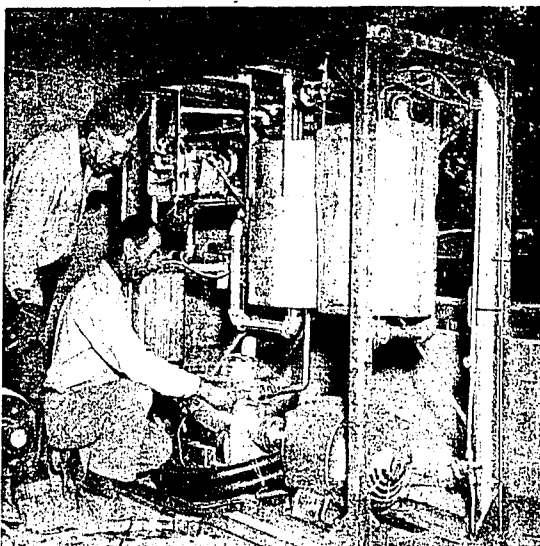

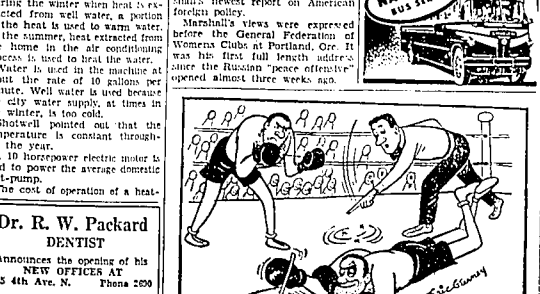

"Sidereal radiation," words you can spell, is a bombardment of rays from the stars and the space between the stars.

They can't see 'em and you can't feel 'em. But you can measure 'em. The sidereal radiation recorder looks a pot-bellied black stove with dials and meters where the fire ought to be.

In a recording drum on top, electric sparks burn holes in a score of paper. Butterfield said that he has a chart showing the correlation of the stock market and the sidereal radiation.

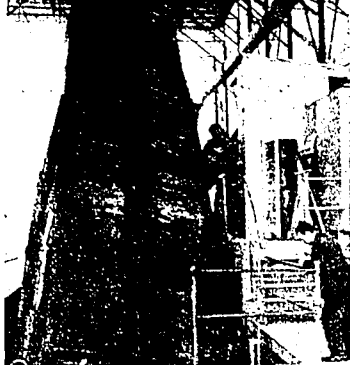
Whether you feel optimistic or pessimistic," Butterfield explains, "depends on the intensity of sidereal radiation."

He says he can tell you—and will—what will be in the stock market next month.

"In February," he pointed out, "the sidereal radiation would have a strong upsurge in March. It did not—sharply—despite some of the most pessimistic news in recent years."

And if you're thinking of taking a flur now, don't.

'Worthless' Drug Called Promising 'New' Discovery

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Masters Says Armed Power Not Sufficient

HULL, May 31—A warning that the United States should not rely primarily on military strategy to meet the threat of communist aggression was sounded here Sunday by Ira H. Masters, former secretary of state.

"Our people should press for positive programs which have immediate possibilities for peace and justice," Masters declared in his talk at the Baptist church. Americans could, for example, move toward greater economic well-being throughout the world, greater emphasis on increasing social welfare, greater observance of human rights to check terrorism and greater use of processes of international convention and negotiation, he continued.

"Confusion faces the world today but it existed 2,000 years ago," he said. Masters said the Federal Council of Churches has submitted a positive program for world peace and if Americans are to prevent war, we must adhere to this program rather than appropriating such huge sums in preparation for war. American never lacked leadership so seriously as she does today, he added.

An appearance of broken official relations is psychologically bad for peace, he said. It increases the risk that governments act on misinformation and make miscalculations which lead to perilous incidents. He said it is possible to get immediate results, which will decrease the threat of war, through economic, social, political and moral proposals which are well thought out and which it seems our nation is resolved to carry through.
