

# Soviet Protest Is Rejected by U.S. State Department

WASHINGTON, May 27 (AP)—The United States has flatly rejected Russian protests claiming American airplanes have interfered with Soviet shipping in the vicinity of Japan. The state department said today the U. S. reply to various Soviet notes of protest was delivered to the Russians by the American embassy in Moscow Tuesday.

A statement released by the department said the Soviets had objected to more than 50 cases of alleged interference with their commercial shipping. The department said that neither in the Russian notes nor in direct investigation by American authorities has there been evidence of such interference. The American reply was not given in text form here but was summarized in the statement. It is that Gen. Douglas MacArthur as supreme Allied commander in Japan uses air, army and naval forces "to prevent smuggling and illegal entry into Japan." "No 'going within the limits of air force' conducting this off shore patrol is absolutely necessary for recognition purposes," the state department said in reporting on the note to Russia. "These activities serve the interests of the Soviet government, as well as of other nations, concerned with the occupation and control of Japan," the department contended.

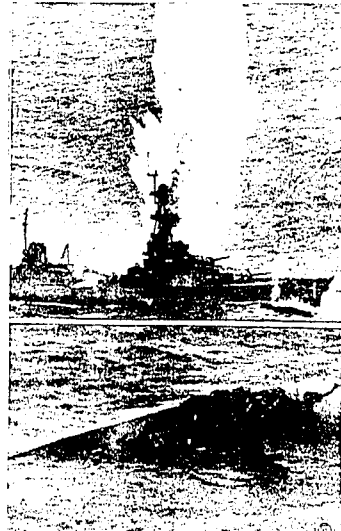

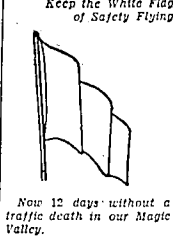

### Wallace Will Testify About Red Ban Bill

COEUR D'ALENE, May 27 (AP)—Henry Wallace has interrupted his presidential campaign and is flying to Washington, D. C., today to testify against the Mundt-Nixon bill at a senate hearing Saturday.

The third party presidential candidate cancelled scheduled addresses at Pocatello and Phoenix after a speech here last night. He said he will resume the campaign at Denver next week.

The anti-communist Mundt bill has already been approved by the house.

"I am going to those hearings to uphold the old fashioned, fundamental American principle of free speech," Wallace said.

**Artificially Heated**

He added that "the attempt to force the Mundt bill through the senate in an atmosphere of artificially created hysteria indicates the desperation of the anti-peace forces."

Wallace and his running mate, Sen. Glen Taylor, D. Ida., were on the same platform yesterday for the first time in their campaign.

Taylor, whom Wallace referred to as "the most courageous senator in the last century" told an audience of 1,800 that Democrats should be administered through the United Nations. He termed the Marshall Plan "a lie and a plot."

**Armed Economy**

Taylor said the United States is building an "armament economy" and declared "once you get an armament economy added on you, it is almost impossible to get rid of it because so many jobs depend on guns and tanks."

He said he "had to go with Henry Wallace because both the old parties lost all their zip and go."

After his talk, Taylor called his wife and two sons to the platform to join him in singing.

"When I was campaigning for the senate I used to sing for you, and I'm no better now," he declared.

### Speaker Claims GOP Win Would Be Big Disaster

GARDEN CITY, N. Y., May 27 (AP)—Paul V. McNutt, former governor of Indiana, said today that a Republican victory in the presidential election this year would be "an unmitigated world disaster."

"A victory for the Republican party would be a victory for isolationism," the prominent Indiana Democrat told the Nepesca county Democratic committee at its annual dinner.

McNutt was lavish in his praise of President Truman.

"I have known Harry Truman for more than a quarter of a century," he said. "To me he is richer America—a man who has reached the nation's highest place and has not lost the common touch."

### Solon Says He's Ready to Accept

CHICAGO, May 27 (AP)—Senator O'Mahoney, Wyo., said today he would accept the Democratic vice presidential nomination if it were offered him.

He told a news conference that he isn't, however, a candidate for the post. He predicted that President Truman would become more popular after the Republicans select their candidate.

He added that he believed Henry Wallace's third party movement is weakening.

"The idea of a protest vote will appeal less and less to the masses of the people," O'Mahoney said.

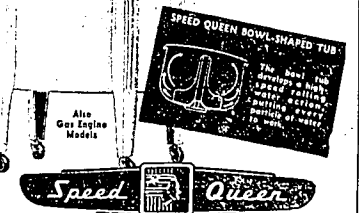

### Homesteading Era in Idaho Not Over Yet

BOISE, May 26 (AP)—The era of the homesteader in Idaho is fading fast but still can't be written off as history quite yet.

Thirty-nine homestead applications were filed with the Blackfoot district land office in 1947 and six have been filed during March of this year according to Frank Olson, acting office manager.

The Blackfoot office has jurisdiction over 200,000 acres of Idaho's 44 counties. A Cour d'Aiene office manages the other ten counties.

There are some 12,001,405 acres of vacant public land remaining in Idaho—less than a fifth of the total.

The bureau of land management says this land, with very few exceptions, would be incapable of providing a livelihood, which is required for its acquisition under the homestead laws.

And also it's possible to acquire public land in Idaho on a mail-order basis.

The land must be inspected by the applicant, he must establish residence upon the tract within six months after entry allowance, and must maintain residence for three years.

A veteran is entitled to have the term of his military service—not exceeding two years—deducted from the residence requirement.

Maximum area which may be entered under the ordinary homestead law is 160 acres. The homestead settler must be 21 years of age or head of a family and must not be the owner of more than 160 acres of land within the United States.

The big hope for the potential homesteader today lies in the development of seemingly poor land by new irrigation projects.

But small tracts, the land bureau says, no settling will be allowed as long as the land can't provide the homesteader with a livelihood.

### Closed Fire Season Will Begin on June 1

BOISE, May 27 (AP)—The closed fire season in Idaho begins June 1. Roger L. Guernsey, assistant state forester, reminded Idahoans and tourists.

He said between this date and Sept. 30, it is unlawful to set a fire on any forest or fire within a fire protection district without first obtaining a fire permit from a fire warden.

He said a special appeal is being made to tourists this year to be responsible for 110 fires on state and private lands last year.

### Frenchman Faces Deportation After Posing as U. S. Veteran

PHOENIX, Ariz., May 27 (AP)—A French youth faced almost certain deportation home today but gratulated himself that he is returning much healthier than when he left.

Jean Antoine Navarette collected \$15,000 worth of free medical treatment at government expense while he posed for two years as an American ex-G.I.

"I like this country," Navarette said. "The lucky to have had a chance to live in the United States and receive medical care I couldn't have gotten anywhere else."

He was jailed on federal fraud charges when the veterans administration and army records finally caught up with him at Whipple veterans hospital, near Prescott, Ariz.

The 24-year-old Frenchman was receiving expensive, highly specialized tuberculosis treatments at the time.

Navarette said he got tuberculosis when, at the age of 16, he was sent to a German concentration camp at Frankfurt and worked 18 and 30 hours a day.

His home was destroyed in the war and his parents killed, he said. No French hospitals had room for him.

### Traffic Ticket Means Wreck May Be Near

HARTFORD, Conn., May 27 (AP)—The more tickets you get from a traffic cop, a group of experts reported today, the better are the chances that an automobile accident is waiting for you.

The experts, who recently conducted a New York university sponsored clinic here to determine what makes a poor driver, concluded also that good drivers have "a high opinion of how much liquor they can hold."

The conclusions were based on data collected from 92 accident-free drivers and 92 with records of repeated offenses. Each driver was given an extensive test lasting an hour and a half.

Repeated traffic violations, said the report made public by the Connecticut motor vehicle department, "can be considered as a symptom or forerunner of an accident."

The 92 "repeaters" the survey showed, had a combined record of 328 accidents and 338 traffic violations. Their licenses were suspended 113 times.

None of the accident-free drivers was ever arrested for a traffic violation or had his license suspended.

"Undoubtedly," said the report, "the best indication that a driver will have accidents is his record of repeated violations."

On the subject of drinking and driving, the experts said 41 per cent of the "repeaters" felt they could take five drinks without serious effects on their driving, while a few of them said they could take 10 or more drinks.

"Repeaters" evidently have a high opinion of their own capacities," concluded the experts.

C-A-T-I-A—something or other. Look here, I just threw out the big words. I don't have to know how to spell 'em."

## Taxed Gasoline Volume Greater In '47 Than '46

BOISE, May 27 (AP)—Nearly ten per cent more gasoline was taxed by the state in 1947 than during the previous year.

Early Floyd, director of the state motor fuels bureau, said gasoline taxes were collected on 28,407,000 gallons of motor fuel in 1947, an increase of about 10 per cent over 1946.

Floyd said the total increase in gasoline between 1946 and 1947 amounted to 17,785,027 gallons.

He said Idaho ranked fourth in the nation in the percentage of increase in motor fuels taxed by states. California led the nation with a total of 2,732,808,000 gallons last year.

Floyd said the total tax collected in 1947 was \$9,829,046 compared to \$8,607,702 in 1946. The total tax collected in April of this year was \$763,860, making the total for the first four months of 1948, \$2,708,201.

## State's Old-Age Payments More Than \$1,000,000

BOISE, May 27 (AP)—Approximately \$1,125,000 was paid to recipients of Idaho during 1947 under the federal old age and survivors insurance program.

J. F. Mellinger, manager of the social security administration office here, said there were about 5,200 Idaho residents on the insurance payrolls at the end of last year.

They included retired workers and their dependents who received \$715,000 of the total. Survivors of deceased workers received \$372,000 in monthly insurance payments and lump sum death payments amounted to \$38,000.

Mellinger said the Idaho figures were estimated from national totals.
