, Dayton, O., made his predictions in a book, "Jet Propulsion in Commercial Air Transportation," published by Princeton university press. He is now connected with the Boeing Aircraft company.

### Water Dearth In Southwest Is Probability

WASHINGTON, April 21 (AP)—Severe water shortages during the 1948 crop season were forecast today for California, Arizona and Nevada. The agriculture department's spring forecast said April snow in California would bring the state's water supplies up to last year's.

"But the state is still faced with a short water year," a soil conservation service bulletin said.

In Arizona, snow-stored water was as high as it ever had been but "it is not enough to overcome the critically low storage in practically all reservoirs," the department said. Sierra run-offs will be 25 to 50 per cent of normal in Nevada with reservoir storage only about 55 per cent of usable capacity. Lake Mead holds about 115 per cent of 1947 storage, the bulletin said.

It forecast good to exceptional water supplies for Colorado, Idaho, Montana, New Mexico, Oregon, South Dakota, Utah, Washington and Wyoming.

The department said that although poor water conditions would beget much of California this year the state's outlook "has eased somewhat by April." Only six and one or two other reservoirs held more water than they did last year.

### Last Year's Spud Crop About Gone

BOISE, April 21 (AP)—Robert W. Wilcox, extension economist for the University of Idaho, reports the 1947 Idaho potato crop is about gone.

Wilcox said today there were not more than 1,000 cwt of Idaho potatoes left to be shipped after April 10. He said Idaho had shipped 26,698 cars by that date.

He said the 1947 shipment was only about three-fourths of 1946 when 25,700 cars were shipped.

"This helps explain why Idaho growers have had high prices for their potatoes while others, particularly in Maine, have had to make use of the government purchase program," Wilcox said.

### Congressmen Act on Soviet Right to Veto

By DEWITT MACKENZIE  
AP Foreign Affairs Analyst

There are 11 U. S. congressmen 11 bills, which in one way or another, are calculated to deal with the abuse of the veto power which by Russia has been exercising since the United States.

All these proposals are for a revision of the U. N. charter. However, at least a couple of them are so framed that the present majority could be allowed to rumble along while the anti-Soviet democrats form a new organization free of Soviet interference.

These bills are concrete evidence of a strong sentiment for some action against the notorious use of the veto. Moreover, by the U. N. membership itself we find Australia—a big opponent of the veto—and Argentina leading a group of small nations to revise the charter in this respect.

The veto right is accorded the big five—America, Russia, Britain, France and China—in the security council, which alone can impose sanctions. Thus for the MacArthur big opponent of the veto—and Argentina leading a group of small nations to revise the charter in this respect.

Revision of the veto provision would, of course, be a ticklish undertaking. The United States insisted on establishment of the veto as a protection against impingement on sovereignty, and there has been no sign that the Washington standard would agree to elimination.

However, America has indicated that it would like to discuss the veto except for fundamental treaty-making sovereignty. Russia naturally wants to retain it in toto, and in fact undoubtedly will employ it against charter revision.

### Plan Dropped on Road Over Dam

WASHINGTON, April 21 (AP)—The government has dropped plans to build a highway on top of the New Dam across the Columbia river between Washington and Oregon.

Senator Gordon R. Day, said today.

He told a reporter the action was taken after engineers had approved the public route and approved the highway would cost approximately \$5,000,000. A bridge between the dam, he said, would cost only \$2,000,000.
