Union Hints Okay of Packers' Pay Offers

CHICAGO, May 3 (UP)—President Ralph Helstein of the CIO Union Packinghouse Workers said today the union would "consider" settling the nationwide meat strike for a nine-cent hourly raise, if the packers would agree to cut meat prices.

The packers offered nine cents before the strike began eight weeks ago, and have refused to raise the offer. The union had demanded a 29-cent hourly raise.

2-Year Draft Gains House Panel

WASHINGTON, May 3 (AP)—The House armed services committee today approved 23 to 5 a two-year draft bill for men 19 through 25.

Take Parents' Place
Superintendent Arthur Donnell, in a formal statement, said "The teacher stands in the place of the parent towards pupils during school hours."

In other words, what works in the woodshed also works in the school room.

"The superintendent and his staff will support principal and teachers in all reasonable disciplinary measures," Donnell added.

This and Deputy Superintendent Herman J. Brown, includes spanking.

In recent weeks the subject of school discipline has received prominence in Michigan because of parental complaints and court action.

"We do not advocate corporal punishment," Brown went on. "It may be used within local and reasonable bounds and in such use the teachers have the support of the administration. On occasion, just as in the home, it may be a good solution."

Dr. Eugene D. Elliott, state superintendent of public instruction, was inclined to agree.

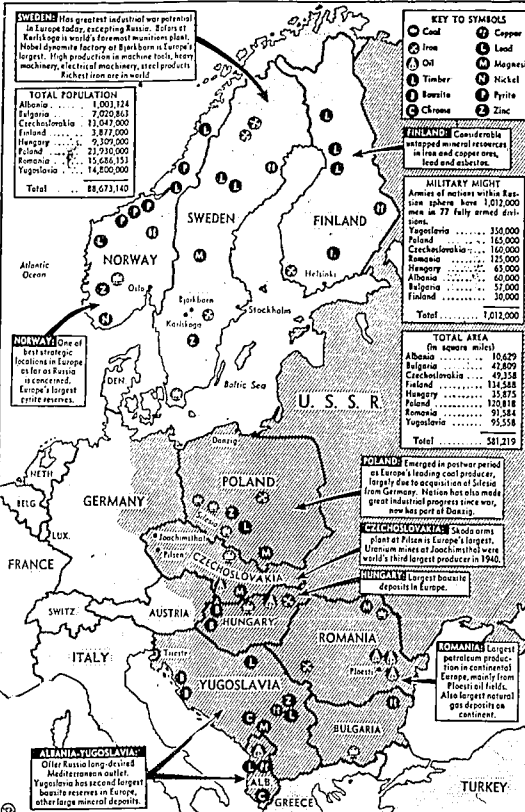
Hughes could recently be seen convinced an independent producer could not compete on favorable footing with the major.

CHICAGO, May 3 (AP)—A tieup of U. S. rails would be felt quickly from coast to coast.

If three key railroad unions go out at 6 a. m. May 11 and all train stop, you soon would begin to feel the effects. You would see the first results on your table and in your mail box.
