Indians Fire Verbal Charges Straight as Brave's Arrows

By HARMAN W. NICHOLS United Press Staff Correspondent WASHINGTON, April 30 (UP)—The red man talked right up to the white man in the Indian trial.

The Indian didn't gum his syllables. He went straight as an arrow to the point.

Flanking the walls of the house public relations committee room a number of oil paintings of Indians. One showed a brave talking to his people.

The judge adjusted his bifocals, smoothed the lapels of his attorney's suit and sent the judge his reply. He was appearing before the committee on a bill that would give the Indians title to their lands and mineral deposits on the Choctaw and Chickasaw Indians of Oklahoma.

McCurtain is a fine Indian orator, and used to be a district judge before he became a senator. He has no previous speeches. His staff came from the heart; well delivered, at that.

The problem among the Choctaw and Chickasaw, he explained, was that white men on the committee, is complicated. But he would explain it. And if the gentlemen would pardon him, he said, the white man hadn't been exactly fair.

In the first place the land, of course, had belonged to the Indians. President Tyler, back in 1842, bought in and ceded the rest with the Choctaw. It took the land but gave the Indians a place to live, Juniper, fish, without being paid for it.

The government would put the land up for public sale—land with water, coal and asphalt underneath. The Indians didn't know about the coal and asphalt, but they did know about the land.

The present bill calls for selling 170,000 acres of land with coal and asphalt underneath, back to the government for \$4,800,000.

"That" said the judge, "isn't enough, but it's fair enough. We want to get off the hook and go out business. It's not costing us money to keep it up and we don't even live there."

### Bevin Accents Tenseness for Palestine Deal

The gravity of the Palestine situation is emphasized by a British emphatic reaffirmation, delivered in Foreign Secretary Bevin's blunt language, that it is determined to withdraw from the holy land and to be replaced by May 15.

This emphatic reaffirmation is held in United Nations circles that Britain might be persuaded to conclude the more optimistic deal which has been kept in mind that last October Britain said she would be prepared, under certain conditions, to continue administration of Palestine until independence was achieved if the Jews and Arabs settled their differences.

"But there has been no agreement between the Jews and the Arabs and, therefore, without a British administrative personnel has begun and is proceeding rapidly and will continue to the process at this late hour."

This position is grim, since Arab and Jew are determined to fight for battle which seemingly will happen unless there is armed intervention from outside or unless a truce can be arranged. 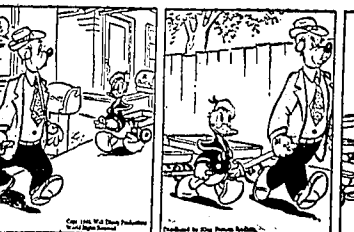

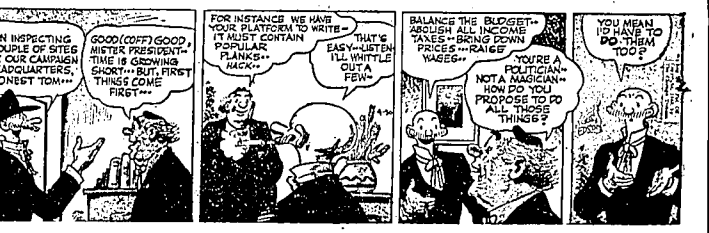
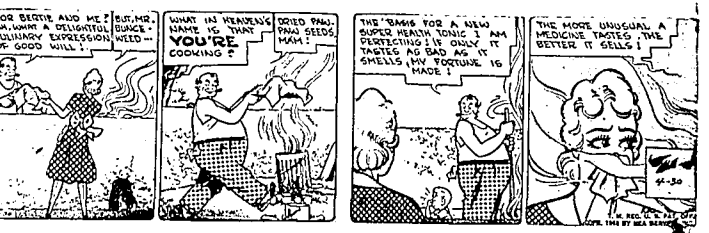

Hill at Last Stops 'Walk' In Pittsburgh

PITTSBURGH, April 30 (AP)—The hill that "took a walk" has quit walking for the present—but hardier neighborhood folk are keeping their fingers crossed.

Two weeks ago a hillside 300 feet wide and 100 feet high at about 100 tons started slipping precipitously toward the Allegheny river 60 yards away.

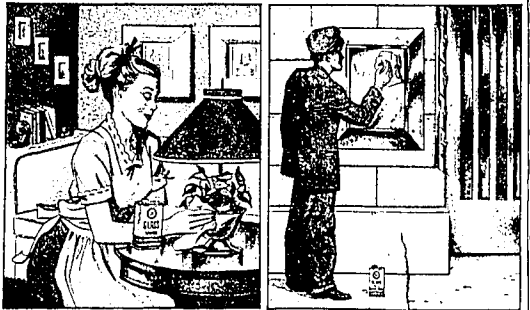
