Oregon Battle Of Dewey and Stassen Gains

PORTLAND, Ore., May 10 (AP)—The battle between Harold E. Stassen and Gov. Thomas E. Dewey for Oregon's Republican presidential delegation ended the final stage today.

Stassen will fly to Oregon next Friday—three days ahead of his original schedule—to campaign against Dewey primarily on the issue of outwitting the Communist party in the United States.

The Oregon primary will be held May 21. The winner will gain considerable prestige in western states.

Dewey headquarters said Stassen's decision to return early to Oregon was an "act of panic and desperation" and asserted Dewey had made heavy inroads into Stassen's strength throughout the state.

President Peter H. Odgaard of Reed college, former assistant to the secretary of the treasury, today asked Dewey and Stassen to discuss the "decision issue" together at the civic auditorium in Portland.

Identical invitations were sent to both headquarters.

Robert Elliott, Oregon campaign manager for Stassen, said he felt Stassen undoubtedly would be willing to appear with Dewey on the same platform.
