Chances for Federal Bean Area Telephone Services Won't Be Hit by Strike

Prospects for the establishment of a regional federal bean research laboratory in Twin Falls are most promising, according to Carl Irwin, western representative of the Bean Growers Association. Irwin made this announcement as he reported on his recent trip to Washington, D. C., where he appeared before a subcommittee on agricultural appropriations to urge the establishment of such a research station in this area. He presented the report at a meeting of the Twin Falls Chamber of Commerce Friday night in the Park hotel.

Israel Army Asserts Arabs Invading State

The army of Israel said its new-born state was invaded Saturday from the north and south, shelled from the east and bombed and machine-gunned from the air. The Israeli army, a Jewish nation already recognized by the United States, said the Lebanese army attacked across the border from the north, the Egyptian army spearheaded into the Negev desert, and Trans-Jordan's Arab legion shelled four settlements on the Jordan valley frontier. The Egyptian army said two columns of troops invaded southern Palestine and one destroyed a Jewish settlement.

Jewish Nation Wants U. N. to Halt Invasion

The United Nations Security Council today to stop Arab invasions of Palestine by sanctions or actual UN military force. The council, which was set up to help the United States and the United Kingdom to bring about a settlement of the Palestine problem, today voted to demand that the Arab invaders withdraw from the territory of Israel, which it will defend herself but not the United Nations, action immediately.

Arab spokesmen countered with declarations they considered the Jews of Palestine a rebellious nation that they were merely and justly in armed forces to restore order in their house.

The security council met in extra session today to discuss the mounting war in Palestine. Dr. Mordecai Weizel urged the council to employ the most drastic measures against the Arab invaders if they fail to heed a council warning.

16,432-Pound Wool Pool Is Shipped Here

Twenty-three Twin Falls county farmers brought 16,432 pounds of wool Saturday to make one of the Twin Falls County Livestock Marketing association's largest pool shipments on record. County Agent C. W. Dalgh, association secretary, said this year's shipment is about double that of last year's.

The shipment would have been even larger, he said, if all farmers had completed their shearing. To take care of them, the association will schedule another shipment at a later date.

Three largest contributors were A. E. Holmquist, Piler, 11 bags averaging 300 pounds; Joe Kohlmeier, Buhl, seven bags averaging a little more than 200 pounds; and L. A. Winkler, Piler, five bags averaging 100 pounds.

The wool is being shipped to the National Wool Marketing corporation, a government-owned concern at Boston, Mass. There each grower's wool will be graded and sold on its individual merits. In the meantime, growers will receive an advance of 25 cents a pound.

In charge of loading operations here were Tom Beech, Rupert, representing the Eastern Idaho Wool Marketing association and the Boston firm; George W. Hiram, Salt Lake City, Union Pacific wool checker, and Dalgh, who kept records of weights and identification numbers.

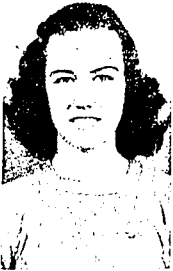

Natural Hot Water Heats Oregon City

KLAMATH FALLS, Ore., May 15 (AP)—This bustling center of Oregon town of 25,000 people is built on a hot spot—which around these parts is considered a fortunate happenstance.

Hot ground water beneath the streets has been tapped to heat some 400 homes. It also heats a swimming pool, two hospitals, a high school, a newspaper office, several apartment houses and business buildings.

It sterilizes dairy and soft-drink bottles and has kept the boiler out of local cell-lauderier.

A new \$1,000,000 veterans hospital to be built here will be the latest lucky outfit to forget fuel fuel bills if the test well now being drilled hits hot water.

Probing Necessary
To do this it must probe an uncertain subterranean stream that flows diagonally across beneath the town. This stream flows along earth faults, the main one of which is estimated by geologists to be 30 miles long. Along its course outside town farmers tap its warmth to keep greenhouses like June in January and to warm drinking water for their livestock during the raw winter here east of the Cascades.

However, you don't just sink a pipe anywhere in Klamath Falls and hit hot water. A new well will only a few feet from a hot one may prove to be a dud.

Section Limited
The section of town where really hot water is found — at depths varying from 200 to 700 feet — is limited. It is known locally as "Geothermal paradise" because natural hot water provides cheaper heat than any fuel—even wood, which is plentiful here in nearby timber country.

Installing the pipes in a 200-foot well costs about \$1,000, but even this is the only cost until the pipes have to be replaced in six or eight years.

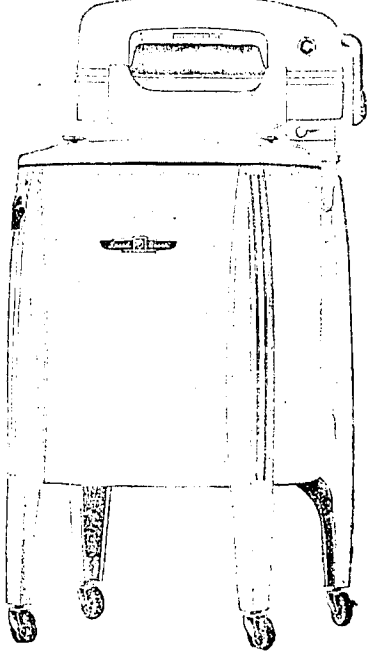

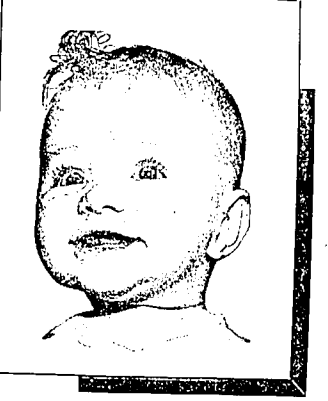

Congressmen Put Curbs on Their Journal

By ARTHUR EDSON
WASHINGTON, May 15.—Congressmen often talk about getting things in the "Congressional Record." Now they have talked themselves right out of it.

For the house Friday approved an appropriations bill for \$30,852,650, and to it was attached this provision:

None of the money can be used to pay government agents who try to get into unions whose leaders have failed to sign non-communist affidavits.

1,600 Printers Affected
Some 1,600 government printers are affected. And the officers of the International Typographical union have said as if they had these affidavits under the "anti-Harry" law.

The appropriations bill won't become law until it is passed by the Senate and signed by President Truman. But if it does pass—

How many government printers are union men?

R. H. Harrell, executive officer for the government printers' union told a reporter today that he doesn't know.

Majority in Union
"We don't ask, for we don't deal directly with the union," he said. "But we know that a majority of them belong."

So there could be a serious interruption in the life of the "Record," one of the world's most successful publications.

Today's issue, for instance, runs 162 pages. It includes everything that was said in the house and senate Friday. It also includes many a speech or report that a congressman found interesting, and therefore had inserted in the "Record."

Most newspapers know fairly well in advance how many columns of type will be needed to fill any issue. "But with the Record," said Harrell, "we never know. It may be 250 pages, or it may be six. On the average it takes 400 pointers to get the job done."

By 4 a. m. the type set and the presses start rolling out 40,000 copies.

By 7 a. m. a senator can get a copy, delivered directly to his home, and add the words he uttered the previous day.

Ronald Boone, who died middle-aged and gallant in his last war, summed it up back there at graduation when he wrote this poem for the annual:

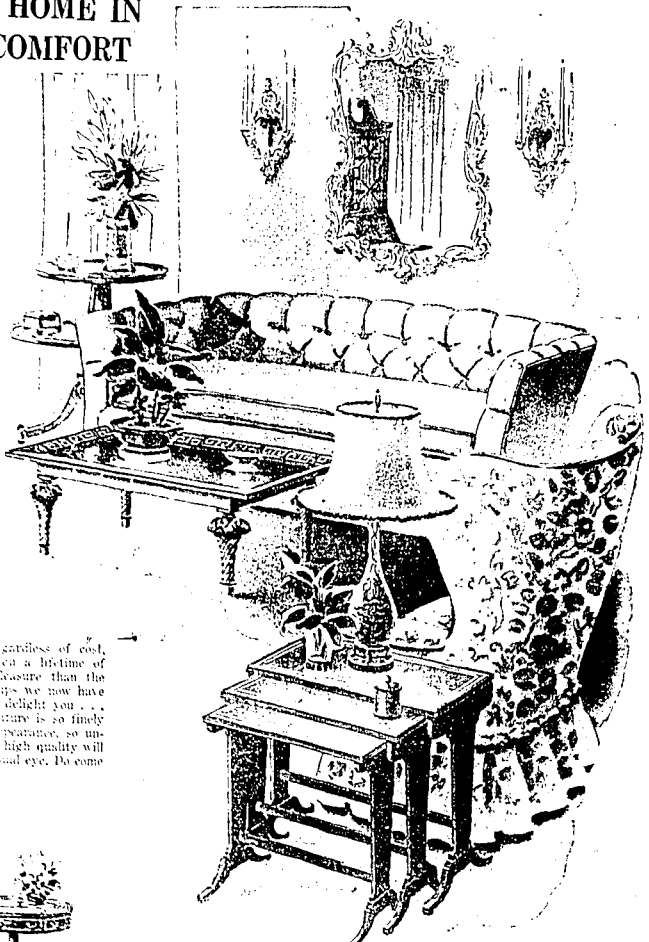
TO THE SCHOOL

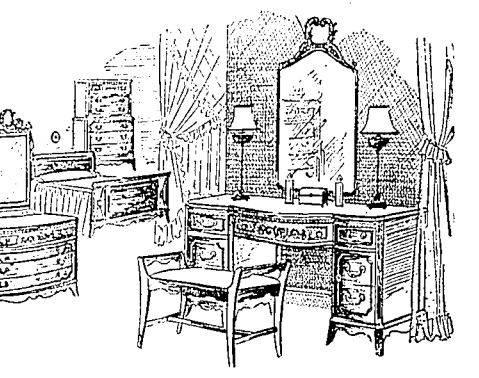

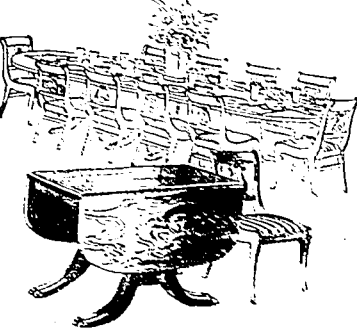

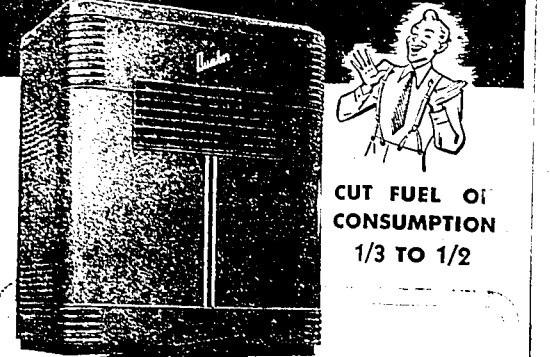

Famed Father Flanagan Dies On Reich Visit

BERLIN May 15 (AP)—Mr. Edward J. Flanagan, 60, the famed "Father Flanagan" of Boys Town, Neb., died here early today following a heart attack.

The priest, who came here last Sunday for a two-week study of youth conditions, died at the 2709 army station hospital at 2:08 p. m. Berlin time.

He was stricken Thursday night during dinner at a house where the army's guest house, and was rushed immediately to the hospital. Attendants were instructed to divert all information concerning him.

Services at Frankfurt
Army authorities said the body of Father Flanagan would be flown to Frankfurt Monday by special airplane flying funeral services to the Holy Trinity German Catholic church. American army chaplains will officiate. At Frankfurt the body will be transferred to another plane which will take it back to Boys Town, where it is expected to arrive Tuesday night or Wednesday.

His death led to hundreds of residences and alumni of Boys Town, says a friend who said that there was "no such thing as a bad boy" and his treatment of them was kindness and plenty of food and care.

Named Monsignor
The priest was named a monsignor in the Catholic church in 1937, and established Boys Town in a remarkable building in a poor section of town.

As donations came in, slowly at first, Father Flanagan purchased 160 acres of land 10 miles west of Omaha and eventually built Boys Town. It was for boys of every race, color and religion. In 1937 it became an incorporated community with its own postoffice and a government by the boys themselves.

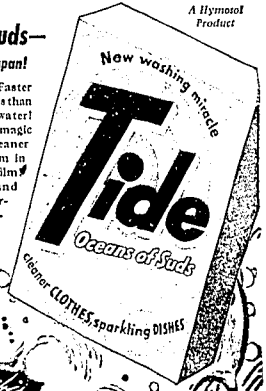

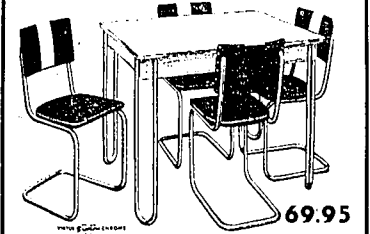

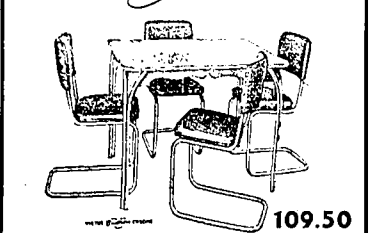
