## Big Statue Is Bigger Worry To U. S. Unit

WASHINGTON, June 9 (AP)—As if it didn't have troubles enough already, the state department came up with another problem today. It has a homeless, bigger-than-life statue, and doesn't know what to do with it.

The statue is of Gen. Gervasio Artigas, the hero of Uruguay. The general got here in one of the nicest possible ways. It seems that the good people of Uruguay longed to give something to the good people of the United States. And what could be more fitting than a statue of their beloved hero, Gen. Artigas, the George Washington of Uruguay?

So they saved their pesos. The statue was carefully shipped out, crated and shipped here. Now we run into trouble. For not just anyone, not even the good people of U. S. can give this country a statue. No, it first must be accepted by congress.

It was Senator Cain, R. Wash., who today called attention to the general's plight. Some time ago Cain introduced a bill for the U. S. to accept the gift, but congress—

## Creamery Output Up During April

BOISE, June 9 (AP)—Idaho dairy manufacturing plants made more butter and cheese in April than during March but less than for April of 1947, the bureau of agricultural economics and state bureau of dairy reported today.

Idaho plants made 2,100,000 pounds of butter and 1,255,000 pounds of cheese during April. Butter production was 8 per cent above last month but 10 per cent below April of last year and 10 per cent below the five-year average for April.

The 1,255,000 pounds of American cheese was 3 per cent above last month but 13 per cent below last April and 10 per cent below the five-year average for April.

Milk production in April was 115,000,000 pounds compared with 108,000,000 pounds in March and the 10-year average for April of 110,000,000.

## Mumps Top State Toll for Diseases

BOISE, June 9 (AP)—Mumps, with 2,018 cases reported, led all other diseases in Idaho during the first 22 weeks of 1948.

Other diseases reported to state department of vital statistics during the same period included: scarlet fever, 1,000; diphtheria, 25; tuberculosis, 74; chicken pox, 85; measles, 1,133; lobar pneumonia, 28; small pox, one; typhoid, 16; gonorrhea, 184; and syphilis, 260.

John W. Wright, head of the department, said no cases of Rocky Mountain spotted fever have been reported this season.

The department has distributed 81,810 cubic centimeters of fever serum which was credited with part of the absence of the disease.

The department said, however, that the danger season for tick fever has not yet passed.

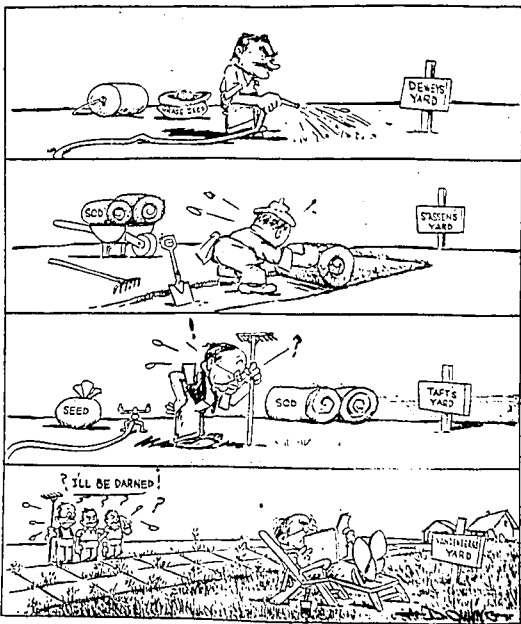

## Fire Chief Stresses Necessity Of Correct Address for Blaze

Possible loss of life and greater destruction of property were stressed Wednesday by Fire Chief E. H. Freese unless persons calling in fire alarms give correct addresses of the fire. The fire chief said wrong addresses have been given four times in the last 10 days.

Tuesday a car was reported on fire at the intersection of Shoshone street and Fifth avenue north. Upon arrival of firemen, it could not be found. A second call to the fire department gave the correct location—five blocks away on Tenth avenue instead of Fifth avenue north.

Chief Freese urged particular attention be paid to the directions of the streets and avenues in the original telephone call.

He cited a recent alarm call for an address in the 400 block of Fourth avenue south. The fire actually was located in the 400 block of Fourth avenue west.

He also pointed out the correct telephone number to use in reporting fires is 370.

Improvements," the statement of policy said.

No Formal Action

Although there was considerable discussion of the formation of a highway commission, no formal action was taken in that regard. It seemed to be the general opinion of members of the advisory committee, however, that some change should be brought about to overcome frequent turnovers in highway department personnel.

Members of the study committee generally concurred in the opinion that the highway department should be freed insofar as possible of all political influence and interference.

Planning Stressed

Repeated emphasis was placed on the importance of long range planning which some of the committee members contended is impossible with a constantly changing personnel. Particular attention was called to the fact that Idaho has had 13 highway directors during the last 25 years.

The group discussed various types of highway administration systems, classification of roads and highways in relation to governmental responsibility; highway financing; road-building and maintenance of law, license fees and vehicle charges and the relation of highway transportation to the industrial, agricultural and other economic needs of the state, including tourist travel.

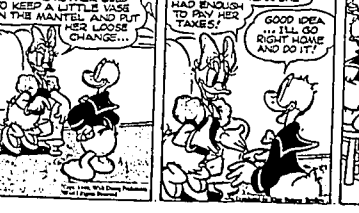

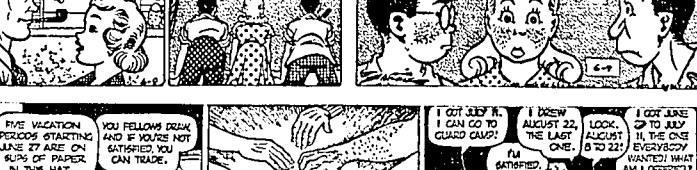

Then he went to a photographer around that day to make the picture. When he took a ride up Dollar Mountain at Sun Valley Monday on one of the "lifts" he was being followed by photographers, newsmen, cameramen and reporters at various points all along the way.

Otherwise, however, the campaigning is much the same. Wherever a crowd gathers, the grinning chief executive makes an "off-the-cuff" talk.

He drove 116 miles through south central Idaho yesterday, talking to crowds in small towns, along the way, about water power, irrigation and other western projects.

His talks, like most of them from the mountaintop in his private car, are brief, chatty, conversational affairs.

The White House physician, Dr. G. W. H. Graham, is traveling with the presidential party to look after his health.

## Session End May Hold up Anti-Red Bill

WASHINGTON, June 9.—The adjournment of the House today raised no doubts today about final congressional action on the anti-Red bill to curb communism.

A Republican leader who favors the anti-communism bill told a reporter adjournment June 19 probably would kill the legislation for this session. Then a new bill would have to be introduced in the new Congress next January.

Chairman Wiley, R. Wis., has not indicated when the Senate Judiciary committee will act on the measure. Hearings have been held.

Wiley told reporters the committee in a meeting Monday did not discuss the measure. He said the committee has not received requested information from the attorney general on constitutional questions.
