Unit Quits In Rift on Textbooks

From AP and UP Reports

BOISE, June 17—An argument over what textbook should be used to teach Idaho history in schools throughout the state has resulted in the resignation of the members of the state textbook commission.

Although the state board of education has notified of the resignation of the members of the commission, the board has not yet accepted or rejected the resignation of its textbook commission.

More Explained
In a press release today, Commission Chairman N. J. Rice explained that the members had resigned because the textbook board had failed to live up to an agreement.

The board of education agreed in 1944 that the textbook commission would review and re-evaluate all state adopted textbooks before any new ones were adopted. The board had failed to live up to an agreement.

Another Approved

Promotion Set For Spuds at Group's Meet

Preliminary advertising plans for the 1948-49 Idaho potato and onion season were approved by the Idaho advertising commission at a meeting held in conjunction with the Idaho Potato and Onion Shippers' association's annual convention at Sun Valley last week.

A tentative budget of \$100,000 was approved for the advertising and promotion campaign, subject to revision as later crop information may indicate.

As a major part of the coming campaign, the commission authorized the production of 100,000 pieces of potato and onion display material for distribution to retail grocery stores and vegetable markets throughout the nation.

The commission's advertising agencies presented a market survey of the 48 cities in which newspaper advertising for the famous Idaho spud was scheduled during the past season together with a survey of potential markets.

Plans were approved for the inclusion of a premium offer in the coming promotion campaign. A painted French fry potato cutout will be offered to interviewers at cool to encourage greater use of Idaho potatoes for French frying, particularly in the southern states.

Tentative plans were made for expanded dealer service work and personal contacts among brokers and retailers throughout the country during the fall season.

The commission decided to continue current research on potatoes in cooperation with the University of Idaho. Funds were voted for continuance of the joint investigation of better harvesting, storing, sorting and shipping methods on potatoes.

New Method Set To Choose Queen At Rupert Rodeo

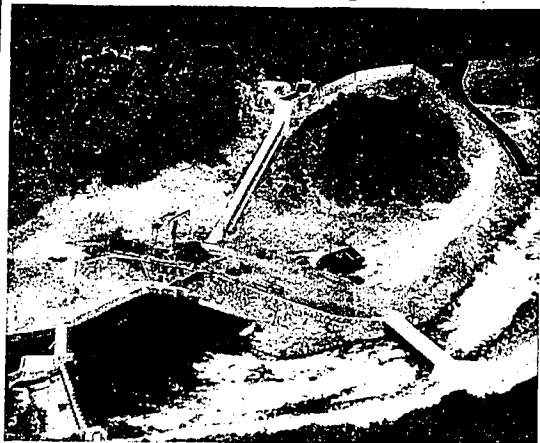

Capone-Ruled City Declares War on Gang

CHICAGO, June 17 (AP)—Suburban Chicago, saddled with gangster domination ever since Scarface Al Capone made it his headquarters, declared war on the underworld.

Town President John C. Stoffel, spurred by a mass meeting Monday night in which 500 citizens jammed the town hall to support his right to end the city of rackets, promised that "we won't stop until we've driven out every hoodlum."

Chicago's cleanup began with Stoffel's election this spring. It is part of the general reform which has developed in Chicago under Mayor Martin H. Kennelly, and which has spread to the northern suburbs.

Gambling Hit Hard
The Chicago area drama has hit gambling interests hard. Hundreds of handbooks and gambling joints have been forced to close. Taverns have had their licenses revoked for failing to close on time or for selling liquor to minors.

For 24 years Chicago, a city of more than 70,000 on Chicago's western border, has been dominated by the Capone gang and its successors, now known as "the syndicate."

Al Capone, notorious gang lord of Chicago's prohibition days, died in 1931. But the syndicate, headed by Jack Guzik and other Capone henchmen, has continued to flourish.

Capone "Captured" City
It was on election day, April 1, 1924, that Capone and his mobsters literally captured the city. Gangster cars roared through the streets, voters were shamed and ballots were stolen. Capone's brother, Frank, was shot to death in a police raid on a polling place.

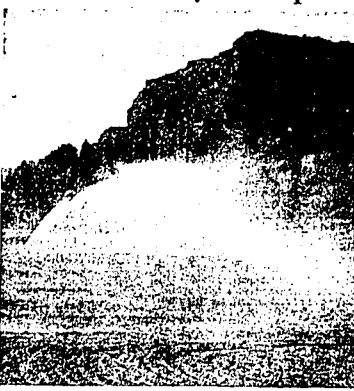

State Driving Permits Law Called Farce

By ED HAROLDSEN
IDAHO FALLS, June 17 (UP)—Bannock County Sheriff Dean P. Wilkie is one of those practical-minded persons who think Idaho's driver license law ought to be overhauled or junked.

Wilkie says that since Jan. 1, 1947, his office has sent to the law enforcement department nearly \$4,232 in driver's license fees and that some of it ought to be used for standard equipment to test applicants' physical condition. Furthermore, he says persons from out of state are accepted and issued at Idaho's licensing system, that some say the license doesn't mean a thing without real tests.

A man comes in to Wilkie's office and asks for a license.

Dean tells him to fill out the application blank, print his name and answer the questions.

"I can't print very well; could you mind doing this for me. My eyes are giving me a little trouble."

So Dean asks him many questions, checking the right answers and marking the proper squares. Then a question about his hearing:

"What did you say?"

Dean repeats a little louder.

"Huh, my hearing is okay; just didn't catch you the first time."

Is your eyesight normal, glasses to read, glasses to drive?"

"I can see a cow in the road a good three-quarters of a mile away, but I don't get what you are driving at."

The question is repeated.

"My wife told me I must be hard of seeing. Come to think of it I have had a pair of glasses for about 10 years but they don't do me any good. So I don't wear them. Just put normal vision."

Dean adds that not very long after the applicant gets in a wreck, he blames the other fellow explaining:

"I eased up to the sign, didn't pay particular attention to whether it said slow or stop and that fool pulled right out in front of me. He says he towed his horn but I'll be darned if I heard it. We come together, me, right in the middle of his frame."

Wilkie rules the question: What use is a piece of paper issued by the department of law enforcement without a test. Other states insist that certain physical and visual handicaps be corrected before motorists are allowed on the highways. He says some say:

"Let's go and get Junior and little Sue and the kids one, too." Wilkie says, adding that \$1 for two years' driving pleasure is a farce, like taking an aspirin for appendicitis.

Postage alone on mailing licenses back to the applicant over the state runs into thousands of dollars annually. The law should be changed so that a driver's license really means something, Wilkie believes.

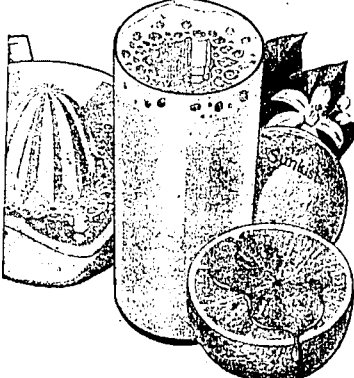

Truman Ideas Of Stalin May Gain Talk Bid

Whether he intends it or not, President Truman may mean to open about "Old Joe Stalin" could reopen the question of a meeting with that particular dictator.

This has been in abundance since the Potsdam meeting three years ago, which left much to be desired from many quarters.

Since then, President Truman has asked Premier Stalin to come to see him in Washington. And Mr. Stalin has stayed away. It has been widely inferred that neither party has been interested in going like the mountain to Mahomet.

No Mention of Parley

Now Mr. Truman said absolutely nothing about seeing Mr. Stalin, but he did let it be known that he is not going to refer to the meeting in his mind that the next day at Berkeley in his United States broadcast of radio and television.

Leaving out of this discussion the trumpeting of Carroll Tice that the President is bidding for the communist vote, it is proper on the assumption that Mr. Truman figures the country would not take kindly to better relations with Russia.

If this is so, a meeting with Stalin is conceivable and such a meeting is held to be the President said last week.

How such a meeting could be sandwiched into an election campaign for those interested in anyone is to figure out.

Among other reasons, there could be two political reasons for a general shift toward better relations with Russia. One is the responsibility which Republicans share for the bipartisan foreign policy because of their congressional majority in 1946.

The other was mentioned last week by James A. Farley, former Democratic national chairman. Farley said the chances of Henry Wallace third party presidential candidate "will go up and down, based on the apparent danger of war increases and decreases."
