### Horses Eating Too Much of Public's Grass

WASHINGTON, May 6 (AP)—Horses are eating more than their share of the public grass out west, the interior department was advised today.

Elmer H. Hughes, Montrose, Colo., and J. C. Cecil, Santez, Ore., were among members of the department's grazing advisory council warning hungry horses of consuming federal grazing that should go into production of meat, hides and wool.

There is a great deal of unutilized grazing by sheep, cattle and goats, they said.

But they said the unutilized horseplay is so great—possibly because horses can get in and out of grazing areas more quickly than any other animals—that it is "almost a breakdown down enforcement of the Taylor grazing act."

Marion Clawson, director of interior's bureau of land management, told the stockmen representing the grazing district advisory boards of the 10 western states:

"We want to find out how much trespass there is on the grazing districts."

"There may be a great deal, in view of budget limitations and the shortage of grazing personnel for the past four or five years."

"We are going to use every legal means to bring that trespass down to zero."

J. Will Robinson, grazing chief, added that if bureau appropriations are sufficiently increased stockmen may look for more vigorous enforcement of grazing regulations.

### Death of Man With No Heirs Bothers State

BOISE, May 6 (AP)—When someone dies without leaving a will or heirs the state must take over the estate. But it may not be an unmitigated blessing. Take the case of the late John Joyce, route 4, Boise.

Joyce died about a year ago leaving 10 acres of good farming land, \$1,000 in cash and \$200 in face value bonds. There were no heirs, no will.

The undertaker finally got tired waiting for his money and started the ball rolling to have the estate probated. Advertisements were sent out for creditors to appear and the other steps taken.

Finally Ada county probate court ruled in late March that the estate should "revert" to the state of Idaho.

Ordinarily, the state and department would go ahead and sell the land, put the money in the school income fund and forget about it. But in this case a complicating factor was discovered.

It seems that Joyce had taken pity on an elderly man in financial difficulty. Joyce gave him a perpetual lease on two acres of the 10-acre tract. The two acres fronted on the right. The old man is living on the land now. The state didn't feel it should move him off and it can't sell the other eight acres without taking a loss.

So it finally leased the eight acres to an adjoining neighbor. Meanwhile, the state must keep separate records of everything paid out in keeping up the acreage, including deed control, etc.

But eventually it hopes to sell the land and close out the account.

### Veterans Find It Tougher to Get GI Loans

WASHINGTON, May 6 (AP)—Long-faced home-hunting veterans are finding that they can't get home loans from banks and building and loan companies as easily as they once did.

One Washington ex-serviceman, armed with veterans administration-approved plans and specifications for a new house he wanted to build on a lot he owned, asked 13 building agencies for a \$10,000 government-insured loan. He never got it. Many veterans are getting the so-called GI loans, but the number drops each month. In January it was about 36,000; in February, 33,000, and in March only 29,000.

In the vast home financing program provided for veterans in the GI bill of rights coming to a halt? If so, why? Government officials answer the first question with "no." They say the recent decline in the number of loans is partly seasonal, that business will pick up in the early summer.

Some states have laws which set definite limits on the amount of investing banks can do in any particular field. Some banks, especially on the west coast, are loaned as much money for real estate and homes as the law allows. 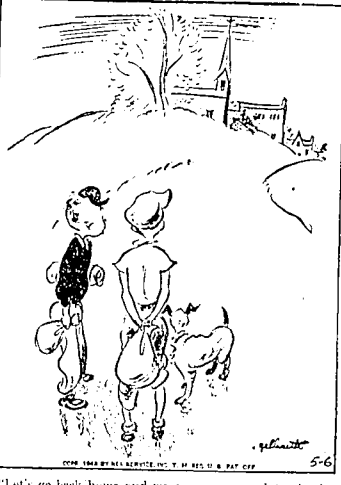

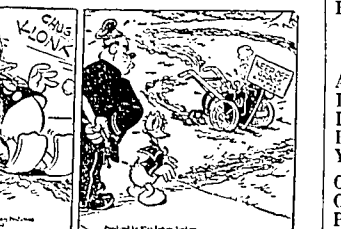

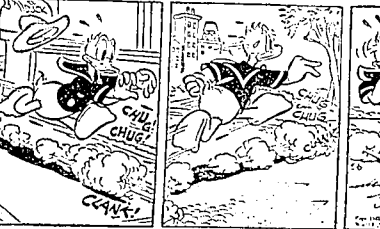

# U.N. Attitude Change Idea Of Marshall

By J. M. HUBBERTS

Secretary Marshall makes a strong point of the fact that it is a revision of the U. N. charter, not a revision of rules and regulations, which is necessary if peaceful cooperation is to be achieved.

He is combating the efforts of an important group of congressmen who want to force a revision of the U. N. charter, particularly with regard to the veto. They want an organization which can improve the will of the majority on a revolutionary nation, which for some time through the use of such casual phrases as "revolving with or without Russian agreement" the impression seems to have gotten abroad that if successful, they would have to substitute a new organization exclusive of the Russian bloc.

As yet it, however, what they actually propose is to tell Russia that if she continues to refuse to let the United Nations function, the other nations will go ahead with the organization, but in contravention of the organization's will.

One idea seems to be that, faced with the prospect of a world event determined to carry out the idea of the veto, Russia will decide to give the action within the U. N. and agree to revision.

The congressmen think they are keeping their proposal within the limits of article 51 of other articles in the U. N. charter which provide for concerted action outside the assembly and security council to meet specific threats.

Secretary Marshall, although apparently not directing himself specifically toward the veto, seems to think that the extension of this idea would leave the U. N. to drop on the veto side.

What would actually result would be a general of such operations which already have been obtained with formation of rival military alliances and related groups of states.

I don't quite follow him on that, although he may be wrong on the premise that enough pressure is enough, that what we are doing now will contain Russia until she can be persuaded to live in the present world instead of trying to change completely.

You can never afford to overlook the possibility that too much pressure on Russia will eventually force her to attempt a breakthrough with war resulting. On the other hand, the Marshall plan and all other plans will fail if it is insufficient to prevent additional Czechoslovakias.

BOISE, May 6 (UP)—It is slightly more than 90 days to the primary election and 60 days to the starting date for filing of declarations of candidacy. And the amazing thing is that possibly there's little doing but a lot of talk.

The conservatives of both parties went out in their respective delegate caucuses in the past few days at Idaho Falls. That leaves the liberals, chomping at the bit and wondering how they are going to make their presence known this election.

The Democrats, as has been mentioned before, are in a quandary. The question of Coe should rule against the incumbent Republican congressional office holders is apparent to their minds. Few good party leaders want new faces. But they've looked around and found a coverage supply of potential "new" candidates.

Supreme Court Justice Edwin M. Holden may serve as a so-called "conservative" candidate to seek the U. S. senatorial nomination. This writer was the first to mention him as a likely candidate. Now more Democrats are mentioning his name.

The Democrats point out that he has nothing to lose. He has two more years left of his present court term (after this year). His age has him from seeking reelection. He is well qualified for retirement under the 1947 judges' retirement law.

Holden himself pointed out that he is not identified with any of the factions of the Democratic party—Gowett or Taylor.

Former governor and Sen. Charles C. Gossett, Nampa, may yet try for the senate. He was a staunch supporter of Dan A. Cavanaugh for national committeeman at the Idaho Falls convention. And Cavanaugh has a likely record. Not more Democrats are mentioning his name.

There is Arnold Williams, St. Anthony, former governor identified with the so-called liberal faction. Williams has his eyes on the senate or second district congressional district. His side lost at Idaho Falls.

One thing is certain. The potential of the anti-Gowett sentiment is certainly there. They recognize that their chances of winning this fall are faded dim. They figure they would only be throwing money away in a campaign. Still the party must make a showing and the leaders believe it is worth a try.
