



European Assembly as First Step of New Union Urged by Churchill

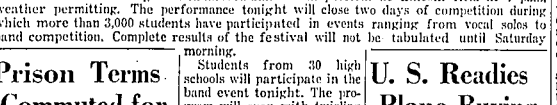
THE HAGUE, The Netherlands, May 7 (By)—Winston Churchill urged today immediate formation of a European assembly as the first step toward a council of Europe free of the jealousies and rivalries of the past. He asked members of a 22-nation group to meet with their governments to "create a new Europe" whose united voice could be continuously heard. The new council of Europe should be a subordinate but necessary part of the world organization, Churchill said.

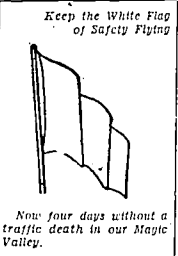

Blaze Dangers On Rangeland Said 'Greater'

WASHINGTON, May 7 (AP)—The menace of fire on the western range is greater now than before the war, the bureau of land management said today.

Charles D. Geneaux, acting chief of the bureau's forestry division said 1947 was a particularly bad year and the outlook for 1948 is equally serious.

Geneaux told the National Grazing Advisory council that brush and grass fires destroyed 529,000 acres of federal grazing lands last year, plus with 283,000 acres of state and private lands mixed with the public range.

Greatest Loss Since '42
The value of the lands destroyed, Geneaux said, was \$250,000, and a half times the 1946 loss and the greatest damage since the \$41,600,000 fire loss of 1942.

Geneaux said there were 529 grass fires in 1947, and that average size was 1,684 acres. The average size of the 628 fires in 1946 was only 850 acres.

Of the fire loss, Geneaux said, 64 per cent was caused by man, with careless smokers chiefly responsible.

Chattis Man Testifies
Merle L. Drake, Challis, Idaho, witness said the cause of the fire from automobiles are a particularly serious problem among the timber fire-fighters of the Snake river section of southern Idaho. Other committee members said grazing district fire classes are great throughout Idaho, Utah and Wyoming.

Gerard Kerr, the bureau's soil and moisture chief, told the committee the nation's 58 districts—that the government's range reseedling efforts have been disappointing.

Of 1,000,000 acres experimentally reseeded, efforts have been successful on only 200,000 and moderately successful on 200,000 more. Kerr reported. Little or no benefit has been noted on 600,000 acres.

Clarence A. Warrington, 71, a pioneer resident of Twin Falls and Falls, died Monday at his home at Ploverville, Ida.

He was born Jan. 27, 1877, in Iowa. For the past 15 years he had been a miner and owned mining properties near Ploverville.

Mr. Warrington helped dig the basement of the Twin Falls county courthouse. He was a member of the Eden Old Fellows and Masonic lodges.

Survivors include a brother, Almon Emory Warrington, Klondike Falls, Ore., and a sister, Mrs. Hiram B. Lewis, St. Marthas.
