Military Craft Said Success In Pest Fight

CALIFORNIA, Calif., June 6.—Some 25 former war pilots are operating controlled army and navy training planes in what is being termed the largest crop dusting campaign in the world.

Some 25 planes can dust 25,000 acres a day and the 500,000 acres in Imperial Valley are dusted at least once each year. Some districts are dusted twice and even three times a year.

The work is dangerous because the planes fly so low over the ground, but only three planes have crashed up in the past year and no pilots have been injured.

Use DDT Powder The poison used in the spraying is the war-time developed DDT powder, which is used in five and 10 per cent strengths.

The planes can apply the spray at a critical moment when the soil is wet and other equipment cannot get on the field.

The aerial method on the millions and millions of acres, worms and insects that inhabit this rich agricultural district is successful in all cases.

Starts at Dawn The pilot must do the morning either in the early morning or late in the afternoon. He starts at dawn and flies till 7 a. m. and again at 4 p. m. until dusk.

Wallace Is to Stay in Race, Writer Avers

WASHINGTON, June 7 (AP)—Henry A. Wallace, in the general election campaign to stay, according to well informed sources here, but does not expect to be elected President until 1952.

Wallace is said to regard this as the most important political event in his life. He looks for a political reshuffle during the next four years which might put him at the head of a winning presidential ticket next time.

Withdrawal Predicted Some of the most prominent observers in the business are predicting a Wallace withdrawal. There is no evidence of such a plan. Months before he broke with President Truman over foreign policy in the autumn of 1940 Wallace was warning that the Democratic Party was heading for a split.

"When the Democratic party comes to be a people's party," said Wallace, "it will die—and it will be well dead."

Not 'People's Party' Wallace holds now that the Democratic party is not a people's party and that it is dead with respect to being conducted shortly after the November election. That is why he and the communists and left-wingers associated with him look so hopefully toward 1952 while they campaign for Roosevelt.

Wallace already is on the ballot in enough states to insure Mr. Truman's defeat if the Democratic Party is at all close.

This confidence that he can control the party out of his own movement and what he expects to be the wreckage of the Democratic party, however, is not supported by party executives.

When the party was born at the time of the Civil war, it was a coalition of the three parties that have come and gone without taking over either of the major political organizations.

Urges Unspent Funds Use Dworshak said there are some \$1,300,000 in unspent funds which will be used during the coming year on the Palisades dam. Pre-construction work on the project already has cost about \$100,000.

Dworshak said the Palisades project has been held under way for some time and that it has been delayed since pre-war days by various excuses.

Agreements Block Request Markwell said the reclamation bureau had not asked for more funds because it still was trying to find out what requirements would be made on the use of the water. The bureau, he said, also is waiting for engineers to perfect a conservation system for saving water in winter-time.

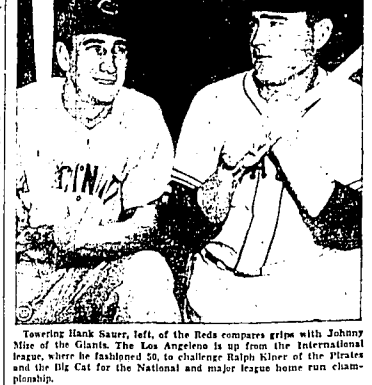

who could receive all the anti-Truman electoral votes. In the event of concentration, they would have a chance to elect a representative of their own in the presidential election into the house of representatives.

Lacking only 30,000 needed at anticipated votes to reach the 68 he needs, the President seemed likely to see up a first ballot nomination early this week.

Oklahoma Democrats met to pick their 24-vote delegation today. Kentucky will choose 26 tomorrow, Connecticut 20 and the District of Columbia six on Friday. On Saturday Colorado will name 12 and Minnesota 26.

### Loss One, Gains One

Amateur delegates already picked, Mr. Truman lost at least one that picked up another over the weekend.

William Ritchie, Nebraska state Democratic chairman and a delegate to the convention, opened July 12, announced in Omaha Sunday that "after what happened yesterday" he will not be present "for some Jeffersonian Democrat."

### Ritchie Declared that Nebraska and Iowa Democrats "give the burn" to Truman

The state chairman said arrangements for the Omaha visit were "in the hands of Republicans" and that he would not attend 2000 delegates invited to hear the President in a stadium which seats 10,000.

But while Ritchie flared in Nebraska, the chief executive nailed down Massachusetts' full slate of 38 delegates yesterday when Mayor James M. Curley, Boston, told news men he will "go along with the rest." Curley previously had threatened to bolt.

While Mr. Truman was bidding openly for support of his policies, there was news from peaceful convention rival that he wants no political office.

### Douglas Withdrawing

The St. Louis Post-Dispatch published an April 27 letter from Supreme Court Justice Tom P. Douglas, saying he had tried to dissuade his friends from promoting him for the nomination.

Colorado Young Democrats voted 470 to 433 Saturday to endorse Douglas over Mr. Truman.

But another public figure whose name may be placed before the Democratic nomination also appears to be withdrawing even further from the political arena.

### "Takes Post"

Gen. Dwight D. Eisenhower took over quietly today as president of Columbia University.

The general has said he is not available for the nomination of either party. And few politicians now expect him to have anything more to say about politics, despite recurrent rumors that he may come out in favor of some Republican.

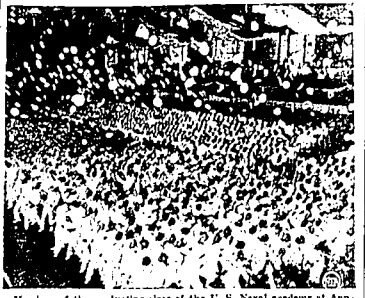
