Committee Urges Atomic Panel and Budget Slash

WASHINGTON, June 8 (AP)—Cash money cuts of nearly nine per cent for the atomic energy commission and seven per cent for the veterans administration were suggested today by the house appropriations committee. At the same time the committee called for a halt to "hobby" training under the GI bill of rights. It also said atomic energy commission officials should show less reluctance to consider the "practical realities" of spending government funds. In a \$5,795,498.921 bill to finance six agencies during the year starting July 1, the committee recommended: Atomic energy commission: \$50,850,000 in cash—plus \$10,000,000 from what President Truman asked but \$25,500,000 more than Congress approved. This year plus \$400,000,000 in contract authority, the amount the President asked. The actual money to pay contracts let under the additional authority will be voted next year or later.

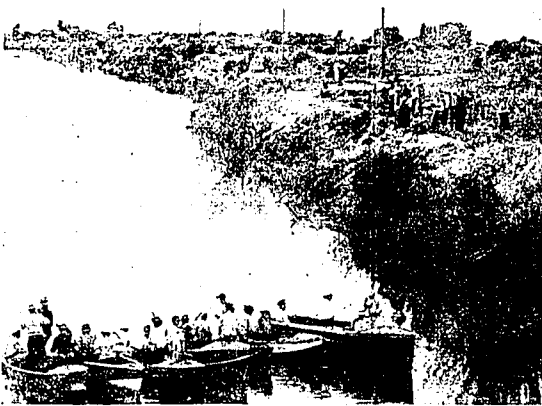

The annual library report showed 1,912 registrations and re-registrations, totaling 6,635; with 2,264 adults and 3,201 children drawing books and magazines. A third of the circulation was restricted to the library.

State Agency Hails Plan of German Rule

WASHINGTON, June 8 (AP)—State department officials had their new Western power plan for development of Germany as a major step toward recovery in Europe. It also was regarded as a blow to Russia in the cold war.
But the officials appeared still somewhat worried over whether France would approve the plan. Indirectly, they offered the French new assurances that they need fear neither a German military revival nor Soviet retaliation.
Occupation Force Placed
State Department Press officer Michael McDermott emphasized at a news conference yesterday that the United States, Britain and France would be guided by the proposed agreements to maintain occupation forces in Germany until peace is secured in Europe.
The United States, probably with

a statement from Secretary of State Marshall, is due to declare American acceptance of the agreements in a few days. London dispatches reported that the British cabinet approved them today. In addition they are to be accepted by the other three members of the London conference—Belgium, The Netherlands and Luxembourg.
Not "Final Splitting"
American officials stressed repeatedly that the decision to go ahead with the revival of western Germany does not represent a final splitting of the defeated country.
The state department spokesman said it was Russia itself which forced the Western powers to act without Russia.

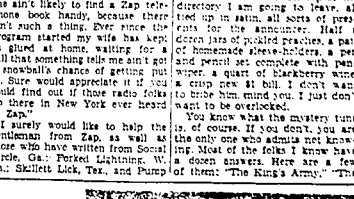

Observers of Soviet Moves Scoff Merger

Many American observers are inclined to scout reports from Europe that Russia is about ready to begin incorporating her satellites directly into the Soviet union.

Although well aware of the difficulty of trying to outguess the Kremlin, they think the obstacles from Russia's standpoint, are greater than the possible benefits.

The absorption reports themselves have been more speculative than real. They probably trace, in large part, to the continuing communist effort to eliminate all opposition in the countries which they control.

There is a purge in Poland of members of the socialist party who oppose its merger with the communists, which is expected to take place within the next two or three months.

The Yugoslav government has been eliminating from party, army and cabinet posts, men who do not adhere strictly to the line.

The campaign, already well underway in Bulgaria and Hungary, is getting along in Czechoslovakia, too.

The Soviet system, particularly as it applies to nationalization of the land, which the Soviets distributed to the peasants in the early campaign to win their cooperation in the captive countries, there is also a tremendous program for industrial unification, with both machines and workers in various countries being welded into an interlocking and interchangeable whole.

But the peoples of these countries still are not sufficiently communicated to fit in the Soviet union. Their incorporation could have to be by force. That is, through terror and rigid dictatorships. And their administration would have to be under even stronger and more direct Russian supervision than at present.

Russia, already short of administrative men, would find this a serious burden.

The idea of liberty still flames brightly among large sections of the populations. The communists hold in Romania, Bulgaria, Poland and Czechoslovakia, while tight, is by no means based on majorities. Russian annexation efforts could arouse sufficient opposition to tie up the whole business. It would seem to be useless as long as the satellites remain docile.

Former Aide Of Hull Raps Palestine Act

NEW YORK, June 8 (AP)—Summer Welles in a new book blames the United States and Britain for the Palestine war.

The book is being published today by Houghton Mifflin. It is titled "We Need Not Fail" and deals primarily with the Palestine problem. The former undersecretary of state condemns the U. S. policy on the holy land as unjust, unrealistic, fanatically short-sighted and foolish.

He agrees with the United Nations Palestine commission that Britain sabotaged the partition plan by refusing to cooperate.

The "fatal errors" of the United States and "antagonistic attitude of the British," he says, "were directly responsible for the progressive and rapid deterioration in the Palestine situation."

Welles declares there can be no hope of peace in Palestine unless the

partition plan is revitalized by the U. N., backed by military force and officially supported by the United States.

It calls for international recognition of the state of Israel and for an immediate end of the U. S. embargo on arms for the middle east.

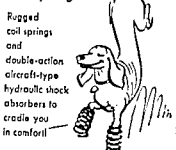
