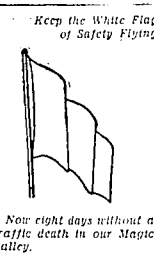

Europe 'Dead Duck' Minus Plan of Unity

Ever since the United States began to take a top place in international affairs the idea of a federation of states has been an unappealing threat to Europeans as a possible solution of their continent's problems. Hitler's recent demonstration of what greed and lack of cooperation can do to Europe's tightly-knit economic and political units, and the war revelation that World War II was only one battle in the campaign against totalitarianism, have captured the fancy that without unity Europe is a dead duck.

Now, at last, the danger has brought together several groups that have been working independently. With speed and unanimity they have come out for a federalized Europe, with whatever surrender of national sovereignties it may require.

Not Representatives
 It must be remembered that the delegates to the congress are not representatives of governments, and that their resolutions represent expressions of opinion, not policy. Their recommendations are hanging back if not actually opposed. It is always easier to speak without responsibility than to advocate difficult programs.

With all the good will in the world, Belgium, The Netherlands and Luxembourg have found it extremely difficult to form a federalized union for a full customs union, and it may not be working in its ultimate form for several years. A full political union is incredibly more difficult, especially when it involves nations which have nurtured traditional enmities over periods of centuries.

Differences
 Even among friends such as France and Britain there are differences involving not only trade conflicts but also their relations with other continental countries and with their empires. When Britain offered union to France in 1946 the French refused because they believed England had withheld military support to save herself at their expense, turned it down. Today the British government, entangled in its own recovery program, is holding back while the French appear willing to join up. France's major party, the popular Republican movement, has just endorsed European federation.

At New Peak
 In spite of the problems, however, the federal movement has reached a new peak after lying dormant since the failure of the British movement 22 years ago. There is an air of crusade about the issue meeting. Its leaders, like Winston Churchill, see for the most part former officials whose ideas have been molded by the pressures of their war experiences. Some of them are to flee from countries which are in the rubble grasp of a new aggressor. Recognizing that they cannot speak for governments, they claim to be speaking for all the war-weary peoples.

All 5 Victims of Crash Recovered

BOISE, May 11 (AP)—Bodies of all five persons killed when a car plunged over a 20-foot embankment into Arrowrock reservoir has been recovered.

Police officers yesterday recovered the bodies of Clarence Edie May, 25, and his wife, Fern, 22. Three other persons who died in the crash were recovered Sunday night. They were Clarence P. May, 51, and the young couple's two children, Ronnie, 8, and Richard, 9 months.

Police said the car went over the cliff about midnight Saturday and landed in about 10 to 15 feet of water. The car was notified in the water by a forest ranger Sunday evening.

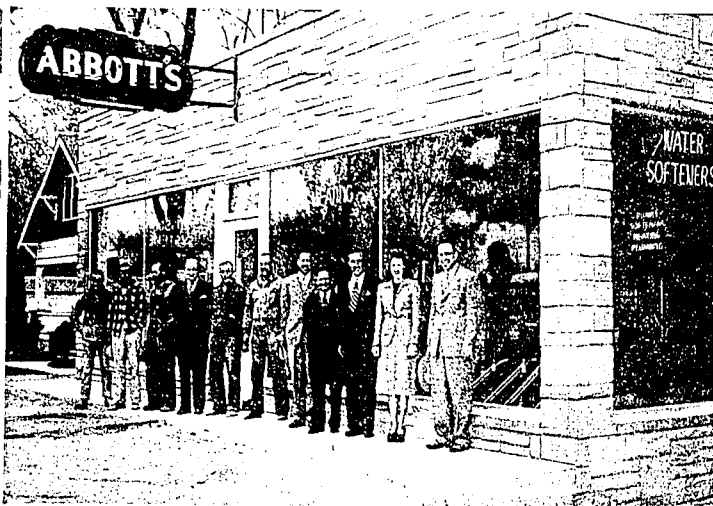

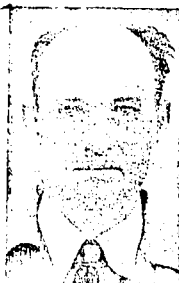

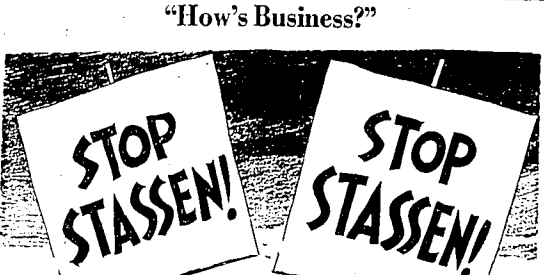

Human Factor Causing Crisis On Air Speed

By HOWARD W. BLAKENLEE Associated Press Science Editor NEW YORK, May 11—Commander Lynn S. Beals, Jr., U. S. navy doctor, said today there is a "crisis" in military aviation because it is not yet known how to keep human beings healthy when they fly faster than sound.

Beals spoke at a human engineering conference of the New York Academy of Sciences.

"This particular crisis is with us purely because aeromedical research has been outstripped by aeronautical achievement," Beals said. "The first and most important human trouble, he said, is from vertical vibration. This up-and-down motion occurs as a plane about reaches the speed of sound. It is so fast that it equates five to six times the pull of attraction in other words, momentarily a pilot's blood gets as heavy as molten uranium, which is nearly twice as heavy as lead. This can cause blackout, or worse."

Beals said he is to get quickly through this region, he said, or to cushion the vibration.

An unknown danger is to the eyes. The plane's vibrations may be fast enough to excite with the natural rate of vibration of human eyes, and this might mean temporary blindness.

Being May Be Different Also, said Beals, there is the problem of seeing through the air shock waves that cloud visibility at the nose of a plane. It may be possible that the next wave barrier in front of the plane will make seeing difficult.

There are also risks in super-sonic motion, too high-pitched to be heard. In laboratories it is already known that some super-sonic sounds cause illness.

If Commander Beals went on when a plane is flying faster than sound the engine stop suddenly, the slow-down, or deceleration, may be equal to crashing.

It will be necessary, he said, to have flying cockpits, that will detach themselves from a plane in trouble, and keep floating on their own power. The cockpit would not fly far, but just enough to slow down gradually. This would cost, for 60,000 to 80,000-foot altitudes, would also have to retain its own air pressure.

Critical Peak In Holy Land Due Saturday

The crisis in the war-torn Holy Land will reach the acute point this coming week-end, on middle night Friday the British abandon their mandate and will be off for the threatened Arab invasion.

It's a tense moment, since invasion of the Holy Land will mean the horror of further destruction of ancient relics which are scattered by the following:

Three great religions—Christianity, Judaism and Mohammedanism. At the very least it might produce that most awful form of conflict, a holy war—Moslem against Jew.

Arab Legion Drama

The legions of neighboring Arab states are reported to be awaiting the frontiers of Palestine, waiting for the fateful hour of midnight which signals the beginning of the war. Will the invading force be so overwhelming that the defenders can't stand up against it, or can the Jewish army hold its own? Probably only the actual test at arms will answer that question.

However, the Jewish position isn't without its advantages. In the first place the strength of the Jewish army is estimated at 23,000 men, who are said to be well equipped with small arms. In addition, the Arab group and the underground Irgun Zvai Leumi together are credited with a total of 2,500 to 7,000 fighting men. Then, too, with the lifting of the embargo against the importation of war material, the Jews undoubtedly will be able to secure considerable supplies.

Natural Defenses

Perhaps even more impressive from the Jewish standpoint are the defenses which nature has supplied. The Jordan river, the Golan Heights and Lebanon are mountainous and difficult for military operations. Facing the other frontier are the stretches of terrain which contain many desert tracts.

This doesn't mean the natural obstacles are so great that Palestine can't be invaded. It does mean that they would impede armies in numerous places and, from a more important, would vastly increase the difficulties of the invaders in maintaining their lines of supply.

PARIS, May 11 (AP)—Published rumors of a Jewish underground plot to assassinate or kidnap Princess Elizabeth during her visit to Paris this week are reported under French police scrutiny today.
